The KING has been pleased to ordain that the Imperial Service Order shall rank next to, and immediately after, the Distinguished Service Order.

The Royal Warrant signifying His Majesty's pleasure in this behalf is dated the 29th November, 1906, and is to the following effect:—

EDWARD, R. & I.

EDWARD THE SEVENTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting!

Whereas We, by a Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, countersigned by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and bearing date at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, the eighth day of August, in the year of Our Lord nineteen hundred and two, and the second year of Our Reign, did institute and create a new Civil Order of Distinction to be styled and designated the Imperial Service Order:

Now, therefore, We do, by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, ordain and appoint that the Imperial Service Order shall rank next to, and immediately after, Our Distinguished Service Order, and before the Fifth Class of Our Royal Victorian Order, and the Companions thereof shall, in all places and assemblies whatsoever, have place and precedency next to, and immediately after, the Companions of the Distinguished Service Order, and shall rank among themselves according to the dates of their respective nominations.

Given at Our Court at Sandringham, this twenty-ninth day of November, in the sixth year of Our Reign and in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and six.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-second day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight have prepared and now humbly lay before. Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the bishoprick of Durham and now vested in us.

"Whereas under an Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four and by virtue of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council made under the provisions of the same Act and bearing date the eighteenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty and duly published in the London Gazette on the thirteenth day of the following month certain lands and hereditaments then belonging to the said bishoprick being the lands and hereditaments comprised in the schedule marked A annexed to the scheme ratified by the said Order became and are now vested in us in fee simple for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us,

"And whereas the whole of the said lands and hereditaments are now in our possession but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the said lands and hereditaments or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act all or any of the said lands and hereditaments with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and enquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale or sales from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent charges tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Durham.

Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the eighth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, and of the new parish of Saint Mark, Dukinfield, both in the county of Chester, and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the second day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and published in the London Gazette on the tenth day of the same month, a chapelry district was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Dukinfield, in the parish of Stockport, in the said county and diocese, and such chapelry district was named 'The Chapelry District of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the thirtieth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six and published in the London Gazette on the thirteenth day of the following month, a part of the said parish of Stockport was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and such district was named 'The District of Saint Mark, Dukinfield.'

"And whereas the said chapelry district of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, and the said district of Saint Mark, Dukinfield, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, and of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Dukinfield, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis John, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without auy assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, and of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Dukinfield, shall be altered so that all that portion of

the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Dukinfield.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, in the county of Chester, and in the diocese of Chester, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Mark, Dukinfield, in the same county and diocese, being:—

" All that portion of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, which is bounded upon the north-east by the parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, upon the west by the said new parish of Saint Mark, Dukinfield, upon the south by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Luke, Dukinfield, in the said county of Chester and in the said diocese of Chester, and upon the remaining side, that is to say upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Luke, Dukinfield, from the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, at a point in the middle of the eastern end of Cemetery-road at the entrance to the Dukinfield cemetery, and extending thence north-westward to and along the wall forming the western boundary of the Dukinfield cemetery for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of Park-road, and continuing thence north-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line (thereby crossing Park-road and the River Tame) for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a point on the northern bank of the said river upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, from the said parish of Ashton-under-Lyne.

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the lncumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint James, situate at Aston juxta Birmingham, in the parish of Aston juxta Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Birmingham.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint James, situate at Aston juxta Birmingham as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Birmingham (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Aston juxta Birmingham which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint James, situate at Aston juxta Birmingham as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint James, Aston juxta Birmingham.'

"And with the like consent of the said Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Birmingham (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint James, situate at Aston juxta Birmingham as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration

and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint James,

Aston juxta Birmingham, being:-

"All that part of the parish of Aston juxta Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Birmingham, which is bounded upon the south by the new parish of Saint Mary, Aston Brook, upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Paul, Lozells, both in the said county and diocese, upon the north-west by the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Birchfield, in the county of Stafford and in the said diocese of Birmingham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Birchfield, from the said parish of Aston juxta Birmingham crosses the middle of Trinity-road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Trinity-road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the houses and premises on the eastern side of Bevington-road, and extending thence south-eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of twenty-four chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the boundary between the house and premises known as number 245, Bevington-road, and the houses and premises on the northern side of Frederickroad, and extending thence westward along the last-mentioned boundary wall or fence for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its western end on the eastern side of Bevington-road, and extending thence first westward to and then south-eastward along the middle of Bevington-road (thereby crossing Frederick-road) for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Albert-road and Upper Sutton-street, and extending thence southward along the middle of Upper Sutton-street for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Park-lane, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Aston juxta Birmingham from the said new parish of Saint Mary, Aston Brook."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Birmingham.

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said

churchyard be postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials in the parish church-yard of Saint Peter's, Bromyard, in the county of Hereford, be postponed to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

THEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued vholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should

be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the church-wardens of the parish of Amersham, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, have made a representation stating that they are of opinion that so much of the Order in Council of the twenty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, as varied by the Order in Council of the thirteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, as relates to burials in the Parish Church and churchyard of Amersham, in the county of Buckingham, should be further varied, as herein-after set forth:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the twenty-second day of October last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-seventh day of November, one thousand nine hundred and six, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said first recited Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the Order in Council of the twenty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, as varied by the Order in Council of the thirteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, as relates to burials in the Parish Church and churchyard of Amersham, in the county of Buckingham, be further varied, so as to provide as follows viz:

AMERSHAM.—(a) That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the catacombs in the North Transept of the said Parish Church of Amersham; and (b) that notwithstanding anything in the said Orders in Council, it shall be lawful to re-inter in the portion of the said churchyard of Amersham which has never previously been used for burials, and which is situate on the north side of the said church, at or below the depth of five feet below the surface of the ground, certain human remains which have been or are about to be removed from the catacombs in the North Transept of the said church.
