Local Government Board, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued as follows, viz. :--

FONTHILL BISHOP.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of All Saints, Fonthill Bishop, in the county of Wilts; and in the old churchyard, except as follows :—

In the earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard in which a member of the Sheldon family has been interred the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any other member of the said family.

STRENSALL.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint Mary, Strensall, in the North Riding of Yorkshire; and in the churchyard as it existed on the twentysixth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and six, except as follows :—

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave.

WEST BERGHOLT.—Forthwith and entirely in the old parish church of Saint Mary, West Bergholt, in the county of Essex; and in the old churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In the vault now existing in the said churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to Miss Sims the burial of the body of the said Miss Sims may be allowed at her decease, subject to the condition that the coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In earthen graves now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the bodies of the following persons at their decease, viz., George Thomas Green Wright, Mary Adelaide Wright, Gustavus Gurney Wright, Indiana Wright, Agnes Green, Gertrude Mary Wythe, Mary Ann Proctor, Sarah Jane Sparkes, Henry Lambert, and William Raven.

(c.) In two grave spaces in the said churchyard in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burials may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the bodies of Thomas Brett Daniell and Sarah Ann Daniell at their decease.

CITY OF MANCHESTER.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint John, Longsight, in the city of Manchester, and in the churchyard.

GUILSFIELD.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint Aelhaiarn, Guilsfield, in the borough of Welshpool; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave.

(c.) In the said churchyard, in any grave space which is distant not less that five feet from the boundary of the said churchyard and in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place with the exclusive right of burial therein.
