Leek Caldon Low and Hartington Light Railways (Borrowing and Further Powers Amendment) Order.

THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of West Suffolk.

HEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH NOVEMBER 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.

2. In the case of movement to the said

exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Norwich City Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

The United States Government has given further notice, dated 12th October, 1906, containing an additional list of the lights on the coasts of Florida, Alabama, and Mississippi damaged or destroyed by a recent hurricane, as follows:—

1. St. George's Sound, West Pass. The front red fixed leading light formerly situated on the south-eastern point of St. Vincent Island.

Approximate position, lat. 29° 38' N., long. 85° 6' W.

2 PENSACOLA BAY.

- a. Deer Point White Fixed Light, formerly situated at a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles East from Pensacola Lighthouse.
- b. Bar Beacon White Fixed Front Light, formerly situated at a distance of one cable S. 25° E. from Pensacola Light. This light will not be re-established.
- c. Fort Mc. Ree Breakwater Red Fixed Light, formerly situated at a distance of $1\frac{2}{10}$ miles S. 5° W. from Pensacola Light.
- d. Fort Mc. Ree Rear White Fixed Light, formerly situated at a distance of 11 miles S, 8° W, from Pensacola Light.

- e. Fort Barraneas White and Red Fixed Leading Lights, formerly situated at a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables eastward from Pensacola Light.
- f. Middle Beacon Red Fixed Light in approximately lat. 30° 28′ N., long. 87° 2′ W.

2. HORN ISLAND PASS.

- 4. Ship Island. The red and white fixed leading lights for South Channel formerly situated about one cable to the southward and westward respectively of Ship Island Lighthouse.

Approximate position, Ship Island Lighthouse, lat. 30° 13′ N., long. 88° 58′ W.

5. Gulf Port. The three red fixed beacon lights marking the dredged channel to Gulf Port.

6. Mississippi River, South-western Bank.—The Jump White Fixed Beacon Light.

No. 1262.—SPAIN—EAST COAST.

Barcelona—Intended Alteration in Lighting.

The Spanish Government has given notice that, on 1st December, 1906, a provisional white group flashing light showing groups of two

flashes every ten seconds, thus:—Flash, threetenths of a second; eclipse, one and four-tenths seconds; flash, three-tenths of a second; eclipse, eight seconds, will be exhibited on the seaward slope of Montjuich, Barcelona; it will be elevated 308 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 22 miles from the bearing of S. 73° W., through west and north, to N. 79° E., being obscured by the land in other directions, and will be shown from a green tower about 17 feet high surmounting a white dwelling erected in a position which has not yet been accurately determined.

The period of system of this light may vary, but the characteristic of showing groups of two flashes will always be maintained.

Approximate position of Montjuich, lat. $41^{\circ} 21\frac{3}{4}^{\prime}$ N., long. $2^{\circ} 9\frac{3}{4}^{\prime}$ E.

On the same date, Cataluña fixed and red flashing light on Muelle de Cataluña will be discontinued.
