PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also

that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of All Saints, Fonthill Bishop, in the county of Wilts; of the parish of Saint Mary, Strensall, in the North Riding of Yorkshire; of the parish of Saint Mary, West Bergholt, in the county of Essex; of the parish of Saint John, Longsight, in the city of Manchester; and of the parish of Saint Aelhaiarn, Guilsfield, in the borough of Welshpool, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representations, made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial grounds should be opened in the civil parishes of Fonthill Bishop, Strensall, and West Bergholt, or in the city of Manchester, or in the borough of Welshpool, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parishes as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the twenty-second day of October last, to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the said civil parishes or in the city of Manchester or in the borough of Welshpool without the previous approval of the

Local Government Board, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued as follows, viz. :—

FONTHILL BISHOP.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of All Saints, Fonthill Bishop, in the county of Wilts; and in the old churchyard, except as follows :—

In the earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard in which a member of the Sheldon family has been interred the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any other member of the said family.

STRENSALL.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint Mary, Strensall, in the North Riding of Yorkshire; and in the churchyard as it existed on the twenty-sixth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and six, except as follows :—

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave.

WEST BERGHOLT.—Forthwith and entirely in the old parish church of Saint Mary, West Bergholt, in the county of Essex; and in the old churchyard, except as follows :—

(a.) In the vault now existing in the said churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to Miss Sims the burial of the body of the said Miss Sims may be allowed at her decease, subject to the condition that the coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In earthen graves now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the bodies of the following persons at their decease, viz., George Thomas Green Wright, Mary Adelaide Wright, Gustavus Gurney Wright, Indiana Wright, Agnes Green, Gertrude Mary Wythe, Mary Ann Proctor, Sarah Jane Sparkes, Henry Lambert, and William Raven.

(c.) In two grave spaces in the said churchyard in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burials may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the bodies of Thomas Brett Daniell and Sarah Ann Daniell at their decease.

CITY OF MANCHESTER.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint John, Long-sight, in the city of Manchester, and in the churchyard.

GUILDFIELD.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint Aelhaiarn, Guilfield, in the borough of Welshpool; and in the churchyard, except as follows :—

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body

of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave.

(c.) In the said churchyard, in any grave space which is distant not less than five feet from the boundary of the said churchyard and in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place with the exclusive right of burial therein.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Clerkships in the Second Division of the Civil Service.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. Open Competitive Examinations of Candidates for Clerkships in the Second Division of the Civil Service will be held from time to time at such places as may be deemed expedient.

2. These examinations are open, under such general restrictions as may be laid down, to all natural-born or naturalized British subjects, being of the prescribed age and of good health and character. The undermentioned special conditions are at present in force:—

(i.) The following classes of persons are ineligible to compete, viz.:—

Persons actually serving in the Army and Navy.

(ii.) The following classes of persons will not be eligible unless they obtain the permission of the authorities of their department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition, viz.:—(a) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, (b) Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.

(iii.) Persons who have been trained in Training Colleges at the public expense will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

(iv.) In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(1) Persons who have served in the Army or Navy may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served; (2) Members of the Militia, the Imperial Yeomanry, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers (whether commissioned or non-commissioned), may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they received Army pay; (3) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years, (a) in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners; or (b) as Registered Boy Clerks or Registered Boy Copyists in connection with the Civil Service, may, if their service commenced before the 20th April, 1900, deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service; if their service did not commence before the 20th April, 1900, they may deduct only two years.

3. The limits of age are 17 and 20. If an examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of March in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year.

4. The subjects of Examination will be as follows :—

1. Handwriting and Orthography, including Copying Manuscript.
2. Arithmetic.
3. English Composition.
4. Précis, including Indexing and Digest of Returns.
5. Book Keeping and Shorthand Writing.
6. Geography and English History.
7. Latin (translation from the language, and composition)
8. French (Ditto)
9. German (Ditto)
10. Elementary Mathematics.
11. Inorganic Chemistry, with Elements of Physics.

Only two of these languages may be taken up.

N.B.—Not more than four of the subjects numbered 4 to 11 may be offered.

5. Service marks for each full period of three calendar months of actual approved service, subject to a maximum of twelve of such periods, may be allowed to Candidates attending an Examination who are serving or have served as Registered Boy Clerks or Boy Copyists.

6. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

7. A fee of £2 will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that on the 18th March, 1907, and following days, an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Bedford, Birmingham, Bristol, Leeds, Liverpool, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Plymouth, Southampton, Aberdeen, Glasgow, Belfast, and Cork, under the foregoing Regulations, at which Examination not fewer than 70 Candidates will be selected for Clerkships in the Second Division

of the Civil Service, provided they satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 21st February, an application, in the handwriting of the Candidate, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

SHROPSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894

to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the SHROPSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1907.
