LINCOLN CORPORATION TRAMWAYS. BYE-LAWS.

Bye-laws made by the Mayor, Aldermen and citizens of the city of Lincoln, being the promoters of the Lincoln Corporation Tramways

Undertaking under and in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Tramways Act, 1870, at a meeting of the City Council held in the Guildhall, in the said city, on Tuesday, the 2nd day of October, 1906.

Interpretation of Clauses.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively

assigned to them, that is to say:

"Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and citizens of the city of Lincoln, and such other Local Authority (or Lessee) as may for the time being use the tramways of the Corporation.

"Tramways" means the tramways system now or at any time hereafter worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the city of

Lincoln, or any other district.

"The Electricity and Tramways Committee' shall mean the committee appointed by the Corporation for the time being to undertake the control and management of the tramways.

"Car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways by the Corporation for the

conveyance of passengers. "Conductor" means an "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Electricity and Tramways Committee, having charge of or helping in the charge of

"Driver" means any officer or servant of the Electricity and Tramways Committee driv-

ing or helping to drive a car.
"Officer" means any tramway inspector in the employ of the Electricity and Tramways Committee, or any inspector of public carriages in the employ of the Corporation.

Extent of Bye-laws.

2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car using the tram-ways, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation has powers to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise unless so directed by the conductor or officer.

All persons desiring to alight from any car shall do so before any person boards such car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to board the car shall permit such per-

sons to alight as aforesaid.

At a terminus, however, it shall be lawful for persons desiring to board a car to enter by the step of the front or driver's platform, whilst the passengers who wish to alight are leaving by the conductor's platform.

Smoking.

4. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any car, or on any part of the outside of a car which may from time to time be set apart for the use of nonsmokers.

Gambling, &c.

5. No person shall gamble or play any game of cards or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article in or upon any

Musical Instruments.

6. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or make any other noise which may be objectionable to passengers.

Contagious, &c., Disease.

contagious, or infectious disorder or disease shall

not enter or mount upon any car.

"Infectious or contagious disease" means any of the following diseases: Small-pox, Cholera, Diphtheria, Membranous Croup, Measles, Erysipelas, Chicken-pox and Whooping Cough, the disease known as Scarlatina or Scarlet Fever, and the fevers known by any of the following names: Typhus, Typhoid, Enteric.

Intoxicated Persons, Obscene or Offensive Language or Conduct, &c.

8. No person while in or upon any car, or tramway station or premises, shall

(a) be in a state of intoxication; or

(b) swear or use obscene, or offensive, or abusive language; or

c) spit or commit any nuisance; or

(d) wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger; or

(e) eat anything which has an objectionable

smell; or

(f) deposit remnants of food or fruit.

Damage to Car.

9. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or the linings, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed, painted or other notice, or any advertisement, in or on the car, or mark, break, or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car, or touch, handle, or interfere with any electric machine or appliance in, under, or about any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Objectionable Persons.

10. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of a conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car, and shall not enter in or upon any car after being requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any car, shall, on the request of the conductor, forthwith leave such car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Payment of Fares.

11. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other servant of the Electricity and Trainways Committee, acting in the performance of his duty, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or for the stage thereof for which it be demanded, and obtain a ticket therefor, and in any case before leaving the car shall pay such fare whether demanded or not.

No child under five years of age, who is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full ordinary fare.

Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

Tickets.

12. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required so to do, to the conductor or other servant of the Electricity and Tramways Com-7. A person affected with any dangerous, I mittee, acting in the performance of his duty,

and shall also, when required so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Electricity and Tramways Committee, acting in the performance of his duty, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available by the car on which they are

issued

Artisans.

13. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers, or travel or attempt to travel on the tramways as an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer.

Luggage.

14. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall he carried at the responsibility of the passenger, and shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the car as shall be directed by the conductor, and shall not exceed 28lbs in weight.

In no case shall any luggage be put upon or occupy any part of a seat, or be of a form or description or character to annoy or inconveni-

ence any other passenger.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

15. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Electricity and Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall be permitted to travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers or guards of any car, or sit on the outside rail on the outside of any car, or stand in any case on the outside, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, in the interior of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of

any car.

Full Number of Passengers.

16. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no additional person shall enter, board, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When a car contains, on the outside thereof, the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided, on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, board,

or remain thereon.

Entering or Leaving a Car When in Motion.

17. No person shall enter, board, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, or leave any car whilst in motion.

Dogs.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Bye-law, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car, immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of

compliance with such request, may be removed by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

Firearms, &c.

19. No person shall enter, board, or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms or any explosive substance, or with any article, instrument or implement, or any material or substance which may in the opinion of the conductor be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve, or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded firearms.

Interference with the Conductor or Driver.

20. No person, other than the conductor, driver, or other servant of the Electricity and Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, or any part of a car, or its equipment.

Obstruction.

21. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any car, or obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Electricity and Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Disabled Cars.

22. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws.

23. Every conductor and driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

Removal of Persons Infringing Bye-laws.

24. Any person who shall whilst in or on any car, or tramway station, or premises, commit any legal offence or any breach of these Bye-laws shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, or tramway station, or premises, and if such person shall have paid his fare shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of the fare so paid or any part thereof.

Penalty.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Repeal of Existing Bye-laws.

26. From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force, any Bye-laws and Regulations made in this behalf by the Lincoln Tramways Company Limited, at any time, shall be repealed.

Copy of Bye-laws to be kept in Cars.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

Operation.

28. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1907.
