No. 1109.—NORWAY, SOUTH COAST—CHRISTIANIA HARBOUR.

Vippetangen—Light Discontinued.

The Norwegian Government has given notice, that on the 15th September, 1906, the white occulting light shown from Vippetangen Lighthouse, Christiania Harbour, would be permanently discontinued.

Approximate position, lat. 59° 54' N., long. 10° 45' E.

No. 1110.—NORWAY, WEST COAST—FEDIE (FEIE) AND FENS FIORDS.

Hovden—Light Established.

Rautingkalven—Sectors of Light Altered.

The Norwegian Government has given notice that, on the 15th September, 1906, an occulting light would be established on Hovden, Fedie (Feie) Island, Fedie (Feie) Fiord, showing the following sectors:—white from the bearing of N. 2° E., through north, to N. 25° W.; red from N. 25° W., through west, to S. 15° W.; white from S. 15° W. to S. 7° W.; green from S. 7° W. to S. 1° W.; white from S. 1° W., through south, to S. 16° E., and obscured elsewhere.

The light is shown from a small iron house at an elevation of 39 feet above high water. (Unwatched.)

The white, red, and green sectors are visible
