May it please Your Majesties.

We, Your Majesties' most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of King's Lynn, in the county of Norfolk, humbly beg leave to approach Your Majesties, and to offer to Your Majesties a respectful and heartfelt welcome to our ancient Borough.

We recall with sincere pleasure the previous occasions on which Your Majesties (when Prince and Princess of Wales) visited our Borough, and we gladly renew on this occasion the assurance of our devoted loyalty and dutiful attachment to

Your Majesties.

We are exceedingly grateful for the distinguished honour you are so graciously conferring on us by again visiting our ancient Borough, and we rejoice that this visit should be associated with the inauguration of an Institution which will so greatly increase the educational facilities

of the town and district.
We earnestly pray that Your Majesties may long continue to reign over Your devoted subjects, and that Your vast Empire may ever enjoy the great blessings of peace and prosperity.

I have always been deeply interested in your

ancient Borough, so full of attraction to the autiquarian and to the student of history; and we re-visit you with sincere pleasure.

The occasion of Our presence here to-day shows that you are not content with the traditions of the past, however worthy of remembrance these may be, but through the liberality of an old pupil of the School which bears My Name—the new Buildings of which I am about to open—are determined to keep abreast of the times and are conscious that it is only by a thorough education that the younger generation can hope to prove successful in later

We, the Governors of King Edward VII Grammar School, King's Lynn, desire to offer our humble duty and to express our gratitude to Your Majesties for the honour You have conferred on our ancient foundation by Your presence on this auspicious occasion.

May Your Majesties permit us to recall many previous acts of grace You have bestowed upon this School. We are reminded by the Honour List on the walls of this hall of the encouragement annually afforded by the gift of Your Majesty's Medal; and we cannot allow this occasion to pass without offering our humble but grateful thanks for graciously permitting two new Scholarships to bear Your Majesties' names.

The oil painting in this hall may warrant us in reminding Your Majesties that this School was founded in the reign of King Henry VIII.

Possessing but a small endowner, the

Governors have, in recent years, felt no little

anxiety respecting the structural deficiencies of the old buildings. Hence the generous offer of Mr. Lancaster, au old pupil, to endow as well as to provide, at his sole cost, a building fully equipped for the most varied and efficient educational work, has given the Governors much exercise in finding terms adequately expressive of their gratitude.

The situation of this institution is peculiarly well adapted for offering higher education to the youth, not alone of the borough of King's Lynn, but of a large area of the county of Nortolk. Geographically, King's Lynn may justly be termed the centre of West Norfolk; the seven lines of railway, which here meet, make it easy of access for students of a population of not less than 100,000 inhabitants to reach the School with the minimum of time and cost.

The curriculum of the School will remain, as hitherto, of the first grade; and whilst that which is to-day termed the modern side of education will receive its full meed of attention, the study of ancient learning will in no wise be

neglected.

Your Majesty has, in the past, graciously recognized the successes obtained, not alone by Your Majesty's medallists, but also by many

other pupils of the School.

We carnestly pray that this School—the first to be distinguished by Your Royal Title—possessing such increased advantages, may succeed in rearing a still larger number of able and loyal citizens, qualified to develop and strengthen Your Majesty's mighty Empire.

You are aware of the deep interest which I have always taken in the public institutions of the county of Norfolk, and in all schools established for the purpose of imparting higher education. It is not easy to over-estimate the far-reaching benefits of the tuition obtained in such an institution as this. The young men of King's Lynn and West Norfolk whom you send out into the world will, throughout their lives, bear traces of the influences which have guided them during their stay in the school. They are at the most impressionable period of life, and the teachings of your masters will remain in their minds even when later experiences are forgotten. You, as Governors of the School, will, I feel sure, exercise the most solicitous care in the direction of the studies of your pupils that they may be able to face the stress of life with an intellectual equipment such as will enable them to hold their own in the world and bear their part in its work and duties with efficiency and to the benefit of others. Nor will, I feel confident, the higher teaching of morality, truth, and self respect be neglected. The traditions of your School, dating back for so many generations, will help to foster those ideals of honour and patriotism which render this country respected in Wherever they go your all parts of the world. pupils will remember not only what they owe to you, but what they owe to England.

Whereas We did by Warrants under Our Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the ninth day of September and the seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and four, and the twenty-seventh day of February and the sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and

five, authorize and appoint certain persons therein respectively named, or any three or more of them, to be Our Commissioners to consider the existing methods of dealing with idiots and epileptics, and with imbecile, feeble-minded, or defective persons not certified under the Lunacy Laws; and in view of the hardship or danger resulting to such persons and the community from insufficient provision for their care, training, and control, to report as to the amendments in the law or other measures which should be adopted in the matter, due regard being had to the expense involved in any such proposals and to the best means of securing economy therein:

And whereas We have deemed it expedient that the scope of the said Commission should be enlarged, and that the Commissioners appointed for the purposes aforesaid should also be authorized to inquire into the constitution, jurisdiction, and working of the Commission in Lunacy and of other Lunacy Authorities in England and Wales, and into the expediency of amending the same or adopting some other system of supervising the care of lunatics and mental defectives; and to report as to any amendments in the law which should, in their opinion, be adopted:

Now know ye that We, being advised that a new Commission should issue for this purpose, have revoked and determined, and do by these Presents revoke and determine, the said several Warrants, and every matter and thing therein

contained.

And We do by these Presents nominate, constitute and appoint you the said Jacob, Earl of Radnor (Chairman); William Patrick Byrne; Charles Edward Heley Chadwyck-Healey; Charles Edward Henry Hobhouse; Frederick Needham; Horatio Bryan Donkin; James Craufurd Dunlop; Henry David Greene; Harold Nelson Burden; Willoughby Hyett Dickinson; Charles Stewart Loch; and Ellen Frances Piusent to be Our Commissioners to consider the existing methods of dealing with idiots and epileptics, and with imbecile, feeble-minded or defective persons not certified under the Lunacy Laws; and in view of the hardship or danger resulting to such persons and the community from insufficient provision for their care, training, and control, to report as to the amendments in the law or other measures which should be adopted in the matter, due regard being had to the expense involved in any such proposals and to the best means of securing economy therein; and also to inquire into the constitution, jurisdiction, and working of the Commission in Lunacy and of other Lunacy Authorities in England and Wales, and into the expediency of amending the same or adopting some other system of supervising the care of lunatics and mental defectives; and to report as to any amendments in the law which should, in your opinion, be adopted.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means

whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so

to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you. your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in your inquiries We hereby appoint Our irusty and well-beloved Hartley Brinkley Newton Mothersole, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to

this Our Commission.

SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT RAVENSWELL AND BRAY.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Dublin to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the boundary between the townlands of Cork Great and Ravenswell near Bray, and the northern pier or breakwater of Bray Harbour,

being within the said port.

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the points above mentioned.
