ARTICLE IV.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of any District Auditor or Assistant Auditor as regards any Audit or any matters or proceedings already commenced or of which Notice shall have been given.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order—

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

ARTICLE VI.—This Order shall come into operation on the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and six.

MID-LINCOLNSHIRE LIGHT RAILWAY. (Alteration of Works.)

WHEREAS an application was, in the month of May, 1906, made to the Light Railway Commissioners by Augustus Leverton Jessopp, of Leasingham, in the county of Lincoln, and Stafford Vere Hotchkin, of the Manor House, Woodhall, in the said county (hereinafter called "the Promoters"), for a Provisional Order under the Light Railways Act, 1896, to authorize a Company to be incorporated by the Order to make and maintain in the Parts of Kesteven and Parts of Lindsey, in the said county, certain light railways between the town of Sleaford and the village of Kirkstead.
