Notice is hereby given that His Majesty The King will hold Levées at St. James's Palace on Thursday, the 14th February, and on Tuesday, the 19th February, at 12 o'clock noon, and that for these and all future Levées Cards of Admission will be required, as the numbers at each of these Ceremonies must be limited.

The following are the rules to be observed:—

ATTENDANCES AND PRESENTATIONS.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

Deputy Lieutenants of Counties and all Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall; but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace.

All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, who will apply to the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall, for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Inspector-General. The application must in all cases be supported by a credential from the Governor or Officer commanding the local Forces of the Colony.

Recorders, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all Gentlemen connected with the Home Office, are requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Home Secretary.

Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, are requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

Similarly, all Gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office, Civil Staff of the War Office, or any Government Department, will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation at Levées from the Department under which they serve.

Peers, Bishops, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all Gentlemen other than the above mentioned, will be good enough to communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace, when they will each be furnished with a card of admission for use at the Levée.

The names, both for attendance and presentation, must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than eight days prior to the date of each Levée.

The KING was pleased, this day, at Buckingham Palace, to present to Captain Robert Walter Edmund Knollys, of the Indian Army, Assistant Political Agent at Obital, the Albert Medal of the Second Class, conferred upon him, by His Majesty's command, for gallantry in saving life as detailed below:—

On the 19th December, 1905, Captain Knollys, who was returning from Peshawar, left Dir in order to cross the Lowarai Pass, with him being the Native Assistant, Chitral, a Government Clerk, Captain Knollys' Chitrali Orderly (Hasil), and two or three servants, also a few villagers and Dir Levies.

Having reached a point beyond Mirga, the snow was found to be too deep to allow of the Pass being crossed that day, and it was decided to stop at Gujar Levy Post, about five miles from the top of the Pass.

The snow was about six or seven feet deep, and was still falling. About half a mile from Gujar Post, the last four of the party, including Captain Knollys and the Subedar Major of the Dir Levies, were suddenly caught and buried by an avalanche, which fell from a hill on their right. Captain Knollys' Chitrali orderly (Hasil) and a villager of Dir, named Muhammad Ali, who were in front, immediately rushed back, and

succeeded in pulling Captain Knollys out, who with their help, at once set to work to find the other three men, who were completely buried.

After about half an hour's hard work in several directions, the three men were found and extricated from the snow, one in an unconscious condition, the others conscious but very exhausted. During this half hour the three rescuers were in imminent peril of their lives, as the spot is notorious for the frequency of the avalanches which fall upon it, and it is moreover well known that when one avalanche has fallen at this place it is almost invariably followed in a very short time by a second. In remaining in the danger zone during the whole of this time, removing the snow with their hands only, and eventually rescuing all the three buried men, Captain Knollys and his two companions undoubtedly showed conspicuous courage and self-devotion.

On the day before this occurrence a succession of avalanches had fallen at another point in the same Pass, and overwhelmed a number of men who were bringing over ponies, 22 men and 11 ponies being killed; and during the 18 months preceding the end of December, 1905, there had been four avalanche accidents on the Lowarai Pass, involving a total loss of 36 lives and 15 ponies.

Muhammad Ali of Dir and Hasil of Chitral are also to be decorated with the Albert Medal of the Second Class for their gallantry. The Medals will be presented in due course.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the Situation of Draughtsman in His Majesty's Patent Office. (Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870.)

I. The limits of age for this situation are 22 and 30, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

II. Candidates will be required to show what preliminary training or technical education they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature. They must, within the five years immediately preceding the first day of the Examination, have been engaged in a Drawing Office for at least three years, and must show that they have profited by that training. Evidence on this point must be sent in at such time as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint. If it prove *prima facie* satisfactory, the Candidate will be admitted to examination, subject to such further inquiry as may be necessary.

III. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:-

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
4. Machine Construction and Drawing.

* * No Candidate will be eligible who fails to show satisfactory proficiency in any of the subjects specified above.

IV. A fee of 10s. will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

V. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH JANUARY 1907.)

CHESHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and

certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the CHESHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1907.

And whereas by an Order dated the 3rd day of August, 1906, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Rowland Metzner Estcourt as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in the said Order was termed "The Warwickshire Audit District";

THE POTTERIES ELECTRIC TRACTION COMPANY Limited.

BYE-LAWS made by the Company in pursuance of the Tramways Act, 1870; the Railway Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; the Potteries Extensions Tramways Order, 1896; the Potteries Light Railways Order, 1897; the Potteries Light Railways Extensions Order, 1902; and the North Staffordshire Tramways Act, 1902; for better enforcing the observance of Regulations for preventing the commission of nuisances and for regulating the travelling in or upon the carriages belonging to the Company.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth are hereby made by the Company for the purposes aforesaid, and shall come into force on and from the first day of February, 1907, and all Bye-laws and Regulations heretofore made by the Company in this behalf are hereby repealed as and from that date.

2. Throughout these Bye-laws and Regulations.

the following words shall have the meanings hereto attached to them, that is to say:—

"Company" means the Potteries Electric Traction Company Limited.

"Tramways" means and includes the North Staffordshire Tramways, the Potteries Extension Tramways, the Potteries Light Railways, and the Potteries Light Railways Extensions (as defined by the before-mentioned Orders), and all other tramways and light railways of the Company for the time being, or any part thereof, respectively.

"Carriage" means any carriage, tramcar, or vehicle of the Company used or worked upon or in connection with the tramways.

"Conductor" means and includes any servant or officer of the Company having the conduct of or assisting in the conducting of any carriage.

"Passenger" means and includes any person who has mounted the footboard of a carriage.

"Person" means and includes any passenger or person other than a servant or officer of the Company.

3. These Bye-laws shall extend and apply to the tramways and light railways and all carriages of the Company for the time being and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations, and a printed copy thereof shall be kept posted in as conspicuous a position as possible inside each carriage in actual use.

4. No person shall commit any nuisance in or upon any carriage or in or against any premises belonging to the Company.

5. No person shall spit or place or deposit remnants of food, fruit, or refuse in or upon any carriage.

6. No person whilst in or upon a carriage shall swear or use offensive, abusive, or obscene language, or play or perform upon any musical or noisy instrument, or gamble or play any game therein, or otherwise conduct himself in a manner which may annoy or interfere with the comfort or convenience of other persons.

7. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette in or upon any part of a carriage not specially provided for smoking purposes.

8. No person in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is, in the opinion of the conductor, unfit to be a passenger, shall enter or attempt to enter a carriage, and any such person found upon a carriage may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

9. No person shall enter or travel in or upon a carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, implement, or substance which, in the opinion of the conductor, may be dangerous or offensive.

10. No person shall, without the express consent of the conductor, distribute advertisements, notices, or tracts, or beg or collect money, alms, or donations in or upon a carriage.

11. No dog or other animal shall be taken or allowed in or upon a carriage, and any dog or other animal taken or found in or upon a carriage shall be immediately removed from the carriage by the person with whom the dog or other animal entered the carriage, and if not so removed by such person may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and in case of danger or difficulty such person may also be removed from the carriage.

12. No luggage shall be placed in or upon any part of a carriage other than the front or driver's platform except by the direction of the conductor.

13. No person shall remove or deface any printed, painted, or other matter in or upon a carriage, or shall wilfully damage any part of a carriage, or interfere with any working part or equipment of a carriage, and no person shall interfere with or wilfully damage any points, post, feeder, wire, or appliance used in connection with the working of the tramways.

14. No person shall in any way wilfully obstruct any person desiring to enter or leave any carriage, or impede or obstruct any servant or officer of the Company in the execution of his duty.

15. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave a carriage whilst it is in motion, and no person other than a passenger shall hold or hang on to any part of a carriage.

16. No person shall enter or leave a carriage otherwise than by the step of the hindmost or conductor's platform, except at a place where a carriage commences or completes a journey, when at such place a person shall enter or leave such carriage at either end, as directed by the conductor. No person shall enter or attempt to enter a carriage until all persons desiring to alight from such carriage have done so.

17. Every passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor the fare payable for his journey, and in any case, whether his fare shall have been demanded or not, shall pay the same before leaving the carriage.

18. Every passenger shall when required so to do by a conductor, inspector, or other authorized servant or officer of the Company produce or deliver up his ticket or pay his fare.

19. No person not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, shall obtain or use or attempt to obtain or use any ticket intended only for an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer.

20. No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket when such ticket is not available, nor shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

21. The passenger tickets issued by the Company shall not be transferable, and except in the case of weekly or transfer tickets shall only be available for the carriage upon which they are issued, and no passenger after leaving a carriage for any purpose whatever shall be entitled to resume his journey without payment of a fresh fare.

22. Any person offending against or committing a breach of these Bye-laws, or any of the Regulations therein contained, may, if travelling in or upon a carriage, be removed therefrom by or under the direction of the conductor, and shall also be liable on prosecution before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and he shall in addition be liable to pay to the Company the amount of any loss or damage he may have occasioned.
