

In the parish of Brent Knoll—

7. To authorize the Undertakers to enter upon, open, cross, break up, and otherwise interfere with the several streets, roads and thoroughfares within the area of supply and to take up, relay, divert and alter sewers, drains, mains and all pipes and works within the same area and to also cross or pass under, through, or along all rivers and canals within the same area and to lay down, set up, maintain, renew and remove either above ground or otherwise, pipes, tubes, wires, posts or other apparatus and do all such other works as may be necessary to carry into effect the objects of the Order.

8. To authorize the Undertakers to acquire, work and use patent rights and licenses in relation to the manufacture and distribution of electricity and for the performing of all acts incidental to public and private lighting.

9. To make special provision with respect to the supply of electricity where the consumer has a separate supply, and also with regard to the erection of overhead wires.

10. To authorize the Undertakers and any County Council, local or road authority and any railway or other company, body or person to make and carry into effect agreements for the execution and maintenance of the works and production, supply and distribution of electricity, and for the performance of all acts incidental to public and private lighting and for all or any of the purposes of the said Acts, and to relieve the Undertakers from the consequences of any act or default of the Undertakers, and to empower the Undertakers to sell and transfer to such local authority, body, company or person for such period and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed on all or some of the powers, duties and liabilities to be conferred on the Undertakers by the Order.

11. To authorize the Undertakers to take, collect and recover rates, rents and charges for the supply of electricity and power and the use of any machines, lamps, meters, fittings or apparatus connected therewith, and to prescribe and limit the price to be charged for electricity.

12. To confer upon the Undertakers with or without variation all or some of the powers of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

13. To incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting Clauses Act, 1899.

And notice is hereby further given that a map showing the boundaries of the proposed area of supply and the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines should be laid down within a specified time and a copy of this advertisement as published in the London Gazette will be deposited on or before the 30th day of November next for public inspection at the offices of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Somerset, at his office, at Bath, in that county, and at the offices of the Clerk to the Urban District Council of Burnham, at Burnham aforesaid, the Clerk to the Urban District Council of Highbridge, at Highbridge aforesaid, the Clerk to the Rural District Council of Axbridge, at Axbridge aforesaid, and also at the offices of the Board of Trade, Whitehall, London.

MIDLAND RAILWAY (WEST RIDING LINES) ABANDONMENT.

(Abandonment of Portions of Railways and Works Authorized by the Midland Railway (West Riding Lines) Act, 1898; Amendment and Repeal of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Midland Railway Company (in this Notice called "the Company") for an Act for the following purposes, or some of them (that is to say):—

1. To authorize the abandonment by the Company of the construction of Railway No. 6, authorized by the Midland Railway (West Riding Lines) Act, 1898, and of so much of Railway No. 4, authorized by that Act as lies between the point marked 1 mile on the deposited plans and the termination of the railway and to release the Company from all liabilities, penalties and obligations in respect to the construction of such parts of the said authorized railways.

2. To empower the Company notwithstanding the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, to hold, use, lease, sell, mortgage, exchange or dispose of any lands, buildings or premises for the time being belonging to them and acquired by them for the purposes of the railway and portion of railway intended to be abandoned and to exempt the Company in respect thereof from the provisions of the said Acts with respect to the sale of superfluous lands.

3. To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the intended Act and to confer other rights and privileges.

4. To alter, amend, extend, enlarge or repeal all or some of the powers or provisions of the Midland Railway (West Riding Lines) Act, 1898, the Act, local and personal, 7 and 8 Vict., cap. 18, and all other Acts relating to the Company.

And notice is hereby further given that copies of the intended Act will, on or before the 17th day of December next, be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
