#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH NOVEMBER 1906.)

#### EAST SUSSEX (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### *Modification of Restrictions in Scheduled Area.*

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall in their application to

the Infected Area described in the Schedule hereto be modified in manner declared by this Order.

*Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.*

2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in the Infected Area if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.

(2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.

(3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.

(5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

*Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.*

3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in an Infected Area if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in

the Licence is in an Infected Area, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

*Licences after Completion of Movement.*

4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in an Infected Area, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in an Infected Area, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

*Attendance at Markets, &c.*

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

*Revocation by Board of Licences.*

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### *Interpretation.*

10. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;

“Infected Area” means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area;

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### *Commencement.*

11. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of December, nineteen hundred and six.

#### *Short Title.*

12. This Order may be cited as the EAST SUSSEX (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

(Compulsory Purchase of Chalybeate Springs and Wells and Lands and Property on and near the Pantiles; Agreements with Landowners; Sinking of Wells or Excavations near Springs; Entry upon Lands, Houses and Premises abutting upon the Pantiles, Market-place, London-road, Market-street and Nevill-street; Pantiles and Market-place to be deemed Highway Repairable by Inhabitants at Large; Pump and other Rooms and Conveniences; Bye-laws; Advertisement as to Springs and Attractions to Borough; Borough Treasurer; Corporation Banking Account; Alteration of Poor Law Unions; Assistant Overseers; Collection of Rates and Water and Electricity Rates and Charges; Provident Fund; Graves and Monuments; Milk Supply; Improvement of Line of Street; Urinals and other Conveniences; Sewers and Drains; Appropriation of Lands; Fire Brigade; Advertisements; Hoardings; Sky Signs; Ice Cream; Sanitary Provisions; Nuisances; Infectious Disease; New Buildings; Rifle Ranges; Electric Lighting Provisions; and Extension of Area; Borrowing of Money; Repeal, Amendment and Incorporation of Acts; Deposit of Plans.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Mayor, Aldermen and burgesses of the borough of Tunbridge Wells (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation" and "the borough" respectively) for an Act for all or some of the following objects and purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Corporation to purchase, by compulsion or agreement, and hold the Chalybeate Springs and wells on the Pantiles, together with all other springs, wells, basins, tanks, baths,

mains, pipes and apparatus connected therewith or adjacent thereto, and all the rights, powers and privileges of the Lord of the Manor of Rusthall or other the owner thereof in respect thereto, and also to purchase by compulsion or agreement and hold the adjoining lands, houses and buildings numbered and known as Nos. 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14 and 16 on the Pantiles, and also the houses and buildings near thereto known as Fonthill, all which springs, wells, lands, houses, and buildings are situate in the parish of Tunbridge Wells in the borough and in the county of Kent.

2. To authorize agreements between the Corporation and the Lord of the Manor of Rusthall or other the owner of the said springs and wells, lands, houses and buildings for the transfer to and the purchase by the Corporation of the said springs and wells, lands, houses and buildings, or for the protection and maintenance of the said springs and wells, and to confirm any agreement entered into between them prior to the passing of the intended Act.

3. To prohibit (subject to such consents, exceptions and conditions as may be prescribed) the sinking of any shaft or well or making of any excavation within such distance (not exceeding 200 yards) of the said springs and wells on the Pantiles as may be prescribed by the intended Act.

4. To confer upon the Corporation power of entry upon the lands, houses and premises within the borough abutting upon the following streets, roads and places (that is to say):—The Pantiles, Market-place, London-road, between Eridge-road and Chapel-place, Market-street and the western side of Nevill-street between London-road and Frant-road, and the lands, houses and buildings known as Fonthill and so much of the Tunbridge Wells Common as lies between Fonthill and London-road, for the purpose of opening up, searching for and testing sewers, drains, tanks and other underground works, in order to ascertain whether there is or is likely to be any risk of pollution of the said springs and wells, and to execute and do any necessary or proper works for the protection of the said springs and wells, and for safeguarding the waters thereof from pollution, and to make provision for the payment of compensation and expenses in relation thereto.

5. To declare or enact that the following streets roads and places, namely:—The Pantiles and Market-place are or shall be highways repairable by the inhabitants at large within the meaning of the Public Health Acts.

6. To authorize the Corporation to erect, provide, equip, maintain, furnish and let a pump room with bath, music, reading and other rooms, shelters and conveniences on the site of the lands hereinbefore referred to and intended to be purchased or other lands belonging to the Corporation, and to authorize charges for admission.

7. To authorize the Corporation to make and enforce bye-laws for the management of the said springs, wells, baths and other premises, and the supply of mineral water, also to empower the Corporation to make and enforce bye-laws for securing the purity of the said springs and wells, and for preventing the contamination of or abstraction of water from such springs and wells.

8. To empower the Corporation to make such reasonable charges as they think fit for the supply of mineral water and the use of baths provided by them, and to appoint, pay and remove clerks,

attendants and servants in respect of the matters aforesaid.

9. To empower the Corporation to pay or contribute towards the cost of advertisements relating to the said springs and wells and of the attractions, amusements and health advantages of the borough.

10. To empower the Corporation to appoint a partnership firm of bankers or a banking company or corporation as treasurer of the borough, and to confer and impose upon the partnership firm of bankers or banking company so appointed the powers and duties of a borough treasurer, and to empower the Corporation to appoint Corporation Bankers.

11. To transfer the parish of Broadwater Down from the Ticehurst Poor Law Union in the county of Sussex to the Tonbridge Poor Law Union in the county of Kent, to alter the number of guardians of the respective unions and to make other necessary or proper arrangements in regard to the matters aforesaid.

12. To make better provision for the collection and recovery of all poor rates, local rates, water rates and rents and electricity charges.

13. To require officers and persons appointed by the Corporation for the collection of poor and other rates within the borough to give security for the due performance of their duties and for the deposit of such securities with the Town Clerk.

14. To authorize the establishment of a fund for providing allowances to workmen and others in cases of accident, old age, infirmity and sickness, and to provide for the burial expenses of such workmen and others, and to make provision for contributions to the fund and for the management of the same.

15. To authorize the Corporation to accept donations or other payments and bequests for the maintenance of graves and monuments in the burial grounds and cemeteries of the Corporation whether acting as the Burial Board under the Burial Acts or under the Public Health Acts.

16. To empower the Medical Officer of Health or other authorized person to enter dairies, byres and cowsheds within the borough or beyond the borough if milk produced therein or supplied therefrom is believed to be sent to the borough, and to examine the cows, to take samples, and to require the owners or occupiers of such dairies, byres and cowsheds to render all reasonable assistance, and to prohibit the selling of milk of cows affected with tuberculosis or any disease which might render the use of such milk dangerous or injurious to health, and to provide for the giving of notice to the Corporation in cases of tuberculosis or other diseases as aforesaid, and to make other provision in regard to the supply of milk to the borough.

17. To empower the Corporation, for the purpose of obtaining a uniform line of frontage or of improving any street or road, to sell, exchange or convey any lands adjoining or forming part of such street or road which will not be required as part of the straightened or improved street or road on such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the Corporation and any landowner, and to extinguish all public rights in respect of such lands, and to make other provision for the straightening and improvement of streets, roads and public places and to empower landowners under disability or with limited powers to enter into such arrangement.

18. To authorize the construction of urinals, water closets and lavatories in or under any street highway or public place within the borough and to authorize charges to be taken for the use of the same.

19. To make further provision as to the inspection and repair of sewers and drains and to define the expression "drain" and "sewer" and to make other provisions with reference to sewers and drains.

20. To authorize the Corporation to appropriate and lay out for building purposes portions of any lands to be acquired by them under the powers of the intended Act, and to sell or exchange or otherwise dispose of and grant building or other leases, and to extend the powers of the Corporation with the respect to the holding, retaining or disposing of lands.

21. To empower the Corporation, with the consent of the Local Government Board, to apply land acquired by the Corporation for one purpose to any other purposes.

22. To empower the Corporation to insure officers and men of the Corporation Fire Brigade against accidents.

23. To make better and further provisions with respect to the following amongst other matters, namely: The regulation and restriction of advertisements, hoardings, sky-signs and projections over streets, the regulation of manufacture and sale of ice cream and the furnishing of information in regard to such manufacture and sale, entry on premises and registration of manufacturers and sellers.

24. To prohibit spitting in streets and other public places, and to impose penalties therefor.

25. To empower the Corporation to make bye-laws for all or any of the purposes of the intended Act, and particularly with respect to the construction of water-closets, soil pipes, waste pipes, ventilating pipes and other sanitary fittings in or connected with existing and new buildings.

26. To enlarge the definition of nuisances under the Public Health Acts, and to confer upon the inspector of nuisances all or some of the powers of the surveyor under section 23 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

27. To make further and better provisions for the prevention of infectious disease in the borough, and particularly to provide for the isolation of infected persons and persons who have been exposed to infection in, or their removal from, infected premises, and to enable the Corporation to pay the expenses of the maintenance of such persons, and to amend, extend and enlarge the provisions of section 78 of the Tunbridge Wells Improvement Act, 1890.

28. To amend section 18 of the last-mentioned Act, and to extend the definition of a new building.

29. To empower the Corporation to erect, maintain and furnish miniature rifle ranges in any recreation ground, park or garden belonging to them and to charge admission thereto, and to provide rifles, apparatus and ammunition and to charge for the use of the same.

VII. cap. cxv.; and also of certain Provisional Orders made and confirmed in the years 1860, 1864, 1866, 1867, 1868, 1876, 1877, 1878, 1886, 1894, 1897, 1900, 1902, 1903, and the Tunbridge Wells Improvement Act, 1890; the Tunbridge Wells Electric Lighting Order, 1891; and any other Act or Provisional Order relating to the Corporation and the said springs and wells.

36. To incorporate, with or without amendment, or render inapplicable, all or some of the provisions of the following public Acts :—

The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; the Local Government Acts, 1888 and 1894; the Public Health Acts; the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Electric Lighting Act, 1882; the Arbitration Act, 1889; and all Acts amending those Acts respectively.



To enable the Company for all or any of the purposes of the Bill to purchase or acquire by compulsion or agreement and to hold lands, houses, buildings and other property or to take easements over or in connection therewith and to erect, hold and use offices, buildings, engine-houses, generating stations, car sheds, stables and other conveniences on any of such lands or property and to sell, lease or dispose of any such lands, houses, buildings and property, and in particular to enable the Company to purchase or acquire by compulsion or agreement and to hold and use, notwithstanding anything contained in the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the sale of superfluous lands, the following lands for the purposes of erecting and to erect, maintain and use thereon a generating station or stations for generating electrical energy, depôts, car-sheds, workshops, transforming stations and other buildings or other the purposes of the undertaking (namely):—

Certain lands, containing 8·452 acres, being the fields or enclosures numbered 305 and 306 on the  Ordnance Map (Yorkshire West Riding, Sheet CCLXXXIII, 2) in the parish and urban district of Wombwell in the West Riding of the county of York, situate on the north-west side of and adjoining the Sheffield and South Yorkshire Navigation Dearne and Dove Canal (Elsecar Branch) and bounded on the south by the lands on which formerly the engine-house (pumping) adjoining the Hemingfield Sewage Works was erected.

#### Street Works.

4. To authorize the making of the following street works or some of them, and to empower the Company to enter upon, take and use the lands, houses and other property required for the purposes of such street works and works connected therewith as shown on the deposited plans and described in the deposited books of reference after mentioned or any of them (that is to say):—

Work A.—A widening in the parish of Wombwell of the Barnsley-road on its north-easterly side from a point 24 yards to the south-east of the Halfway House Inn for a distance of 108 yards in a south-easterly direction.

Work B.—Widening of Park-street, Wombwell, on the northerly side thereof opposite the constabulary office from a point 30 feet to the north-west of the south-west corner of a stable for a distance in a south-easterly direction of 20 yards.

Work C.—A widening in the parish of Wombwell, in the urban district of Wombwell, of Wath-road at Junction Bridge on its north and south sides and in connection therewith the diversion and reconstruction of the bridge carrying the road over the Dearne and Dove Canal and the road approaches thereto between two points one 20 yards from the centre of such bridge in a north-westerly direction and the other 20 yards from the centre of the bridge in a south-easterly direction.

Work D.—Widening of Barnsley-road, in the parish of Wath upon Dearne, on the north side thereof from Vicar-road in an easterly direction for a distance of 50 yards.

Work E.—A widening rounding off and improvement partly in the parish of West Melton and partly in the parish of Wath upon Dearne, both in the urban district of Wath upon Dearne, of Well-lane on its western side and of Barnsley-road on its south side between a point in that road 35 yards to the west of the centre of the bridge carrying Barnsley-road over Brook Dyke to a point in Well-lane 77 yards south from the north-east corner of Well-lane and a widening of such lane on its eastern side from a point 55 yards south from the north-east corner of Well-lane for a distance of 50 yards.

Work F.—A widening in the parish of Wath upon Dearne of West-street on its east side commencing from a point in line with the south-west corner of No. 15, West-street, and continuing in a southerly direction for a distance of 30 yards.

5. The Bill may provide for the vesting of the street works or any of them in the road authority and that the construction of so much of any tramway as is intended to be situate in any new street or road to be made or street or road to be widened under the Bill shall not be commenced until such new street or road or street or road widening shall be approaching completion.

6. To exempt the Company from the operation of section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, so as to enable them to purchase compulsorily parts only of certain properties.

7. To empower the Company to deviate, laterally and vertically, from the lines and levels of the proposed tramways and street works shown on the deposited plans and sections after-mentioned to the extent to be shown on the said plans and sections, or to be defined in the Bill, and for the purposes of, and in connection with the street works, with the consent of the local authority, to make junctions and communications with any existing streets or roads, which may be interfered with, or intercepted by, or be contiguous to such works, and to make diversions, widenings or alterations of lines or levels of any existing streets or roads for the purpose of connecting the same with such works, or of crossing under or over the same.

8. To empower the Company from time to time, and either temporarily or permanently, to make, maintain, alter, remove or abandon such tramways, crossings, passing-places, cross-overs, deviations, sidings, junctions, curves, turnouts, turntables and other works, in addition to those specified herein as may be necessary or convenient for the efficient working of the proposed tramways, or any of them, or otherwise in the interests of the Company, or for facilitating the passage of traffic along streets and roads, or for providing access to any stables or carriage-



houses, engine-houses, generating stations, stationary engines, works or buildings of the Company or for forming junctions with any other tramways, tramroads or light railways existing or authorized, or which may hereafter be authorized.

9. To empower the Company to substitute double lines for single or interlacing lines, single lines for double or interlacing lines, and interlacing lines for double or single lines on any of the proposed tramways.

10. To empower the Company to work and use the proposed tramways, or any of them, and any tramways for the time being leased to or run over, worked or used by the Company, by means of engines, carriages, trucks and vehicles propelled (in addition to or in substitution for animal power), by electrical power generated at and applied from stations or otherwise, or steam pneumatic, gas, oil or other mechanical power or partly by one such power and partly by another such power, and for that purpose or any purpose appurtenant or ancillary thereto, to confer on the Company such rights, powers and privileges as may be necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the purposes of the Bill, and in particular power to enter upon and open the surface of and to lay down on, in, under or over the surface of any footway, footpath, street, road, place, railway or bridge, such posts, wires, tubes, mains, plates or apparatus, and to make and maintain such openings, posts, wires, tubes or ways on, in, under or over any such surface, and remove any such lamp-post, pillar box or other erections, and to attach to any house or building, bridge or existing lamp-post or standard such supports, brackets and fittings as may be necessary or convenient, either for the construction and working of the proposed tramways, or for providing access to or in connection with any generating station, engines, machinery or apparatus, and to empower the Company for the purpose of working the proposed tramways, and of the Bill, to erect engines and machinery, and to acquire, hold, grant and dispose of patent and other rights and licences, and to use patent and other rights and licences in relation to such electrical or other mechanical power.

11. To enable the Company to levy and recover tolls, rates and charges in respect of the proposed tramways and any other tramways owned, leased to, or run over, worked or used by them, and for the conveyance of passengers and traffic thereon, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payments of such tolls, rates and charges and to alter existing tolls, rates and charges and any exemptions therefrom.

12. To reserve to the Company the exclusive right of using on the proposed tramways, engines and carriages with flange wheels or wheels specially adapted to run on a grooved edge or other rail.

13. To provide for and regulate the user by the Company for the purposes of the Bill of any paving, metalling or road materials excavated or removed by them during the construction of any of the proposed tramways and street works, and the ownership and disposal of any surplus paving, metalling or materials and to make provision with respect to the materials to be used by the Company in executing any such works.

14. To authorize the Company when by reason of the execution of any work affecting the surface or soil of any footway, footpath, street, road or place or otherwise in which any tramway, channel conduit or electric line shall be or is to be laid or

placed, it is necessary or expedient to remove or discontinue the use of any tramway, channel, conduit or electric line as aforesaid or any part thereof to make in the same or any adjacent street road or place, and maintain, work and use so long as occasion may require a temporary tramway, channel, conduit or electric line, or temporary tramways, channels, conduits or electric lines in lieu of the tramway, channel, conduit or electric line or part of the tramway, channel, conduit or electric line so removed or discontinued to be used or intended so to be.

15. To empower the Company to widen where necessary the carriage road along which the proposed tramways are to be laid by reducing the width of the footpath or otherwise.

16. To empower the Company on the one hand, the County Council of the West Riding of the County of York, the Corporation of the borough of Barnsley and any local authority or other bodies of persons, or any of them having respectively the control or management or the duty of directing the repairs of or in whom there are vested any footways, footpaths, streets, roads, bridges, canals, sewers and places respectively within the said county or borough and of the districts, parishes and places to which the Bill relates on the other hand to enter into and carry into effect contracts or agreements with regard to all or any of the purposes of the Bill, and in particular with respect to the widening of any street, road or place, and the contribution by such authorities or any of them to the expense thereof, the alteration of the widths or levels of any of the said footways, footpaths, streets, roads, bridges, canals, sewers or places and the manner of and time for laying down, placing, altering, maintaining, renewing, repairing and working, and the using by the Company of the proposed tramways and the rails, plates, sleepers, tubes, wires, posts, brackets, ways and works connected therewith, and for facilitating the passage of carriages and traffic over or along any of the proposed tramways, the erection of waiting rooms for passengers, and for the purchase or postponement of the purchase or variation of the terms of purchase under the Tramways Act, 1870, of the proposed Tramways or any of them or of any lands and properties acquired by the Company for the purposes of the proposed street works or otherwise by the County Council, corporation, councils, local authorities, bodies or persons as aforesaid or any of them, and to confirm any agreements entered into or to be entered into with the County Council, corporation, councils, local authorities, bodies or persons as aforesaid or any of them with respect to any of the purposes aforesaid or other the purposes of the Bill.

17. To authorize the Company on the one hand and any local authority, company or person owning or working any tramways or light railways which can be worked with the proposed tramways on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect agreements for the construction, working, running over, using managing and maintaining by the contracting parties or any of them of all or any of their respective tramways or light railways, the making of all necessary junctions, the supply of rolling-stock, plant and machinery necessary for the purposes of such agreements, and the employment, appointment and removal of officers and servants, the payments to be made and conditions to be performed in respect of such working, use, management

and maintenance, and the interchange accommodation and convenience, transmission and delivery of traffic, coming from or destined for the respective undertakings of the contracting parties, the payment, collection, division and apportionment of the tolls, rates and other receipts arising from the respective undertakings, and to confer on the Company and the said authorities, companies or persons all such powers as may be necessary for giving effect to all or any of the aforesaid purposes.

18. To alter or repeal the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, with reference to the purchase of the proposed tramways by local authorities, or to make other provisions with respect to the purchase of the proposed tramways and of the undertaking of the Company by the local authority, particularly with reference to the date of such purchase, the method of payment and the basis upon which the amount to be paid shall be determined, and for securing that the lines may not be broken into sections held by different owners, or lessees and that their being worked as one continuous tramway route shall not in any way be prevented or obstructed.

19. To authorize the Company to abstract and utilise for condensing and other purposes of their undertaking and return in whole or in part the waters of the Dearne and Dove Canal.

20. To empower the Company to enter into and carry into effect agreements with any local authority, company, body or person for the supply to such local authority, company, body or person, or by such local authority, company, body, or person, to the Company of electrical energy for use within or beyond the limits of supply of the authority, company, body or person supplying such energy, and to lay pipes, tubes and wires for the purposes of any such agreement, across or along any roads, streets or bridges, or so as to connect the proposed tramways with any generating station, and to empower the Company to apply for or take transfers of Provisional Orders enabling them to supply electrical energy, and to supply electrical energy under such Orders, and by agreement to undertake the supply of electricity for all purposes within the urban districts of Wath upon Dearne and Darfield, and for that purpose to take a transfer or lease of the powers or undertaking of the councils of those districts, or any of them, and to confer powers on the said councils to grant such transfer or lease.

21. To empower the Company to cut, lop off and remove any trees planted in or near any street, road or place along or across which any of the proposed tramways are laid which may interfere with the construction or working of such tramways, or the trolley wires, or the clear and safe passage of the tramcars and the passengers thereon, and to erect waiting rooms for passengers on any of the roadways in which the proposed tramways will be laid.

22. To authorize the Company to provide and work motor cars and omnibuses, and to make charges in respect thereof.

23. To enable the Company out of moneys to be raised by them under the powers of the Bill, or otherwise to pay interest to shareholders on the sums which may be from time to time paid on the shares in the undertaking allotted to them anything in the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, or any other act to the contrary notwithstanding.

24. To provide for the appointment of an auditor or auditors of the Company, and the holding of the ordinary meetings of the Company once instead of twice in each year.

25. To enable the Company to sell or to lease either in perpetuity or for a limited period their undertaking and works or any part thereof to any local authority, public body, company or person, and to transfer to and vest in the purchaser or lessee all or any of the powers of the Company, including power to work the tramways so transferred, and to levy and recover tolls, rates and charges in respect of the use of the same, and for the conveyance of passengers and traffic thereon, and to empower any such authority to grant and the Company to take a lease of or to run over and use the same on such terms and conditions and for such period as may be agreed upon or as the Bill may prescribe.

26. To empower the Board of Trade from time to time to make, and the Company to enforce, bye-laws and regulations for regulating the use of electrical power, and for ensuring the protection and accommodation of passengers in the tramcars and traffic in and along the streets and roads in which the tramways are laid and to attach penalties to the breach or non-observance thereof or of the provisions of the Bill, and to provide that it shall not be necessary to have the tramway cars of the Company and the drivers and conductors thereof licensed as in the case of stage and hackney carriages or otherwise.

27. To make special provision for the prevention of damage to the proposed tramways or any works connected therewith.

28. The Bill will or may authorize the local authority of any district in which any of the proposed street works is situate instead of or jointly with the Company to construct or execute in whole or in part such street work, and to exercise all or some of the powers in respect thereof proposed to be conferred upon the Company in full or to such extent and upon such conditions and subject to such restrictions as the Bill may define or as Parliament may prescribe, and for such purposes to borrow money on the security of the funds, rates and revenues under their control respectively and to apply their corporate funds.

29. To incorporate in the Bill the Lands Clauses Acts; the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; and any Acts amending the same respectively, and extend and apply to the proposed tramways and works in whole or in part and with or without variation or amendment all or some of the powers and provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, and so far as may be deemed expedient to alter, amend, repeal, render inapplicable or extend all or some of the provisions of that Act and of the Locomotives Acts, 1861 and 1865; the Highways and Locomotives Amendment Act, 1878; and all other Acts and Orders, if any, relating to or which may be affected by or interfere with the objects of the Bill.

30. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with the carrying into effect of the objects of the Bill, and of such contracts, agreements or arrangements aforesaid, and to confer other rights and privileges, and all such powers other than those hereinbefore mentioned on the Company as may be requisite or necessary for the purposes of the Bill.

31. And notice is hereby further given that plans and sections in duplicate of the proposed tramways and street works, and plans showing also the lands, houses and other property which will or may be taken or used for the purposes thereof, or under the powers of the Bill, with a book of reference to such plans containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and of the occupiers of such lands, houses and other property, together with a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited on or before the 30th day of November instant for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the West Riding of the county of York, at his office at Wakefield and on or before the same day a copy of so much of the said plans, sections and book of reference as relates to the areas hereinafter mentioned, and a copy of this Notice, as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited with the officers respectively hereinafter mentioned (that is to say):—

In the case of any borough, with the Town Clerk of such borough at his office; in the case of any urban district, not being a borough, with the Clerk of the district council of such district at his office; in the case of any parish having a parish council, with the Clerk of the parish council at his office, or if he has no office, at his residence, or if there is no clerk, with the Chairman of that council at his residence; and in the case of any parish comprised in a rural district, and not having a parish council, with the Chairman of the Parish Meeting at his residence, and with the Clerk of the District Council of such district at his office.

To authorize the Company to deviate laterally from the lines of the intended railways and water and other works to the extent shown on the plans hereinafter mentioned or as may be provided by the Bill and also to deviate vertically from the levels shown on the sections hereinafter mentioned to such extent as may be prescribed by the Bill.

To empower the Company to cross, stop up, alter, divert or otherwise interfere with temporarily or permanently all such roads, streets, footpaths, highways, bridges, railways, tramways, canals, rivers and streams, pipes, sewers, drains, telegraph or telephone wires and posts within the aforesaid parishes as it may be necessary to cross, stop up, alter, divert or otherwise interfere with for the purposes of the said intended railways and water and other works and of the Bill.

improved means of communication, omnibuses, coaches, cars and other road vehicles to be drawn or moved by animal power, electricity or any mechanical power, and therein to convey persons, luggage, parcels, animals and goods whether to and from any of their stations or otherwise, and to make and recover charges in respect of such conveyance, and to enter into contracts or agreements with any company or person for the supply or working of any such omnibuses, coaches, cars and other road vehicles.

To confer further powers on the Company with reference to subscriptions to be made by them to the Railway Clearing System Superannuation Fund, and to apply their funds towards the payment of any such subscription.

To authorize the Company to apply for the purposes of the Bill any of their existing or authorized capital or funds, and for those purposes and the general purposes of their Undertaking or other purposes to which they are empowered to apply their funds to raise additional capital by the creation of ordinary or new preference shares or stocks, and by borrowing on mortgage and the issue of debenture stock or to confer further powers on the Company as to the creation of preferred and deferred converted stock.

(Further Provision for the Maintenance of the Harbour of Southwold in the County of Suffolk; Power to Corporation of Southwold to Purchase the Southwold Harbour Undertaking and for the Transfer of Property and Liabilities of Southwold Harbour Company; Application to Corporation of the Statutory Powers conferred by the Southwold Harbour Order, 1898; Amending Rates and Dues Leviable under the said Order; Borrowing Powers; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts and Order.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade on or before the 22nd day of December next

by or on behalf of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Southwold in the county of Suffolk (hereinafter called "the Corporation") for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") pursuant to the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, and the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, Amendment Act for the following purposes or some of them (that is to say) :—

1. To confirm, so far as may be necessary, an undertaking given in August last by the Corporation to the Board of Trade that upon default by the Southwold Harbour Company (hereinafter called "the Company") to maintain the Harbour of Southwold as defined in the Southwold Harbour Order, 1898 (hereinafter respectively called "the Harbour Undertaking" and "the Order of 1898"), in an efficient condition to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade, that the Corporation will themselves maintain the Harbour Undertaking in such efficient condition to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade, and to permit the said Board to use the name of the Corporation in any proceedings necessary to enforce the covenant contained in an agreement dated the 1st day of June, 1906, made under section 35 of the Order of 1898 with the consent of the Board of Trade between the Corporation and the Company (hereinafter called "the Agreement of 1906") as to such maintenance and to authorize the Corporation for the purposes of such maintenance to charge the borough fund and borough rate in any year with the cost thereof.

2. So far as may be necessary to confirm and give effect to the Agreement of 1906 and to any agreement or agreements between the Corporation and the Company which have been or may be entered into prior to the passing of the Act confirming the Order.

3. To authorize the Corporation at any time within six months after the periods or on the happening of the events mentioned in the Agreement of 1906 to purchase and the Company or person in whom the Harbour Undertaking is vested to sell the same for such price as shall failing agreement be settled by arbitration or prescribed by the Order and to confer all necessary powers in that behalf.

4. To provide that upon the completion of the purchase the Harbour Undertaking and all powers, rights, authorities and privileges, duties and obligations of the Company authorized by, held under or conferred by the Order of 1898 or part or parts thereof shall be transferred to, vested in, imposed upon and exercised by the Corporation free from all debts, liabilities and engagements, claims and demands of the Company.

5. To provide for the discharge by the Company or the person in whom the Harbour Undertaking is vested, of all sums borrowed on mortgage, and other debts and liabilities of the Harbour Undertaking; to make provisions with regard to pending actions by or against the Company, and as to the continuance and the enforcement by the Corporation of all existing bye-laws until altered, and to enable the Corporation and the Company, with the consent of the Board of Trade, to extend the time for the purchase of the Harbour Undertaking, or to vary the provisions of the Agreement of 1906, or any ancillary deed of covenant.

6. To authorize the Corporation to borrow money for the purposes of the Order on the security of the Harbour Undertaking, and of the

rates and charges authorized to be levied thereat, and upon the security of the borough fund and borough rate, or such other security as shall be defined in the Order, and to make up any deficiency in the harbour revenue in any year out of the said borough fund and borough rate.

7. To alter, amend and to increase, if necessary, the existing tolls, rates, dues and charges levied and leviable under the Order of 1898 in respect of ships, vessels and boats lading or unlading, and in respect of goods, wares and merchandise landed or shipped upon or from the Harbour Undertaking, and, if need be, upon persons using the harbour, and upon passengers arriving or departing from the Harbour Undertaking, and to impose new tolls, rates, dues and charges, and to amend the tolls, rates, dues and charges leviable within the limits of the Order of 1898 in such manner as the Order may prescribe and the Board of Trade may approve.

8. Within the limits to which the Order of 1898, and this Order extends the Company shall be a pilotage authority within the meaning of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and acts amending the same, and shall for the purposes of the Order of 1898 and this Order have all the powers conferred by those Acts on pilotage authorities.

9. To confer upon the Corporation and the Company all other powers necessary or desirable for effecting the objects and purposes of the Order, and to repeal, vary or extinguish all rights, powers, authorities, jurisdictions, privileges and exemptions which may in any way interfere with any of the said objects and purposes, and to confer, vary and extinguish other rights, powers, authorities, jurisdictions, privileges and exemptions.

10. To repeal, alter, amend or extend all or some of the provisions of the Order of 1898, and any Acts or Orders relating to the Harbour Undertaking or the Corporation, or the borough of Southwold, which may be affected by the Order.

11. To incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Harbours, Docks and Piers Clauses Act, 1847, and the Harbours and Passing Tolls Act, 1861, or some of these Acts with such variations as may be provided by the Order.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill (hereinafter called "the Bill") for effecting all or some of the purposes following (that is to say):—

1. To incorporate a Company (hereinafter called "the Company") for the general purposes of establishing, constructing, erecting, laying down, maintaining, working, using and carrying on electrical generating stations and all other kinds of electrical works, and generating, producing, transmitting, transforming, distributing, supplying and utilising electrical energy, and of manufacturing gas for the purpose of generating energy thereby and doing all things necessary for or ancillary to that purpose, and generally carrying out the purposes of an electrical supply company and the other purposes of the Bill.

2. To empower the Company to enter upon, take and use, compulsorily or otherwise, and to hold amongst other lands (which expression in this Notice includes lands, messuages, tenements, and hereditaments, houses and buildings of any tenure) the lands in the counties of London, Essex, Kent and Surrey hereinafter described or some of them or some part or parts thereof respectively, and any estates, rights or interests in or easements over or in connection with the same respectively (that is to say):—

4. And to empower the Company in, under, over or upon all or any of such lands respectively and any other lands which may be acquired by, leased to, or rented by the Company or any part thereof or on any other lands to erect, maintain, work and use a station or stations and works for producing, generating, using, transforming, transmitting, conveying, supplying, utilising and distributing electrical energy manufacturing gas for the purpose of generating electricity and manufacturing and disposing of any material, product, matter or thing arising or used in the process of such production, generation, user, transformation, transmission, conveyance, supply, utilisation or distribution, together with all necessary dynamos, batteries, accumulators, motors, generators, converters, engines, plant, machinery, works, buildings, structures, piers, wharves, roads, tramways, railways, sidings, appliances, apparatus and conveniences for those or any subsidiary or other purposes, and to manufacture, produce, generate purchase, transform and store such energy, gas, materials, products, matters and things and to transmit, transform, supply, distribute and utilise the same to and within or to such extent as may be provided by the Bill, beyond the following limits or some part or parts thereof (that is to say):—

In those parts of the counties of London, Essex and Kent hereinafter described, namely:—

In the administrative county of London:—

The city of London, the city of Westminster, the Royal borough of Kensington, and the metropolitan boroughs of Battersea, Bermondsey, Bethnal Green, Camberwell, Chelsea, Deptford, Finsbury, Fulham, Greenwich, Hackney, Hammersmith, Hampstead, Holborn, Islington, Lambeth, Lewisham, Paddington, Poplar, St. Marylebone, St. Pancras, Shore-ditch, Southwark, Stepney, Stoke Newington, Wandsworth and Woolwich.

In the county of Essex:—

The county borough of West Ham, the urban districts of Ilford, Woodford, Wanstead, Leyton, East Ham, Barking Town, Romford and Grays Thurrock, and the rural district of Romford, and such parts of the rural district of Orsett as is comprised in the parishes of Aveley, West Thurrock, Stifford, South Ockendon, North Ockendon, Bulphan, Orsett, Little Thurrock and Chadwell St. Mary's.

In the county of Kent:—

The borough of Gravesend, the urban districts of Northfleet, Dartford and Erith,

and so much of the rural district of Dartford as is comprised in the parishes of Crayford, Stone and Swanscombe.

In the county of Surrey—

The county borough of Croydon, the boroughs of Richmond and Kingston-on-Thames, the urban districts of Barnes, Ham, Maldens and Coombe and Wimbledon, and the rural district of Croydon.

5. To empower the Company within or to such extent as may be provided by the Bill, beyond such limits, to produce, generate, purchase, transmit, transform, distribute, supply, store, regulate and utilise electrical energy, and to manufacture, purchase, supply, erect, fit up, maintain, repair, renew, work and use dynamos, accumulators, motors, engines, batteries, fittings, lamps, meters, machinery, vessels, apparatus, works, plant, stock and any materials, products, matters or things arising or used in the process of producing, generating, transmitting, transforming, distributing, supplying or utilising, regulating or storing such energy, and of manufacturing, using or otherwise dealing with all articles, matters and things as aforesaid, and to exercise such powers, do such work, supply such materials, and render such services as may be necessary or convenient in and for such production, generation, purchase, transforming, transmission, distribution, supply, utilisation, storage, regulation and measurement of electrical energy, or for providing and working material for that purpose, or for manufacturing, supplying, erecting, fitting up, renewing and repairing any such articles, matters and things as aforesaid, and to make such charges therefor and in such manner as the Company think fit or the Bill may provide.

6. To empower the Company on the lands hereinbefore described and elsewhere within the limits aforesaid or any part or parts thereof and to such extent as may be provided by the Bill beyond the said limits, to open, break up, interfere with and make attachments to or to structures in or in connection with, street roads, public places, footways, footpaths, towing paths, level crossings, railways, tramways, rivers, canals, waterways, foreshores, tidal lands, docks, locks, wharves, bridges, subways, tunnels (including in particular the Blackwall Tunnel, Rotherhithe and Ratcliff Tunnel, Millwall to Greenwich Subway and the Tower Subway), culverts, quays, piers, sewers, drains, pipes, telegraphic, telephonic or pneumatic tubes, wires and apparatus, and to lay down, erect, set up, maintain, renew or remove either above or under or on the surface of the ground pipes, ducts, tubes, wires, casings, troughs, inspection chambers and boxes, man-holes, posts, apparatus and other works, matters and things, including pipes for conveying water or gas and any materials, matters and things used in or resulting from their operations to or from their works, and for those purposes or any of them to exercise within and beyond such limits, in addition to other powers for similar purposes, the powers or some of the powers of the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871; the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863; the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888; and of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, whether with or without modification or amendment.

7. To empower the Company for all or any of the purposes of their undertaking to acquire compulsorily or by agreement, easements or rights of access for the purpose of erecting,

laying down and maintaining and from time to time enlarging, altering, removing, repairing, renewing, testing and inspecting pipes, mains, cables, wires, tubes, boxes, poles, standards, posts, protective works and apparatus and to enter upon, pass over, break open, take, use and otherwise interfere with, construct, erect and do all such works and things as may be necessary for effecting the purposes aforesaid or any of them in, along, across, over and under or in attachment to—

In the parish of Barking, in the urban district of Barking Town, in the county of Essex—

The land and railway of the London, Tilbury and Southend Railway Company forming the level crossing of the public or occupation road known as Ripple-lane over or across the railway lines of the said London, Tilbury and Southend Railway and the public or occupation road known as Ripple-lane from a point 50 yards, or thereabouts, to the south of the said level crossing to Ripple-road.

In the parish and metropolitan borough of Greenwich, in the county of London—

The lands forming the site of the roadway leading from Blackwall-lane at or near the north-eastern end of River-terrace to the western boundary of the lands secondly described in paragraph 2 of this Notice.

And for the purposes aforesaid or any other purposes by agreement to acquire easements over any lands or property belonging to or vested in any company, body or person.

8. To empower the Company to take, collect and recover rates, rents and charges for the supply of electrical energy or any materials or things supplied or services rendered by the Company and the supply, fitting up or use of any machines, lamps, meters, motors, transformers, fittings or apparatus connected therewith, and to provide for regulating the method of charging for electrical energy or in respect to any of the matters aforesaid and for the dividends to be paid and the profits to be made by the Company.

9. To make special provision with respect to the rights and obligations of the Company to afford a whole or partial supply of electrical energy within all or any part of, and in districts contiguous to and beyond, the limits aforesaid or to exempt the Company from any such obligation to supply within any prescribed area or to any prescribed persons and with respect to the terms and conditions on which and the bodies and persons to whom such supply will be afforded, and the exercise of all or any of the powers aforesaid affecting streets and roads or any other places or things authorized to be interfered with and the control and regulation of the operations of the Company, and if and so far as necessary to exempt the Company from the provisions of the Electric Lighting Act, 1882, and the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, in that and other respects.

10. To make provision for the inspection and testing of mains, conductors and works for the appointment and remuneration of electrical inspectors, and for the supply, use, inspection, testing and certifying of meters, fittings and instruments.

11. To authorize the Company to enter upon any houses, buildings or lands supplied or proposed to be supplied with electrical energy, apparatus or fittings for utilising the same and for all or any purposes relating to such supply

or use of energy or fittings, and to provide that all articles and things let on hire by the Company shall not be deemed to be landlords' fixtures nor be subject to distress or to be taken in execution.

12. To empower the Company to acquire and use patents and patent rights.

13. To empower the Company and any other company empowered by Act of Parliament or Provisional Order or otherwise entitled to generate, supply, distribute or use electrical energy and any Government department, local authority or other body of trustees, company or person owning, working, using, managing or controlling any waterworks, canal, navigation, harbour, dock, colliery, railway, tramway, factory or other undertaking, and any company hereafter incorporated, to construct, work, use, manage or control any such undertaking in connection with which a supply of electrical energy or of plant or fittings or rendering of services is required from the Company or any other body of trustees, company, body or person to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect to all or any of the following matters (that is to say):—

(a) The supply by or to the Company, whether within or beyond the said limits, to or by such other company, such Government department, local authority, company, trustees, body or person of electrical energy for the purposes of such other company, such Government department, local authority, company, trustees, body or person, or of the Company respectively, and for use within or beyond the limits aforesaid or of plant, fittings or materials, or the rendering of services in connection therewith.

(b) The prices to be charged for and the terms and conditions of such supply or services.

(c) The execution of any works for the generation, supply, transformation or use of electrical energy within or beyond the said limits or the exercise of any of the powers of the Company by such other company, such Government department, local authority, company, trustees, body or person, or the exercise by the Company of any powers of such other company, such department, authority, company, trustees, body or person on their behalf; and

(d) The supply by such local authority, company, trustees, body or person of water to the Company for condensing and any other purposes of its undertaking.

And to confer all necessary powers upon the Company and any such Government department, local authority, company, body or person to enable them to carry out and into effect any such agreement or agreements.

14. To authorize the Company on the one hand and any local authority, company, body or person who may be authorized to generate, supply or use electricity (whether within or beyond the aforesaid limits) on the other hand to enter into and carry into effect arrangements and agreements for the transfer to the Company of their undertaking, powers, rights, privileges, liabilities and obligations in whole or in part and in connection therewith to authorize the Company to generate, transform, use, distribute and supply electrical energy at and from any generating station or works so transferred to them to and within or beyond the aforesaid limits or to relieve the Company from obligation to supply electricity from any such generating station, and to confer all necessary powers

upon the Company and any such local authority, company, body or person to enable them to carry out and into effect any such agreement or agreements and to enable the Company to exercise any powers agreed to be transferred to it as aforesaid, and to authorize the Company to apply to the Board of Trade for Provisional Orders under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, in respect of any district or districts in any part of which the Company may be authorized to supply electrical energy.

15. To empower the Company to abstract and utilise for condensing and other purposes of their undertaking water from the River Thames, and to enable the Company on the one hand and the Conservators of the River Thames, the Metropolitan Water Board, the Admiralty and any Government department, body or person interested therein or any of them on the other hand from time to time to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect thereto.

16. To empower the Company for all or any of the purposes of their undertaking within, or to such extent as may be provided by the Bill beyond, the limits aforesaid to purchase, take, lease, rent or otherwise acquire, hold and sell, exchange, let or lease or otherwise dispose of, free from the restrictions of the Lands Clauses Acts as to superfluous lands, lands or interests in or easements in, under or over lands.

17. To empower the Company to acquire a portion of or an easement in, over or under any lands, houses, buildings, or property required for the purposes of the undertaking without being subject to the liability imposed by section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

18. To alter and amend in their application to the undertaking of the Company, or to exempt the Company from all or some of the provisions of the London Building Acts, 1894 to 1905; the Metropolis Management Acts, 1855 to 1893, and of any bye-laws with respect to buildings made by any local authority within the limits aforesaid and the Acts or Orders under which such bye-laws or any of them are made.

19. To enable the Company on the one hand and the Conservators of the River Thames on the other hand to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect to the laying down or erecting in, under, over, along or across the River Thames and the banks, foreshores or bed thereof, of any tubes, pipes, electric lines, cables or works, and to authorize the Company to lay down or erect such tubes, pipes, electric lines, cables or works and other works in accordance with the terms of any such agreement, and generally to confer upon the Company and the said Conservators all necessary powers for carrying any agreement which may be made as aforesaid into effect, and if thought fit to sanction and confirm any agreement or agreements with respect to the objects aforesaid or any of them which may have been entered into prior to the passing of the Bill.

20. To empower the Company to raise capital by means of ordinary or preference shares or stock and to restrict or regulate the votes of holders of preference shares or stock, to borrow money on mortgage or bond or by the issue of debenture stock, and to pay interest out of capital on any shares or stock of the Company, to subscribe for, purchase and hold shares or stock in the capital of any company giving or taking or agreeing to give or take a supply of electrical energy from the Company or estab-



lishing factories or works within the aforesaid limits, or carrying on any undertaking of a kind similar or subsidiary to the undertaking of the Company, and to lend money on mortgage or bond or otherwise to any such company or other body or person taking or agreeing to take such supply, and to apply the capital and funds of the Company for all or any of the purposes aforesaid or other the purposes of the Bill.

21. To incorporate with the Bill, with or without alteration or modification, all or some of the provisions of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845 to 1889, and especially to modify in their application to the Company the provisions thereof relating to qualification, disqualification, rotation, election, continuance in office and proceedings of and vacancies among directors, general meetings of the Company and votes of shareholders, and to make further and better provision in respect of such matters, the Lands Clauses Acts; the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863; and of the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, and any other Acts amending the same, and to extend and apply to the proposed undertaking and works and to the Company, with or without exception or variation, all or such of the provisions of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as may be thought expedient and applicable, and to restrict in their application to the Company or apply to the Company in a modified form all or any of the provisions of those Acts, or to limit the area within which the same shall be applicable, and especially but not exclusively to exempt the Company from the provisions following (that is to say):—

(1) Section 13 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1882, as amended by the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, with respect to the breaking up of railways or tramways and roads over bridges, and the provisions of the said Acts with regard to overhead wires, and also the provisions of the said Act of 1888 with respect to the purchase of the undertaking by the local authority.

(2) The provisions of the schedule to the said Act of 1899 with respect to the following matters (that is to say):—The Undertakers, security and accounts, compulsory works, supply, price, electric inspectors, testing, inspection, revocation of powers and liability for nuisance.

And to vary the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the subscription of capital prior to the exercise of compulsory powers.

22. 23. The Bill will, or may provide, if it is thought necessary or expedient, for the sale, transfer or lease by the Company of their undertaking or any part or parts thereof to, and the purchase or acquisition of the same by, any central, local or other authority, body of trustees, public board, company, association of companies or other body or persons empowered or hereafter to be empowered by Act of Parliament or otherwise to generate, supply, distribute or use electrical energy within or in any area contiguous to the limits aforesaid (each and any one or more of which is hereinafter in this paragraph included in the expression "the other authority") or for the amalgamation, fusion or joint working as one undertaking of the undertaking of the Company or any part or parts thereof with the electrical undertaking of the other authority or any part of parts thereof, or for the exercise by the other authority of all or any of the powers, rights, authorities and privileges proposed to be conferred upon the Company, and, in the event of provision being made to any or either of the above effects, will confer upon and make applicable to the Company and the other authority all such powers and provisions as may be necessary or expedient for such purposes or any of them, and will confirm, sanction and give effect to any agreements or arrangements which may be made in relation to such purposes or any of them.

24. To vary or extinguish all or any rights or privileges inconsistent with or which would or might interfere with the objects of the Bill and to confer other rights and privileges.

25. To alter, extend or amend so far as may be necessary for the purposes aforesaid or any of them the provisions of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, and of any other Act or Acts relating to or affecting the Conservators of the River Thames or their undertaking.

mencing in the parish of St. Andrew, in Pilgrim-street opposite Market-street, and terminating in the parish of All Saints in New Bridge-street, at the northern end of Trafalgar-street.

Work No. 2.—A new street wholly in the parish of St. Andrew, to connect the said Work No. 1 with New Bridge-street, commencing in New Bridge-street at a point about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  chains east of Pilgrim-street, and terminating by a junction with Work No. 1, at a point about 5 chains east of Pilgrim-street.

Work No. 3.—A new street to connect New Bridge-street with Carliol-square, commencing in the parish of All Saints in New Bridge-street, at a point about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  chains west of Trafalgar-street, passing through the parish of St. Andrew and into and terminating in the parish of All Saints, in Carliol-square, at a point about 3 chains west of Trafalgar-street.

Work No. 4.—A new street, wholly in the parish of St. Andrew, commencing at the termination of Work No. 2, hereinbefore described, and terminating at the northern boundary of St. Andrew's Roman Catholic Church.

Tramway No. 1b.—A double line 1·65 chains in length, situate wholly in the parish of St. Andrew, and commencing by a junction with the existing tramway in Pilgrim-street, at a point about 1 chain north-east from Market-street, and passing in a south-easterly direction into and terminating in the new street aforesaid by a junction with Tramway No. 1, hereinbefore described, at a point therein about 1 chain north-eastward of Pilgrim-street.

Tramway No. 2.—A double line 2 furlongs 6·60 chains in length, commencing in the parish of Jesmond, at the termination of the existing tramway in Osborne-road, passing thence along that road into and terminating in the parish of St. Andrew, at the northern end of the said Osborne-road.

A tramroad.—5 furlongs 9·27 chains in length, situate wholly in the parish of Fenham, commencing at the termination of tramway No. 5, authorized by the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Corporation Act, 1904, and terminating at a point on the eastern side of Two Ball-lane, about 30½ chains, measured along that lane in a north-easterly direction from Westgate-road.

Tramway No. 2.—In Osborne-road, on the east side thereof, from the termination of the said tramway to a point about 8·50 chains southward thereof.

In Osborne-road, on the south-west side thereof, from a point about 7·60 chains south of the termination of the said tramway, to Lyndhurst-avenue.

Where in the description of any of the proposed tramways any distance is given with reference to the intersection or junction of two streets or roads the distance is to be taken as measured from the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets or roads and continued would intersect each other, and a point described as being opposite a street is to be taken (unless otherwise stated) as opposite the centre of the street.

The motive power intended to be used on the proposed tramways is animal and mechanical (including electrical) power.

or single for double lines, and interlacing lines for either, and single or double lines for interlacing lines, and to abandon any portion of any tramway, whether constructed or authorized, which may be rendered unnecessary by the construction of any tramway to be authorized by the intended Act.

To constitute the proposed tramways part of the Tramway Undertaking of the Corporation and to make applicable thereto all or any of the provisions of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Tramways and Improvement Act, 1877; the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Improvement Act, 1882; the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Improvement Act, 1892; the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Tramways and Improvement Act, 1899; the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Corporation Tramways Extensions Act, 1902; the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Corporation Tramways Order, 1903; and the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Corporation Act, 1904; subject to such amendments as may be contained in the Bill or sanctioned by Parliament.

To repeal the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Corporation Tramways Order, 1906, and to provide for the abandonment of the tramways thereby authorized.

To empower the Corporation to lay down, construct and maintain on, in, under or over the surface of any street or place and to attach to any house and building such posts, brackets, rosettes, conductors, wires, tubes, mains, plates, cables, ropes and apparatus, and to make and maintain such openings and ways in, on or under any such surface as may be necessary or convenient for the working of the proposed tramways or for providing access to or forming connections with the Corporation Tramways or with any generating station or stations, engines, machinery or apparatus. The Bill will or may make provision for an appeal to a petty sessional court against a refusal by an owner, lessee or occupier of consent to any attachment to a house or building and for the allowance of such attachment by the petty sessional court.

To empower the Corporation when altering or widening any road in which a tramway is laid to reconstruct such tramway in such position as they think fit.

To enable the Corporation, for constructing or reconstructing or altering any tramway, to increase the width of the roadway by reducing the width of any footpath.

To authorize the Corporation for the purposes of constructing any tramway in any street to take up, remove or dispose of or, if thought fit, to appropriate and use in the construction of that tramway any existing tramway in such street.

The Newcastle-upon-Tyne Improvement Acts passed in the years 1837, 1841, 1846, 1850, 1853, 1855, 1865, 1870, 1871, 1882, and 1892; The Newcastle-upon-Tyne Tramways and Improvement Act, 1877; The Newcastle-upon-Tyne Corporation Loans Act, 1882; The Newcastle-upon-Tyne Corporation (New Infirmary Site) Act, 1898; The Newcastle-upon-Tyne Tramways Order, 1879; The Newcastle-upon-Tyne Provisional Order, 1887; The Newcastle-upon-Tyne (Byker Bridge, &c.) (Construction of Tramways; Gauge; Motive Power; Power to Corporation to Work Tramways and Levy Tolls, Rates and Charges; the Borrowing of Money; Alteration, Amendment, Incorporation and Extension of Acts; and other matters.)

(Unification of the Administration of Acts Relating to Burials in Borough and Parishes of Fulwell and Bishopwearmouth Without; Transfer of Cemeteries, Properties, and Obligations to Corporation; Payment of Expenses by Borough and said Parishes; Joint Committee; Exclusion or Amendment of Burial Acts and Partial Application of the Public Health (Interments) Act, 1879; Further Provisions as to Electricity, Streets, Sanitary matters, Common lodging-houses, Advertisements, Police and Financial Matters; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts, and other matters.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Sunderland (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation" and "the Borough" respectively) for an Act for all or some of the following objects and purposes (that is to say):—

1. To make provision for transferring to, vesting in, and attaching to the Corporation the cemeteries and the properties, rights, powers, duties, obligations and liabilities, which are now vested in or attach to either the Corporation solely on behalf of part of the borough or the Corporation jointly with the Parish Council for the parish of Fulwell or the Corporation jointly with the parish meeting for the parish of Bishopwearmouth Without for the purposes of the Burial Acts or otherwise for the purposes of or connected with the interment of the dead and to make provision for the exercise by the Corporation of the powers and the performance by them of the duties for the purposes aforesaid on behalf of the borough and the said parishes.

2. To confer equal rights upon the inhabitants of the borough and of the parishes hereinbefore mentioned with reference to the burial of the dead in the cemeteries vested in the Corporation as aforesaid or hereafter provided by them.

3. To make provision for the payment of the expenses incurred (including the interest upon and sums required for repayment of all loans raised by or transferred to the Corporation for the purposes aforesaid) and the application of the revenue received in connection with the matters or for the purposes aforesaid, and to provide for the payment of such expenses by the borough and by the said parishes in such proportions as shall be indicated in or ascertained in manner provided by the intended Act and for the division of such revenue in the like proportions.

4. To provide for the exercise of the powers and the performance of the duties of the Corporation in regard to the matters aforesaid (with such exceptions as may be indicated in the intended Act) by a joint committee, consisting of representatives of the Council of the borough and of the said parish council and parish meeting and to make provision for the constitution and appointment of such committee and the regulation of their affairs and to empower the Corporation to delegate to them all or any of their powers and duties in regard to the matters aforesaid.

5. To authorize burials in the existing cemeteries vested in or transferred to the Corporation although situate within one hundred yards of dwelling-houses, and if deemed expedient to

provide that such cemeteries shall be vested in the Corporation and held by them under the powers and for the purposes of the Public Health (Interments) Act, 1879, and the enactments incorporated therewith (except the provisions of section 10 of the Cemeteries Clauses Act, 1847, and except that the expenses so far as the same are to be defrayed by the borough may continue to be charged on the borough fund, and with such other exceptions and modifications as may be indicated in the intended Act) and that the Burial Acts shall cease to apply thereto or to the Corporation. The burial grounds hereinbefore referred to are as follows:—

(i) The burial ground originally established for the parish of Sunderland-near-the-Sea in the county of Durham and known as "The Sunderland Cemetery," situate adjoining to and abutting upon the road called "Ryhope-road" leading from the said borough to Ryhope in the said county;

(ii) The burial ground originally established for the parish or township of Bishopwearmouth in the said county and known as "The Bishopwearmouth Cemetery" situate, adjoining to and abutting upon and between the road called "Hylton-road" leading from the said borough to South Hylton and the road called "Chester-road," leading from the said borough to Chester-le-Street, all in the said county;

(iii) The burial ground originally established for the parishes or townships of Monkwearmouth Shore, Monkwearmouth and Fulwell in the said county and known as "the Monkwearmouth Cemetery" or "the Mere Knolls Cemetery," situate in the said parish or township of Fulwell.

6. To make, further and better provision with regard to the electricity undertaking of the Corporation with respect, among other things, to the following matters:—The charges to be made for a supply of electrical energy to premises having a separate supply, power for the Corporation to supply electric motors, lamps, meters, lines and other fittings, and to exempt the same when let for hire from distress, and from being taken in execution or bankruptcy proceedings, and the alteration of the date for filling up all annual accounts.

7. To make further and better provision in regard to the streets and buildings within the borough with respect, amongst others, to the following matters:—The regulation of the construction of crossings over footways, for horses and vehicles, and the prevention of horses and vehicles crossing footways, the lopping of trees and shrubs overhanging streets, the prohibition of the construction of bridges over streets without a licence from the Corporation, and power for the Corporation to grant such licences, and to regulate the construction and maintenance of such bridges, to prohibit or regulate the breaking up of streets, and to provide for the making good thereof, and the prohibition or regulation of projections over streets.

8. To make further provision with reference to advertising and other hoardings in or near to the streets of the borough.

9. To make further and better provision for the prevention of infectious disease in the borough, and in regard to sanitary matters with respect, amongst others, to the following:—Preventing the exposure of infected persons, persons suffering from infectious disease not to carry on business,

&c., dairymen within and without the borough to notify cases of infectious disease existing amongst their servants, children who are or have been suffering from infectious disease not to attend school, principal of school to furnish lists of scholars to medical officer when required, protection against infection of books taken from or returned to public libraries, further powers to enable the Corporation to remove persons from infected premises, owner or driver of hackney carriage in which infected person is carried to give notice thereof, as to information to be given to medical officer by occupiers of infected buildings, prohibition of holding wake over body of person dying of infectious disease, the regulation of the manufacture and sale of ice-cream and similar commodities, and the inspection of premises of ice-cream dealers.

10. To empower the medical officer of health or other authorized person to enter dairies, byres and cowsheds within the borough or beyond the borough if milk produced therein or supplied therefrom is believed to be sent to the borough, and to examine the cows, to take samples and to require the owners or occupiers of such dairies, byres and cowsheds to render all reasonable assistance, and to prohibit the selling of milk of cows affected with tuberculosis or any disease which might render the use of such milk dangerous or injurious to health, and to provide for the giving of notice to the Corporation in cases of tuberculosis or other disease as aforesaid, and to make other provision in regard to the supply of milk to the borough.

11. To make provision in regard to the annual registration of common lodging-houses and their keepers, with power for the Corporation to refuse registration, penalties on failure to register, to require the keepers of common lodging-houses or their approved deputies to reside constantly therein, to require the provision of adequate sanitary conveniences, power for the Corporation to remove therefrom persons suffering from infectious disease or to prohibit the admission of lodgers thereto and to destroy clothing and bedding therein for preventing spread of disease, and in other respects to make further and better provision in regard to the common lodging-houses in the borough.

12. To provide for immediate notice to be given to the medical officer of the birth of any child within the borough, and for the payment of fees to the persons giving such notice, and to extend or make applicable to such notification the provisions of all or any of the general Acts relating to the registration of births and deaths in England.

13. To make further and better provision in regard to police matters in the borough and (amongst other things) to provide that the foreshore and the lands adjoining shall be deemed to be open and public places under the Vagrancy Acts, and shall be deemed streets for the purposes of the Town Police Clauses Acts and other purposes.

14. To empower the Corporation to employ, manage, regulate or contribute to bands of music and other musical performances.

15. To enact all necessary provisions for giving full effect to the purposes of the intended Act or of the general or local Acts in force in the borough, including the making and confirmation of bye-laws, the imposition of penalties for breach of

the provisions of the intended Act or of any bye-laws thereunder or for failure to comply with the terms or conditions of any consent given by the Corporation under any Act or otherwise, the determination of compensation, the recovery, apportionment and application of penalties and expenses, the recovery of demands in a court of summary jurisdiction or the county court, the entry of premises, penalties for obstructing execution of Act, the payment of expenses of carrying the Act into execution, evidence of appointments and resolutions, and the authentication and service of notices.

16. To vary and extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent, interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

17. To authorize the Corporation to borrow money for the purposes of the intended Act, and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the borough fund and borough rate, the district fund and general district rate, or other local rates, and the estates, undertakings, tolls, rates, rents, revenues and other property of the Corporation or any of such securities, and to execute, grant and issue mortgages, stock, debentures and annuities in respect thereof.

18. To make further provision in regard to the borrowing and repayment of money by the Corporation, to empower them to invest all or any of their sinking funds in statutory securities, including securities of local authorities, to use one form of mortgage for all purposes, charging the loans upon all revenues, rates and property of the Corporation, and to give them power to use any sinking fund instead of borrowing, and to make provision for equating the periods for the repayment of loans.

19. To incorporate and apply, with or without modification, or to render inapplicable, all or some of the provisions of the following public Acts;—

The Municipal Corporations Acts; the Public Health Acts; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Burial Acts; the Local Loans Act, 1875; and all Acts amending those Acts respectively.

20. To alter, amend, repeal, re-enact or extend, with or without modification, all or some of the provisions of the following local Acts and Orders or public Acts of a local character:—

The Borough of Sunderland Act, 1851; the Sunderland Corporation Act, 1865; the Sunderland Extension and Improvement Act, 1867; the Borough of Sunderland Act, 1885; the Sunderland Electric Lighting Order, 1891; the Sunderland Corporation Act, 1899; and the Sunderland Corporation Act, 1900; and all other Acts or Orders relating to the Corporation or the borough.

(Incorporation of Company; Construction of Gasworks; Supply of Gas and Residual Products; Purchase of Lands and Way Leave by Compulsion or Agreement; Supply of Fittings; Breaking up Streets, &c.; Rates, Rents and Charges; Supply of Gas in Bulk; Patent Rights; Incorporation, Amendment and Repeal of Acts; and other Purposes.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for an Act to incorporate a Company (hereinafter called "the Company") to make provision in regard to the following matters or some of them (that is to say):—

1. To make provision in regard to the capital and borrowing powers of the Company, the issue of debenture stock and other securities, the fixing of dividends in accordance with the price charged for gas, the payment of dividends yearly or half-yearly, the creation of reserve and insurance funds, and generally to make such provision as may be deemed expedient in regard to the regulation and management of the affairs of the Company.

9. To authorize the Company to construct and maintain and use mains, pipes, culverts, drains and other works, and for that purpose, and for the general purposes of the intended Act, to cross, open, break up, divert, stop up or otherwise interfere with streets (whether dedicated to the public use or not), roads, highways, railways, tramways, footways, lands, sewers, drains, pipes, electric, telegraphic, telephonic, hydraulic or other apparatus, rivers, canals, bridges, navigations, streams, watercourses, passages and other places, and to authorize the Company to lay pipes and other apparatus in and through buildings.

10. To exempt the Company from penalties for the non-supply of gas in certain cases, to authorize them to refuse to supply with gas any person in debt to them; to make provision in regard to the giving of notices by consumers of their intention to discontinue the supply of gas, and in regard to the period for which allowances or surcharges shall be made in the event of meters being found to be defective, and in other respects to make provision in regard to the supply and consumption of gas.

14. To vary or extinguish all or any rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the purposes of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges,

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following, or some of the following, among other, purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorize and provide for the appointment on the grant to the borough of Merthyr Tydfil of a separate Commission of the Peace of the Clerk for the time being to the Justice holding office under the Merthyr Tydfil Stipendiary Justice Acts, 1843 to 1894 (hereinafter referred to as "the Acts of 1843 to 1894") as Clerk to the Justices for the said borough.

2. To define and extend the powers and duties of such clerk, and to fix or empower the Standing Joint Committee of the county of Glamorgan, alone or in conjunction with the

Justices for the borough of Merthyr Tydfil, to fix, define, adjust and alter the amount of the salary to be received by such clerk.

3. To make further provisions as to the fees received by the clerk, and the application and apportionment thereof, the accounts of the clerk and the audit thereof, and in particular to provide for the payment into the stipendiary or county fund instead of into the borough fund of the fees received by such clerk as Clerk to the Justices for the borough of Merthyr Tydfil.

4. To authorize and provide for the appointment of an assistant or deputy to such clerk, and to define the powers and duties, and make provision for defraying the salary and travelling expenses of such assistant or deputy.

5. To make further provisions for collecting and levying the amounts required to meet the said salaries and the expenses of the Acts relating to the Stipendiary Justice, and to provide for the assessment, collection and levying of rates, and for those purposes and for any of the purposes of the Bill, to extend or apply with such modifications as may be necessary or convenient, all or some of the provisions of the Acts of 1843 to 1894.

6. To define and extend the limits within which the Acts of 1843 to 1894 operate, and to extend and alter the area of jurisdiction and the powers and duties of the Justice acting under the said Acts.

7. To include within the said limits in addition to the places comprised therein under the present Acts, the whole or parts of the hamlets of Cefn and Hengoed, or one of them, in the parish of Gelligaer, in the county of Glamorgan, the district of Cefn (being that part of the parish of Vaynor, in the county of Brecknock, which is within the Parliamentary borough of Merthyr Tydfil), and such other districts, parishes and places (whether within or without the said county), as may be named in the Bill.

8. To provide for the future extension and alteration of the said limits by the addition thereto of such parishes, townships, districts and places in the counties of Glamorgan, Monmouth and Brecknock, or any of them adjoining or near to the said limits as for the time being constituted as His Majesty, on the application of the Standing Joint Committee of the county of Glamorgan, or of any local authority, or of the ratepayers in such parishes, townships, districts or places, or any of them or otherwise as may be provided by the Bill, may, by Order in Council, from time to time direct, and to apply to the parishes, townships, districts and places so to be added all or some of the powers and provisions of the Acts of 1843 to 1894, and of the Bill, and by the reduction in the same manner, by Order in Council of such limits so as to exclude the borough of Merthyr Tydfil, or any other part of the limits as may be provided by the Bill, and such Order in Council or the Bill may authorize the making of all necessary and proper provisions and regulations as to the taking of fees within any part of the limits over which the Stipendiary Justice may for the time being have jurisdiction, or otherwise, with reference to any of the matters aforesaid.

9. To authorize and empower the County Council or the Standing Joint Committee of the county of Glamorgan, on the one hand, and

the Council of the borough of Merthyr Tydfil, on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect an agreement, or agreements, upon such terms and conditions, and for such consideration as may have been or may be agreed upon, for the exchange of lands belonging to them respectively within the borough of Merthyr Tydfil, for the purpose of the erection of a court house, and to authorize the appropriation and user of such lands for that purpose, or such other purposes as may be agreed upon or as may be defined by the Bill, and in particular to sanction the exchange, appropriation and user for purposes other than those for which the lands were acquired, of certain lands acquired by the Council of the borough, or their predecessors, the local Board of Health, under the powers of the Merthyr Tydfil Water Act, 1865, for the erection of a town hall or other public purposes, and certain other lands adjoining or near the police station, Merthyr Tydfil, of which the Glamorgan County Council are the lessees, and so far as may be necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect any such agreement or agreements, and exchange appropriation and user to alter, amend, extend or repeal the provisions of the last mentioned Act, and of any other Act or Acts relating to the borough of Merthyr Tydfil, and the Bill will or may confirm any agreement which may have been entered into touching any of the matters aforesaid.

10. To alter, amend, extend and enlarge, and to incorporate, so far as may be necessary or desirable for carrying into effect the objects and purposes of the Bill, all or some of the powers and provisions of the Merthyr Tydfil Stipendiary Justice Acts, 1843 to 1894; the Stipendiary Magistrates Act, 1863; the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; the Local Government Act, 1888; and any other Act or Acts (public or private) relating to the County Council of Glamorgan, the borough of Merthyr Tydfil, or to any of the matters aforesaid.
