

to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board require.

ARTICLE 3. If the Guardians depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and within fifteen days after the said departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board approve of that departure, then the relief granted in the particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

ARTICLE 4. If at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief is so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour unnecessary, the Guardians, notwithstanding anything in the said General Order dated the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, may dispense with the services of that officer.
