between this country and any Naval Power, an Examination Service may come into force at the ports or localites in the United Kingdom, and His Majesty's Possessions Abroad, mentioned at the end of this notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination Officer.

The institution of an Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with Foreign Powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night; to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination Steamer, and to be ready to "bring-to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

If an entrance to a port is closed three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

If the Examination Service is in force the Examination Steamer will be distinguished at

- (a) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.
- (b) When the port is open, by three white vertical lights.

The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.
