#### LEICESTERSHIRE AND WARWICKSHIRE ELECTRIC POWER.

(Extension of Time for the Compulsory Purchase of Lands under the Leicestershire and Warwickshire Electric Power Act, 1902, and Extension of Period Limited by the same Act for Commencing Works and Providing Generating Stations Prescribed by that Act; Application of Funds; Power to Erect Electric Lines above Ground; Rearrangement of Capital and Borrowing Powers of Company under Act of 1902, and Facilities for Raising Capital with Power to Issue Share Warrants and Debenture Certificates to Bearer; Power to Issue Capital at a Discount; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session of 1907 by the Leicestershire and Warwickshire Electric Power Company (hereinafter called "the Company"), for leave to bring in a Bill for effecting all or some of the purposes following (that is to say):—

1. To extend the period limited by section 47 of the Leicestershire and Warwickshire Electric Power Act, 1902, for the compulsory purchase and taking of lands for the purposes of that Act, and also to extend the periods limited by section 67 of the said Act of 1902, as extended by the Leicestershire and Warwickshire Electric Power Act 1904, for the Company, making a substantial commencement of the works for carrying out the powers of the said Act of 1902, and for providing the generating stations sufficient in the opinion of the Board of Trade for those purposes, to such extended periods as the Bill may prescribe.

2. To enable the Company, notwithstanding anything in the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, or the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, or in any Act relating to the Company to the contrary, to place electric lines above ground and on or over any lands, streets, roads or property, whether public or private, within the statutory area of supply of the Company, either with or

without the consents of the local and road authorities or of the owners or occupiers of such lands, streets, roads or property, and the Bill will or may contain provisions for dispensing with the consent of the local and road authorities or private owners in respect of the aforesaid purposes.

3. To authorize the Company to apply any capital or funds raised or to be raised under the authority of the Act of 1902 to the purposes of the intended Bill, and for the general purposes of their undertaking to attach a preference or priority of dividend to a portion of the authorized share capital of the Company in such manner and amount as the intended Bill may prescribe or Parliament may sanction.

4. To rearrange, alter, modify, regulate or reduce the amount of the authorized share and loan capital of the Company and of the shares or stock and borrowing powers of the Company and the rates of interest and dividends thereon and the preferences, priorities, powers, rights and privileges attaching thereto respectively, and to attach such new or other rates of interest, dividend, preferences, priorities, powers, rights and privileges thereto as may be deemed necessary or expedient, and to authorize the Company to create and issue permanent or terminable debenture stock in such manner, on such conditions and with such priority as may be prescribed by the intended Bill, and to issue share warrants and debenture or debenture stock certificates to bearer with coupons attached for dividend or interest, notwithstanding anything in the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, or in any other Act to the contrary, and to make all incidental provisions in relation to such warrants and certificates including the rights, privileges and obligations of the holders of such certificates and coupons, and as regards meetings of holders of debenture or share certificates, and also for issuing capital at a discount, and the intended Bill will contain all incidental provisions in relation to such warrants and certificates and the manner of creating and issuing same, and for the issue of capital at a discount.

5. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the intended Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

6. To incorporate with the intended Bill, with or without modification or amendment, all or some of the powers and provisions of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888; and the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899; the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; and the Companies Clauses Acts, 1863 and 1869; and so far as may be deemed expedient to alter, amend, repeal, render inapplicable or extend all or some of the provisions of the Leicestershire and Warwickshire Electric Power Act, 1902; and the Leicestershire and Warwickshire Electric Power Act, 1904; and any other Acts relating to the Company or their undertaking.

7. Printed copies of the intended Bill will, on or before the 17th day of December next, be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
