on the southern side of South-street, and extending thence northward to the junction of Southstreet with East-street, and from such junction in the same direction along the middle of East-street for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Wellingboroughroad, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Wellingborough-road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Stimpson-avenue, and extending thence northward along the middle of Stimpsonavenue (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Edmund, Northampton, from the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Northampton), for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Adnitt-road and Stimpson-street, and extending thence northward along the middle of Stimpson-street for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Abington-avenue, and extending thence north - eastward along the middle of Abington-avenue for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Abington-grove, and continuing thence in precisely the same direction and in a straight line to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Northampton, from the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Northampton, at the point where the north-eastern side of Abington-grove meets the northern side of Abington-avenue, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Peterborough.
