FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 86 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that on the 24th August, 1906, he made Regulations under section 79 of the said Act, to come into force on the 1st January, 1907, in respect of the use of locomotives, waggons, and other rolling stock on lines of rail or sidings in any factory or workshop or any place to which the provisions of section 79 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, are applied by that Act, or on lines of rail or sidings used in connection with any factory or workshop or any place as aforesaid and not being part of a railway within the meaning of the Railway Employment (Prevention of Accidents) Act, 1900.
