The KING taking into His Royal consideration that, upon the death of Clarence Edward. Baron Graves, in the Peerage of Ireland, which happened on the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and four, the title and dignity of Baron Graves devolved upon Henry Cyril Percy, now Baron Graves, as the eldest son and heir of Henry Richard Graves (commonly called The Honourable Henry Richard Graves) who was at the time of his death eldest surviving son of Thomas North, Baron Graves, and uncle and heir presumptive of the said Clarence Edward, Baron Graves, and that according to the ordinary rules of honour the brothers and sisters of the said Henry Cyril Percy, Baron Graves, cannot enjoy that title, rank, place and precedence which would have been due to them had their said late father survived his nephew the said Clarence Edward, Baron Graves, and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Graves, His Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that William Spencer Paget Graves, Esq., a Commander (retired) in His Majesty's Royal Navy, Algernon Sydney George Graves, Esq., Adolphus Edward Paget Graves, Esq., a Captain 3rd Battalion the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry, Henrietta Jane Caroline Florence, wife of Adolphe Berto Marchi, Esq., and Mabel Mary Blanche Somerset, wife of Robert Bryce Hay, Esq., the brothers and sisters of the said Henry father survived his nephew the said Clarence Esq., the brothers and sisters of the said Henry Cyril Percy, Baron Graves, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same rank, title, place, pre-eminence and precedence as if their late father, the said Henry Richard Graves, had survived his nephew the said Clarence Edward, Baron Graves, and had thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Baron Graves.

And to command that the said Order and declaration be registered in his Majesty's College of Arms.

COUNTY OF WESTMORLAND.

To the County Council of Westmorland;—And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the County Council of Westmorland, having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sections prohibiting the driving of motor cars on a certain highway known and hereinafter referred to as Low-road, Leasgill, and situate within the parish of Heversham, in the county of Westmorland, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, after consideration of the said Report, and of all the circumstances of the case, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of Our powers in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car on the highway known as Low-road, Leasgill, at a speed exceeding five miles perhour.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and six.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Regulation of Movement from Birmingham Exhibition

- 1.—(1.) Swine exposed at the Exhibition intended to be held by the Birmingham Agricultural Society in Bingley Hall, Birmingham, on the 1st to 6th days (inclusive) of December, 1906, may be moved out of the city of Birmingham if they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Corporation of Birmingham, which licence is hereby authorised to be granted.
- (2.) For the movement of such swine with a licence granted under this Order into a Scheduled Area subject to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, with or without modifications thereof, a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate, shall also be required and may be granted under this
- (3.) A licence granted under this Order shall not exempt the swine moved therewith from any restriction on movement of swine imposed by regulations made by the Local Authority of any District.
- (4.) Swine moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (5.) This Order shall not be construed as prohibiting any movement which is authorised under Article 2 of the Birmingham (Swine - Fever) Order of 1906.

Offences.

2. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
