SOUTHAMPTON AND DISTRICT (SWINE-
FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Restrictions in Scheduled Area.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall in their application to the Infected Area described in the Schedule hereto be modified in manner declared by this Order.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition
