The Board of Trade have received a copy of the following Quarantine Notice, dated September 12th, issued by the Deputy-Governor of Malta:-

> Government Notice. No. 180.

It is hereby notified that His Honour the Deputy-Governor, acting on the advice of the under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing | Council of Health, has been pleased to direct that Government Notice No. 171 of the 31st August, 1906, shall be cancelled, and that the following regulations with regard to the importation of animals shall henceforth be observed, viz.:—

- 1. All animals of the species mentioned below intended for importation into these Islands, must be accompanied by a certificate from the British Consular Authority, or, where there is no such authority, from the local Government Authority, stating the number of cases of infectious or contagious disease affecting such animals which have been officially reported at the places of origin and shipment, during the three months immediately preceding the date of embarkation and the number and description of the animals shipped.
- 2. No animals of the species mentioned below shall be allowed to be landed, unless the consignee shall have applied for, and obtained, before shipment, the necessary permission for their importation. Such application shall imply that the consignee has bound himself to abide by any regulations which may be in force on the day of importation, or which may thereafter be issued, and also to pay all fees and expenses usually levied on each animal at the Lazaretto.
- 3. Vessels arriving at this Island, having on board more than 250 head of cattle (bovine) are to go into the quarantine harbour, and the cattle are to be inspected in the cattle enclosures of the Lazaretto.
- 4. Vessels which have, or have had, on board animals suffering from any contagious or infectious disease shall be disinfected in such manner as the Superintendent of the Public Health Department may direct. Should such disinfection be objected to, the vessels will be subject to quarantine, pending disinfection, on their return to Malta.

From Sardinia, Tunisia, and Algeria 2 days' observation.

#### [B] Ovine.

- 7. The importation of ovines from Continental Italy, Sicily, Mersina, and the other Ports in the Vilayet of Adana is prohibited.
- 8. Ovines imported from the countries mentioned below will be subjected to the restrictions hereunder stated:

From Epirus .. .. 10 days' observation.
From Morocco .. . 8 days' observation.

From Southern Russia,
Roumania, Bulgaria,
Sardinia, Tunisia, and
Algeria

2 days' observation.

#### II. Equines.

9. The importation of equines from Sicily is prohibited.

Horses, mules, and asses from other countries will be landed in quarantine, and will be subjected to the mallein test, if it is considered necessary. Such animals will not be released from quarantine until the Veterinary Surgeon declares them healthy.

#### III. Swine.

- 10. The importation of swine from Sicily, Mersina, and the other Ports in the Vilayet of Adana is prohibited.
- 11. Swine imported from the countries hereunder mentioned will be subjected to the following restrictions:

From Epirus ... 90 days' observation.
From Morocco ... 8 days' observation.

From Southern Russia, Roumania, Bulgaria, Constantinople, Greece, Tunisia, and Algeria

- 12. The importation is also forbidden of:
- (a.) Animals of the species mentioned in this Notice arriving from any place, if affected with any disease which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, might render their importation detrimental to other animals already in the Island.
- (b.) Wool, hides, skins, horns, bones, and hoofs from Continental Italy, Sicily, and from countries where epidemic diseases are reported.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of East Retford having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sections restricting the driving of motor cars on certain highways or parts of highways situate within the Borough of East Retford (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough"), We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, do hereby, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:-

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car at a greater speed than ten miles an hour on the highways or parts of highways within the Borough of East Retford which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and six.

EAST HAM ALLOTMENTS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the borough of East Ham to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority.

#### Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

#### Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a suitable vehicle to a slaughter-house situate in the borough of East Ham, for the purpose of immediate slaughter with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the borough of East Ham, which Licence shall be in force for not more than two days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the swine are to be moved.
- (2.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (3.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and shall be slaughtered after their arrival at the slaughter-house without unnecessary delay.

# Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicle used for Movement of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any vehicle which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the vehicle as follows:
  - (i.) The floor of the vehicle and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
  - (ii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
  - (iii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

### Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the borough of East Ham, which Licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the swine or of his agent authorised in writing for this purpose to the following effect—

(a.) that the swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the

Licence;

(b.) that the swine are not affected with swinefever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and

(c.) that the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

- (3.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (4.) The Declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the Licence thereon.

#### Saving for existing Orders and Regulations.

6. Movement of swine under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board, or Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board, for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

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#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping

it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any vehicle used for the movement of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the vehicle, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894

against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

10. In this Order-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.


