

**TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.**

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 7th August, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 6 Edw. VII., cap. 1, to the amount of £2,500,000, of which £2,000,000 will be in replacement of Bills falling due on the 12th August, and £500,000 will be an issue under the Act 6 Edw. VII., cap. 1.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 11th August, 1906, and will be payable at six months after date, viz. :—on the 11th February, 1907.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Wednesday, the 8th August, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 11th August.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 2ND AUGUST 1906.)

**YORKSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER
OF 1906 (No. 2).**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent of Application of Order.

1. This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto.

Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets and Saleyards.

2.—(1.) The movement of swine from any market or saleyard in any place to which this Order applies shall be subject to the following provisions of this Order.

(2.) If the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of the swine exposed at the market or saleyard shall

be subject to the provisions of the Order under which the market or saleyard is so authorised.

(3.) In the case of any other market or saleyard, the movement of the swine exposed thereat shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or saleyard is situate. The licence shall state the name and address of the person who moved the swine into the market or saleyard, and the number and description of the swine to be moved, and shall contain a description of the market or saleyard from which, and of the premises to which, the swine are to be moved.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and isolated from other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period. During the movement the swine shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Article.

(iii.) A copy of a licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence.

(iv.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

3.—(1.) An exhibition of swine may be held in any place to which this Order applies with a licence of the Local Authority, on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient, and not otherwise.

(2.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, by such licence authorise the sale at such exhibition of the swine exhibited thereat on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient.

(3.) The Local Authority shall not grant a licence for an exhibition under this Article unless they are satisfied that the proposed exhibition is a bonâ fide agricultural show, and that the swine are to be exhibited thereat for competition.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.
