ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 14TH AUGUST 1906.)

NORTHAMPTONSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Restriction of Application of Part II of the Northamptonshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1905.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order, the provisions of Part II (*Restriction on movement of Swine within certain Area*) of the Northamptonshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1905 as modified by the Northamptonshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906, shall apply only to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and six.

Short Title.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

City of Winchester.
