FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 31st August, 1906, he made an Order under section 66 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, extending to workshops in which the processes of file-cutting; carriage building; rope and twine making; brick and tile making; making of iron and steel cables, chains, anchors, grapnels, and cart gear; making of nails, screws,

and rivets; baking bread, biscuits, or confectionery; fruit preserving; and making, altering, ornamenting, finishing, or repairing of wearing apparel by the aid of treadle sewing machines; are carried on, the prohibition in the said Act of the employment of young persons under the age of 16 years and children without a certificate of fitness of the young person or child for employment.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

ARTICLE II.—From and after the said date the said Order dated the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, shall be altered by the substitution therein of "Merthyr Tydfil" for the name by which that Parish is designated in that Order.

ARTICLE III.—The said Guardians shall cause this Order to be published in each of the two weeks next following the date hereof in some newspaper circulating within the Union.
