#### MID-LINCOLNSHIRE LIGHT RAILWAY. (Alteration of Works.)

WHEREAS an application was, in the month of May, 1906, made to the Light Railway Commissioners by Augustus Leverton Jessopp, of Leasingham, in the county of Lincoln, and Stafford Vere Hotchkin, of the Manor House, Woodhall, in the said county (hereinafter called "the Promoters"), for a Provisional Order under the Light Railways Act, 1896, to authorize a Company to be incorporated by the Order to make and maintain in the Parts of Kesteven and Parts of Lindsey, in the said county, certain light railways between the town of Sleaford and the village of Kirkstead.

And whereas the proposed light railways are fully described in the Notice of the said application as published in the London Gazette of 29th May, 1906, and include a railway therein described as:—

"A Railway (No. 1) 8 miles 6 furlongs 1.70 chains or thereabouts in length commencing

ing in the parish of Old Sleaford, in the urban district of Sleaford, in the Parts of Kesteven, in the said county, at the centre of the eastern wall of the building situate in the west corner of the field numbered 61 on the 25-inch Ordnance Map of the said parish (Second Edition, 1905) and terminating in the parish and township of Billingham, in the last mentioned rural district, at the western side of the road called Fen-road, at a point 193 yards or thereabouts measured along the said road in a southerly direction from its junction with two roads called respectively Gravel Hill-drove and Green-drove."

And whereas an inquiry in respect of the said application was held on 13th July, 1906, by the Light Railway Commissioners at Sleaford, and the Promoters have undertaken to apply to the Light Railway Commissioners for an alteration in the line of the said Railway (No. 1).

Notice is hereby given that the Promoters intend in pursuance of the said Undertaking to apply to the Light Railway Commissioners to sanction the deviation hereinafter described of the said Railway (No. 1), and of all necessary stations, sidings, junctions, depots, approaches and works connected therewith or incidental thereto (that is to say):—

A deviation of Railway (No. 1) 3 miles 2 furlongs 6·50 chains or thereabouts in length wholly situate in the rural district of Sleaford in the Parts of Kesteven, in the county of Lincoln, commencing in the parish of Kirkby-la-Thorpe at a point on the public footpath shown on the 25-inch Ordnance Map of the said parish (Second Edition, 1905) as running from the north-west corner of the field numbered 179 on that map to Kirkby-la-Thorpe Hall at a point 210 yards or thereabouts, measured in a south-easterly direction along the said footpath from the said north-west corner of the said field, proceeding thence in a north-easterly direction by Evedon-road Spiuneys on the west and north thereof into the parish of Evedon, thence in an easterly direction immediately to the north of the Bargate-road and across that road into the parish of Ewerby and passing in a northerly direction between Ewerby Village and Ewerby Thorpe to the River Lea, and terminating in the last-mentioned parish at a point on the top of the southern bank of that river numbered 222 on the 25-inch Ordnance Map for the said parish of Ewerby (Second Edition, 1905) 80 yards or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction along the said bank from the sluice shown on that map as situate at the eastern corner of the Willow Garth numbered 200 thereon

and to authorize the Promoters to abandon so much of the said Railway (No. 1) as is situate between the points marked on the plans deposited at the offices of the Light Railway Commissioners on the 31st day of May last, in relation thereto as indicated by the distances measured from the commencement of that railway, namely, 1 mile 6 furlongs 3 chains and 4 miles 5 furlongs 8 chains respectively.

## No. 927.—GULF OF ADEN.

*Aden Light-Vessel—Signals indicating Depth in Channel.*

Information, dated 10th July, 1906, has been received through the Officer in charge of the Marine Survey of India, that, when a vessel is entering or leaving the Inner Harbour at Aden the depth for every foot between 24 and 33 feet in the Main Channel will be indicated from the mast head of the inner light-vessel, by means of the numeral table given at page 421 of the International Code Signal Book, 1899, thus:—Letters U. Z. are hoisted over the code flag when there is a depth of 24 feet in the channel, V. A. when there is a depth of 25 feet and so on.

Letters C, and F, representing respectively flood and ebb tide, will continue to be displayed from the ensign staff of this light-vessel as formerly.

## No. 928.—CHILE—CORCOVADO GULF.

*Laitec Light—Destroyed.*

## No. 929.—IRELAND, EAST COAST.

*Rosslare Harbour—Date of Alteration in Lighting, Fog Signal.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 618 of 1906:—

The Fishguard and Rosslare Railways and Harbours Company have given further notice, that on or about 20th August, 1906, an occulting light every five seconds; thus: light, three seconds; eclipse, two seconds, would be established on the extremity of the pier extension at Rosslare.

Rosslare Light would be elevated 50 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles, exhibiting the following sectors:—green from the bearing of S.  $63^{\circ}$  E., through south, to S.  $26^{\circ}$  W., white from S.  $26^{\circ}$  W. to S.  $47^{\circ}$  W., red from S.  $47^{\circ}$  W., through west, to N.  $57^{\circ}$  W., white from N.  $57^{\circ}$  W. to N.  $48^{\circ}$  W., green from N.  $48^{\circ}$  W. to N.  $21^{\circ}$  W., being obscured on the latter bearing by Greenore Point; it is shown from an iron tower about 15 feet high, painted red, erected on the pier head. The light powers for the white, red, and green lights being 7,000, 4,000, and 1,400 candles respectively.

On 1st October next, it is intended to establish a reed fog horn, worked by hand, which will give during thick or foggy weather, half an hour before the Company's steam vessels are due, one blast of two seconds duration every half minute. This signal will be sounded until after the vessels' arrival.
