And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should in future be held on the last Saturday in the months of January and February, the first Saturday in the months of April, May, and July, and the last Saturday in the months of September and November, respectively:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the Fairs, which have been held annually at Chesterfield on January 27th, February 28th, the first Saturday in April, May 4th, July 4th, September 25th, and November 25th, except when Sunday has fallen on any one of the dates named, when the Fair has been holden on the following Monday, shall in future be held annually on the last Saturday in the months of January and February, the first Saturday in the months of April, May, and July, and the last Saturday in the months of September and November, respectively.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH OCTOBER 1906.)

## LINCOLNSHIRE (PARTS OF HOLLAND) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Application of Order.

1. The "scheduled area" for the purposes of this Order means the administrative county of the Parts of Holland Division of Lincolnshire.

## Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets and Saleyards.

2.—(1.) The movement of swine from any market or saleyard in the scheduled area shall be subject to the following provisions.

(2.) If the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of the swine exposed at the market or saleyard shall be subject to the provisions of the Order under which the market or saleyard is so authorised.

(3.) In the case of any other market or saleyard, the movement of the swine exposed thereat shall be subject to the following conditions:—

- (i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or saleyard is situate. The licence shall state the name and address of the person who moved the swine into the market or saleyard, and the number and description of the swine to be moved, and shall contain a description of the market or saleyard from which, and of the premises to which, the swine are to be moved.
- (ii.) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and isolated from other swine for twentyeight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period.

(iii.) A copy of a licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence.

## Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

3.—(1.) An exhibition of swine may be held in the scheduled area with a licence of the Local Authority, on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient, and not otherwise.

(2.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, by such licence authorise the sale at such exhibition of the swine exhibited thereat on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient.

(3.) The Local Authority shall not grant a licence for an exhibition under this Article unless they are satisfied that the proposed exhibition is a bonâ fide agricultural show, and that the swine are to be exhibited thereat for competition.

#### Restriction on Movement out of Scheduled Area.

4. Swine shall not be moved from the scheduled area to any place outside the scheduled area, except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

#### General Provision for Movement with Licence.

5.—(1.) The restriction on movement imposed by the preceding Article shall not apply to swine if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration, countersigned as hereinafter provided, to the effect:

- (i.) That he is the owner of [or the agent authorised in writing for this purpose by the owner of] the swine;
- (ii.) That the swine have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the date of the declaration;
- (iii.) That to the best of his knowledge and belief the swine are not affected with swinefever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swinefever; and
- (iv.) That the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and that the movement of the swine is not prohibited by notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(3.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the District where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The licence shall be in force for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the licence is granted, the number

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of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which, and the place and premises to which, the swine are to be moved.

# Detention and Isolation after Arrival at Destination.

6.—(1.) Swine moved with a licence under the preceding Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided. The swine, while detained under this Article, shall be kept separate from all other swine. This provision does not restrict the removal of any carcase of a pig.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under the preceding Article to a market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition specified in the licence, the swine shall only be moved from such premises if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition is situate and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, where the swine after their arrival shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

(3.) A copy of a licence for movement from a market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition, shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence.

#### Movement for Immediate Slaughter.

7. The restriction on movement imposed by Article 4 of this Order shall not apply to swine moved to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to any lairs, market, or saleyard specially authorised by the Local Authority of the District under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 or any other Swine-Fever Order in force in the District, if the swine are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the bacon factory, slaughterhouse, lairs, market, or saleyard shall be situate, and subject to the following conditions, namely:

- (i) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long;
- (ii.) The swine shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article;
- (iii.) Swine moved under this Article to any lairs, market, or saleyard shall only be moved therefrom if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the lairs, market, or saleyard shall be situate and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, and such movement shall be subject to the conditions of this Article as to marking and movement; and
- (iv.) Swine moved under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

## Licences after Completion of Movement.

8.—(1.) Where swine are moved out of the scheduled area with a licence under this Order to any market, fair, saleyard, exhibition, or lairs, the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any premises other than a market, fair, saleyard, exhibition, or lairs, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

#### General Provisions as to Movement.

9. Swine, while being moved under this Order, shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all other swine, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

#### Provision for Movement through Scheduled Area.

10. For the purposes of this Order, swine shall not be deemed to be moved out of the scheduled area in any case where they are moved through the scheduled area by railway from a place outside the scheduled area to another place outside the scheduled area without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked within the scheduled area.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

11.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

12. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

13.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a licence, as required by this Order, he shall be

deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894

(4.) If a pig is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the pig is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

14. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires.

"District" means a District of a Local Authority under the Act of 1894:

- "Bacon factory" means premises in which the
- business of a curer of bacon is carried on : "Slaughterhouse" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered :
- "Person" includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate : "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector : "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture
- and Fisheries :
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Revocation of Order.

15. The Order described in the Schedule hereto is hereby revoked.

#### Commencement.

16. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of October, nineteen hundred and six.

17. This Order may be cited as the LINCOLN-SHIRE (PARTS OF HOLLAND) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. (DATED 10TH OCTOBER 1906.)

#### AND DISTRICT (SWINE-STOWMARKET FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Movement of swine into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the district described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or

thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

3.-(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been

moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the Srow-MARKET AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIB-ITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1906.
