
ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(Extension of Time for Sale of Reclaimed Lands; Further Powers for Regulating Deposit of Slag and other Materials in the Sea; Superannuation Fund and Provisions in Relation thereto; Authorizing Investment of Trust Funds in Securities of the Tees Conservancy Commissioners; Amendment, &c., of Acts.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Tees Conservancy Commissioners (hereinafter called "the Commissioners") for leave to bring in a Bill to effect the following objects or some of them (that is to say):—

- 1. To further extend the time for the sale of reclaimed lands.
- 2. To confer further powers upon the Commissioners for preventing and regulating the discharging or casting of slag, ballast and other materials into the sea, both within and beyond the limits of the Tees Conservancy Acts, and if necessary or expedient for this purpose to extend the limits of the said Acts, and to amend, extend and enlarge or repeal the provisions of section 79 of the Tees Conservancy Act, 1852, and section 55 of the Tees Conservancy Act, 1867, in regard to the time, manner, place, depth of water or distance from the shore at or in which such materials may be discharged or cast into the sea, or to make further or other provisions in relation to the matters aforesaid.
- 3. To establish or provide for the establishment of a superannuation fund for officers and servants in the employ of the Commissioners, and to provide for and require the payment of contributions thereto by such officers and servants or such of them as shall contribute to such fund, and to empower the Commissioners to deduct from the salary or wages of any such officer or servant any contribution which such officer or servant may be required to make thereto; to empower and require the Commissioners to make contributions to the superannuation fund out of

their funds and revenues, and to provide for the making and altering of a scheme or schemes for establishing and administering the fund and for appointing Committees for that purpose; to authorize the making of bye-laws, rules and regulations for the management and regulation of the fund and otherwise in relation thereto and to the contributors to such fund, and to confer upon the Commissioners and upon any Committee that may be appointed and all parties concerned, respectively, such powers, authorities, duties, rights, obligations and liabilities as are or may be usual or proper for the establishment, maintenance, application and use or benefit of such superannuation fund; or otherwise to provide for the payment of superannuation and other allowances to officers and servants in the employ of the Commissioners, and to enable the Commissioners to make allowances and grant gratuities to the relatives or representatives of any such officers or servants.

(Consolidation with Amendments and Repeal of the several Acts and Provisional Orders relating to the Tees Valley Water Board; Completion, Continuance, Maintenance and Improvement of Waterworks; Drainage of Lands; Abstraction of Water from the River Tees; Compensation Water; Limits of Supply; Variation of Powers of Purchase by Local Authorities; Supply in Bulk; Constant Pressure; Terms for Supply to Large Consumers; Provisions as to Supply and Fittings; Confirmation of Agreements; Borrowing Powers to Corporations of Stockton, Middlesbrough and Thornaby; Payment of Interest out of Borrowed Money; Discontinuance of Payments into Sinking Fund; and other Financial Provisions; Application of Revenue; Repeal, Amendment and Incorporation of Acts.)

OTICE is hereby given that the Tees Valley
Water Board (hereinafter referred to as
"the Board") intend to apply to Parliament in
the Session of 1907 for leave to bring in a Bill
(hereinafter called "the Bill") for all or some of
the purposes following, that is to say:—

To repeal or amend and extend all or some of

the provisions of all or some of the local Acts and Orders confirmed by Parliament relating to the Board (including the following), and to consolidate and re-eract with or without amendment all or some of the enactments contained in those Acts and Orders (that is to say): The Stockton and Middlesbrough Waterworks Act, 1858; The Stockton and Middlesbrough Waterworks Act, 1864; The Stockton and Middlesbrough Corporations Waterworks Act, 1876; Article 1 and Article 4 (so far as it relates to the said Act of 1876) of a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 30th day of April, 1879, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Aysgarth Union, &c.) Act, 1879; A Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 29th day of April, 1880, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Bethesda, &c.) Act, 1880; The Stockton and Middlesbrough Corporations Waterworks Act, 1884; The South Stockton Local Board (Water) Act, 1884; The Stockton and Middlesbrough Waterworks Act, 1888; The Stockton and Middlesbrough Waterworks Act, 1890; The Tees Valley Waterworks Act, 1899; The Tees Valley Water Act, 1901; and the Tees Valley Water Act, 1905.

To provide that notwithstanding the repeal of Acts the Board shall continue incorporated as heretofore, and that the Water Undertaking of the Board as at present existing shall be and remain vested in them, together with all the works, lands, buildings, property, rights, powers, privileges and obligations of every description hitherto belonging to or conferred or imposed upon the Board.

To authorize the Board notwithstanding the repeal of Acts to complete in accordance with the provisions of the repealed Acts, the construction of the Grassholm Reservoir, and of Conduit No. 1 authorized by the said Act of 1876, and the construction of Conduits Nos. 9 and 10 authorized by the said Act of 1890.

To enable the Board to enter into agreements with owners of lands within their drainage area with reference to the execution of works for the purpose of draining the same, and for collecting, conveying and preserving the purity of the waters which the Board are authorized to take.

To increase, either temporarily or permanently, the quantity of water which the Board are now authorized to abstract from the River Tees at Broken Scar.

To alter the provisions in regard to the discharge of compensation water into the Rivers Lune and Balder and to discontinue the provisions as to regulation thereof by the Darlington Corporation and others.

To define the limits of supply of the Board as prescribed and from time to time extended by the former Acts of the Board, and to provide (if necessary) that such limits shall include the area of the land reclaimed or reclaimable from the River Tees and its estuary and now forming part of the parishes of Middlesbrough, Ormesby, Normanby, Eston and Wilton in the North Riding of the county of York and Billingham and Cowpen Bewley in the county of Durham.

To enact new provisions in lieu of section 4 of the said Act of 1876 in regard to the rights of local authorities to purchase portions of the undertaking or mains, pipes and plant within their respective districts, and to alter the terms upon which such local authorities shall be entitled to purchase the same. To confer upon the Board powers for supplying water in bulk to local authorities, companies and persons beyond the limits of supply upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed or as may be prescribed by the Bill.

To discontinue the provisions of section 78 of the said Act of 1858 whereby the Board are required to publish particulars of offences for which any penalty is imposed.

To vary the provisions of the former Acts of the Board in regard to constant pressure and to provide that in case of frost, unusual drought or other unavoidable cause or accident water need not be constantly laid on under pressure.

To re-enact with or without modification and in some cases to bring into conformity with modern legislation the provisions of the former Acts of the Board relating to the following subjects: additional lands and easements, lands for protection of waterworks, surplus lands, persons under disability, rates for domestic supply and otherwise, regulations for preventing waste of water, security for water supplied, meters, fittings, baths, closets, cisterns, materials, repairs to pipes, entry, the cutting-off of the supply and other matters.

To discontinue the provisions of section 35 of the said Act of 1864 in regard to the liability to water rent in the case of small houses and to render the owners liable therefor; as also in the case of houses let to less than quarterly tenants.

To define the terms upon which water shall be supplied by the Board to large consumers of water within and without the boroughs of Stockton, Middlesbrough and Thornaby, and to increase for a period to be prescribed by the Bill the charge therefor.

To authorize the Board to sell or let meters and fittings; to provide that the connecting and disconnecting of meters shall be done by officers of the Board alone; to impose penalties in case of injury to meters; to authorize the Board to supply water by measure; to relieve the Board from any obligation to supply more than one house by means of the same pipe, or to supply otherwise than by measure any building partly used for any trade or manufacturing purpose; to require notice of discontinuance; to authorize the Board to lay pipes in streets not dedicated to public use; and to impose penalties for offences against the provisions of the Bill.

To confirm or save any agreement or agreements which have been or may be entered into by the Board with any local authorities, companies or persons within or without the limits of supply in regard to the supply of water in bulk or otherwise.

To confer upon the Corporations of Stockton, Middlesbrough and Thornaby in lieu of their existing borrowing powers, which it is intended to repeal, powers for the borrowing and reborrowing of further monies for the purposes of the Bill and for the general purposes of the Undertaking, including the payment of the costs of the Bill, and to mortgage or charge their respective borough funds and borough rates, general district funds and general district rates and the revenue of the Undertaking as security therefor, with powers to issue debentures, debenture stock and annuity certificates chargeable upon the securities aforesaid or any of them, and to make provision for the repayment of the money so borrowed.

To authorize the said Corporations or any of them to pay interest on monies borrowed during the construction of works out of monies borrowed, and also to discontinue for such period as they may see fit, or as may be prescribed by the Bill, payment of monies into the sinking fund as prescribed by the former Acts of the Board or the Bill.

To make provision in regard to the application of the revenue of the Board, and to enact that the ultimate balance of revenue remaining in any one year shall, in lieu of being divided in the manner prescribed by the said Act of 1876, be devoted to reducing the price of water, or the allowance of a discount on the water rates.
