FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 24th July, 1906, he made Orders under section 36 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, (a) revoking the Orders of the 20th December, 1882; 15th April, 1884; and 27th April, 1887, and granting (subject to conditions) for a period of one year only, a special exception under that section for employment of women and young persons during the period from 9 A.M. to 9 P.M. in workrooms in which millinery work and dressmaking are carried on in connection with drapers' retail establishments within the city of Manchester and the borough of Salford, and in factories and workshops in which the manufacture of straw hats and bonnets is carried on, (b) repealing the Order of the 12th January, 1884, and re-enacting it with modifications for factories in the county of London in which letterpress bookbinding is carried on.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Ely) Order, 1906.

Dated 24th July, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of

the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Ely) Order, 1906."

BIRDS.

Close Time varied.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be varied throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely, so as to be between the 14th day of March and the 1st day of September in any year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely:—

Bullfinch, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (all species), Woodpecker (all species).

Duration of Order.

IV. This Order shall not remain in force after the expiration of three years from the date hereof.

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 8th December, 1882, is hereby repealed.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (North Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1906.

Dated 25th July, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (North Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1906.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February in any year and the 1st day of September following, except with respect to the following birds:—

Mallard, Golden Plover, Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, Wild Duck, and Woodcock.

The time during which the killing or taking of the Birds so excepted is prohibited shall be
