District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District:—

WARWICKSHIRE AUDIT DISTRICT.

To Rowland Metzner Estcourt, Barrister-at-Law, District Auditor;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively;—

To the Authorities referred to in Article I. (3) of this Order;—

To the Board of Management of the Walsall and West Bromwich District School;—

To the Rugby Joint Hospital Board;—

To the Joint Committee appointed to exercise the powers and duties of a Burial Board by the Parish Councils of the Parishes of Halesowen, Hasbury, Hawn, Lapal, Lutley, and the Hill, and the Parish Meetings of the Parishes of Illy and Hunnington;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas Rowland Metzner Estcourt Barrister-at-Law, is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said Rowland Metzner Estcourt (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely:—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.
- (3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose Accounts are not subject to audit by any other District Auditor.
- (4.) The Board of Management of the Walsall and West Bromwich District School.
- (5.) The Rugby Joint Hospital Board.
- (6.) The Joint Committee appointed to exercise the powers and duties of a Burial Board by the Parish Councils of the Parishes of Halesowen, Hasbury, Hawn, Lapal, Lutley, and The Hill, and the Parish Meetings of the Parishes of Illy and Hunnington.
- (7.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as we may by Order hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with

the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Warwickshire Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, the District of the Board of Management named in paragraph (4) of Article I. of this Order, the areas subject to the jurisdiction of the authorities referred to in paragraphs (5) and (6) of the said Article, and the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (7) of the said Article.

ARTICLE IV.—Any Order in force assigning a District to the District Auditor for the discharge of his duties or prescribing his duties, shall, from and after the date hereof be rescinded, but nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of the District Auditor as regards any Audit or any matters or proceedings already commenced.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order—The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 654 of 1906:—

The Chinese Government has given notice, dated 22nd May, 1906, that on or about July 1st

a Light-vessel, exhibiting a white occulting dioptric light every ten seconds, thus:—light, five seconds; eclipse, five seconds, would be established in a position about 3 miles N. 83° W. from Drinkwater Point Light and Bell Buoy; the light, which is of the 4th order, is elevated 35 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles; the vessel is iron, painted red, marked "Drinkwater Point," and has an iron column surmounted by the lantern. During thick or foggy weather a bell will be struck once every fifteen seconds.

Approximate position, lat. 34° 24½' N., long. 121° 56½' E.

Should this light-vessel be out of position, the light will not be exhibited, but a red fixed light will be shown from each end of the vessel at night, and a red flag displayed by day.

On the establishment of the above light-vessel, the white group flashing light on Drinkwater Point and Drinkwater Point Light and Bell Buoy will be discontinued.
