ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH DECEMBER 1906.)

WILTSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Part 1.

Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall apply to the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled Area.

Provision as to Local Regulations.

2. The powers of the Local Authorities of the Districts comprised in the Scheduled Area to make regulations under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894, as to movement, exposure, or sale of swine, shall be suspended during the operation of this Order, and all such regulations in force at the commencement of this Order shall thereupon cease to operate.

PART II.

Restriction on movement of Swine within Scheduled
Area

3.—(1.) Swine shall not be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Scheduled Area unless they are accompanied by the licence required by this Article.
