ROTHERHAM (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Part II. (Restriction on Movement out of County Borough of Rotherham) of the Rotherham (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906 is hereby revoked from and after the twenty-eighth day of September, nineteen hundred and six.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 25TH SEPTEMBER 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall apply to the Area described in the Schedule hereto.

Provision for Movement through Scheduled Area by Road.

2. Swine shall not be deemed to be moved into the Area described in the Schedule hereto in any case where they are moved through the Area in a float van or cart from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area in accordance with the following conditions:—

(1.) The swine must be accompanied by a licence authorising the movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of each District within the Area through which they are to be moved; and

(2.) the swine must not within the Area be removed from the float van or cart, or be permitted to come in contact with other swine.

(3.) The swine must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

Provision as to Local Regulations.

3. The powers of the Local Authorities of any District comprised in the Area described in the Schedule hereto to make regulations under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894, as to movement, exposure, or sale of swine, shall be suspended

during the operation of this Order, and all such regulations in force at the commencement of this Order shall thereupon cease to operate.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and six.

Bulang Strait—Beacon and Buoys Established.

The Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 8th September, 1906, that the undermentioned beacon and buoys have been established in the northern approach to Bulang Strait:

## No. 1063.—PHILIPPINE ISLANDS—LUZON, WEST COAST.

Cape Bolinao—Character of Light Altered.

The United States Government has given notice that, on the 15th July, 1906, the white occulting light shown from a framework structure on Piedra Point, Cape Bolinao, was discontinued, and a white group flashing light every ten seconds, elevated 301 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 24 miles, was exhibited from a new concrete lighthouse erected on a wooden hill rising from the beach at Piedra Point.

The light, which is of the 3rd order, shows thus:—flash; eclipse, two and a half seconds; flash; eclipse, seven and a half seconds.

The keeper's dwelling and outhouses, also of

concrete, stand near the lighthouse.

Note.—The duration of the flashes is not

stated. It is presumed they are of the description known as lightning flashes, lasting about

one-tenth of a second.

Towartit North Reef—Beacon Re-erected.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 870 of 1906:-

Information, dated 27th August, 1906, has been received from the Government of the Sudan that. a new beacon has been erected on the northern extreme of North Towartit Reef, in the position

occupied by the former beacon.

The beacon, pyramidal in shape, is built of masonry on a solid concrete base, and the masonry top is 21 feet above high water.
