The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Oriel College, Oxford, on the eleventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and six (and sealed on the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and six), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":-

A STATUTE to amend a Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict. c. 48), and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the Provost and Fellows, specially summoned for this purpose, held on Thursday, the eleventh day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and six, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas by Statute VI, 5, of the Statutes made by the University of Oxford Commissioners, under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and approved by Her Majesty

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 21st | Queen Victoria in Council, on the third day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, it was enacted as follows:-

"5. Every Tutorial Fellow who shall marry before the expiration of seven years from the day of his first becoming a Tutor shall thereupon vacate his Tutorship. Every unmarried Tutorial Fellow shall reside in rooms in the College during the usual College Terms, unless the Provost and Fellows, at a stated General Meeting, shall have given him leave to reside elsewhere; and there shall always be at least two unmarried Fellows, being Tutors or Lecturers of the College, resident in rooms within the College during the usual College Terms. So long as that number is complete, a Tutorial Fellow, vacating his Tutorship by marriage, may be reappointed thereto by the Provost and Fellows, if they shall desire to retain his services as a Tutor."

And whereas the Provost and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statute in manner hereinafter appearing, We, the said Provost and Fellows of the said College, do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act, alter the fifth clause of Statute VI of the said Statutes by substituting for the words "at least two unmarried Fellows, being Tutors or Lecturers of the College," the words "at least two Tutors or Lecturers, being Fellows of the College."

Ex parte the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend Statute III framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, c. 48), in relation to the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford, duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Master and Fellows, being the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for this purpose, and holden on the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six, and passed by the unanimous vote of those present and voting, and submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

Whereas Statute III, clause 11, of the Statutes of the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford, provides a means whereby the Master and Fellows may elect as Fellow any person eminently qualified for the office of Prælector or Tutor, whose services the College needs, and who is willing to serve the College in either capacity without examination, and without regard to divers restrictions enumerated in the first paragraph of the said clause.

And whereas the said clause provides that there shall not be in the said College at any one time more than five Fellows elected under the said clause, in respect of the office of Prælector, Tutor, or Bursar.

And whereas the office of Bursar is not an Educational office, and the number of four or of five Prælectors and Tutors is and has been found to be inadequate to the growing Educational needs of the College.

And whereas the only other means provided by the existing Statutes for obtaining the services of Fellows for the Educational needs of the College is by the exaction of such services for two years from Fellows to be elected after open competitive Examination (see Statute III, clause 4), and this method has been found inadequate and unsatisfactory, and is indeed open to obvious and grave objections.

Now, therefore, we, the Master and Fellows of the said College, desiring to enlarge the powers of the College so as to enable it to obtain, in sufficient number, the services of men eminently qualified for the office of Prælector or Tutor, do hereby, in virtue of the powers conferred on us by Section 54 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, c. 48), and by Statute XI of the Statutes of the College, in relation to the alteration of Statutes, alter and amend Statute III, clause 11, of the said Statutes, by substituting for the word "five" in the last paragraph of the said clause (page 14, line 6, ed. 1902), the word "eight."

> MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Regulations under Section 9 (1). BOROUGH OF GUILDFORD.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Guildford;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Guildford having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the abovementioned sub-section putting the provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads and parts of roads situate within the Borough of Guildford (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough"), We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads and parts of roads within the Borough which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of January, one

thousand nine hundred and seven.
