# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(Dated 28th November 1906.)

SOUTHAMPTON AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Restrictions in Scheduled Area.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall in their application to the Infected Area described in the Schedule hereto be modified in manner declared by this Order.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition

of swine in the Infected Area if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.

- (2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.
- (8.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.
- (5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- (6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

- 3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a high-way or thoroughfare in an Infected Area if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in an Infected Area, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a deeme Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) 1894.

- Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in an Infected Area, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.
- (2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in an Infected Area, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

### Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

# Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other

officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

### Interpretation. .

- 10. In this Order
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Infected Area" means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of December, nineteen hundred and six.

#### Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the South-AMPTON AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

No. 1365.—FRANCE, WEST COAST—LOIRE RIVER ENTRANCE.

La Lambarde—Buoy Replaced by Light-Buoy.

The French Government has given notice, dated 6th November, 1906, that the black spindle buoy marking La Lambarde Shoal in the entrance to Loire River has been replaced by a Lightbuoy, painted black, exhibiting a red fixed light.

Approximate position, lat. 47° 10′ N., long 2° 20¾′ W.

### No. 1366.—CHINA SEA—NATUNA ISLANDS.

Devonport Reef—Position of.

Montrado (Menterado) Breakers—Non-existence of.

The Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 12th November, 1906, that a search has been made for Devonport Reef in approximately lat. 3°  $54\frac{1}{2}$ ′ N., long. 108°  $31\frac{1}{2}$ ′ E., without any indication of its existence being discovered.

It is thought probable that the ship Devonport was lost on the easternmost of the Penungul Reefs, on which a depth of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms has been recently found to exist in approximately lat. 3°  $52\frac{3}{8}$  N., long.  $108^{\circ}$  29′ E. From this position the bearing of Kamodi Island (S.W. by W.) is the same as that given to fix the position of the Devonport, and if the second bearing (N.W.) given by the Devonport be applied to the summit of Cape Senubing instead of Senua Island, for which it may have been mistaken, it would place the vessel on the easternmost of the Penungul Reefs, as already described.

The name of Devonport Reef has therefore been transferred to the Eastern Penungul Reef, the former Devonport Reef being expunged.

Also, that a search for Montrado or Menterado breakers has also been made, but that no indication of its existence could be found, depths of from 40 to 50 fathoms being found over the position assigned to it. It has therefore been expunged from the charts.
