THE FAIRS ACT, 1873. CHESTERFIELD FAIRS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that a representation has been duly made to him by the Chesterfield Town Council, to the effect that Fairs have been annually held at Chesterfield on January 27th, February 28th, the first Saturday in April, May 4th, July 4th, September 25th, and November 25th, except when Sunday has fallen on any one of the dates named, when the Fair has been holden on the following Monday, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should in future be
