

the following words shall have the meanings hereto attached to them, that is to say:—

"Company" means the Potteries Electric Traction Company Limited.

"Tramways" means and includes the North Staffordshire Tramways, the Potteries Extension Tramways, the Potteries Light Railways, and the Potteries Light Railways Extensions (as defined by the before-mentioned Orders), and all other tramways and light railways of the Company for the time being, or any part thereof, respectively.

"Carriage" means any carriage, tramcar, or vehicle of the Company used or worked upon or in connection with the tramways.

"Conductor" means and includes any servant or officer of the Company having the conduct of or assisting in the conducting of any carriage.

"Passenger" means and includes any person who has mounted the footboard of a carriage.

"Person" means and includes any passenger or person other than a servant or officer of the Company.

3. These Bye-laws shall extend and apply to the tramways and light railways and all carriages of the Company for the time being and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations, and a printed copy thereof shall be kept posted in as conspicuous a position as possible inside each carriage in actual use.

4. No person shall commit any nuisance in or upon any carriage or in or against any premises belonging to the Company.

5. No person shall spit or place or deposit remnants of food, fruit, or refuse in or upon any carriage.

6. No person whilst in or upon a carriage shall swear or use offensive, abusive, or obscene language, or play or perform upon any musical or noisy instrument, or gamble or play any game therein, or otherwise conduct himself in a manner which may annoy or interfere with the comfort or convenience of other persons.

7. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette in or upon any part of a carriage not specially provided for smoking purposes.

8. No person in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is, in the opinion of the conductor, unfit to be a passenger, shall enter or attempt to enter a carriage, and any such person found upon a carriage may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

9. No person shall enter or travel in or upon a carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, implement, or substance which, in the opinion of the conductor, may be dangerous or offensive.

10. No person shall, without the express consent of the conductor, distribute advertisements, notices, or tracts, or beg or collect money, alms, or donations in or upon a carriage.

11. No dog or other animal shall be taken or allowed in or upon a carriage, and any dog or other animal taken or found in or upon a carriage shall be immediately removed from the carriage by the person with whom the dog or other animal entered the carriage, and if not so removed by such person may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and in case of danger or difficulty such person may also be removed from the carriage.

12. No luggage shall be placed in or upon any part of a carriage other than the front or driver's platform except by the direction of the conductor.

13. No person shall remove or deface any printed, painted, or other matter in or upon a carriage, or shall wilfully damage any part of a carriage, or interfere with any working part or equipment of a carriage, and no person shall interfere with or wilfully damage any points, post, feeder, wire, or appliance used in connection with the working of the tramways.

14. No person shall in any way wilfully obstruct any person desiring to enter or leave any carriage, or impede or obstruct any servant or officer of the Company in the execution of his duty.

15. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave a carriage whilst it is in motion, and no person other than a passenger shall hold or hang on to any part of a carriage.

16. No person shall enter or leave a carriage otherwise than by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, except at a place where a carriage commences or completes a journey, when at such place a person shall enter or leave such carriage at either end, as directed by the conductor. No person shall enter or attempt to enter a carriage until all persons desiring to alight from such carriage have done so.

17. Every passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor the fare payable for his journey, and in any case, whether his fare shall have been demanded or not, shall pay the same before leaving the carriage.

18. Every passenger shall when required so to do by a conductor, inspector, or other authorized servant or officer of the Company produce or deliver up his ticket or pay his fare.

19. No person not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, shall obtain or use or attempt to obtain or use any ticket intended only for an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer.

20. No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket when such ticket is not available, nor shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

21. The passenger tickets issued by the Company shall not be transferable, and except in the case of weekly or transfer tickets shall only be available for the carriage upon which they are issued, and no passenger after leaving a carriage for any purpose whatever shall be entitled to resume his journey without payment of a fresh fare.

22. Any person offending against or committing a breach of these Bye-laws, or any of the Regulations therein contained, may, if travelling in or upon a carriage, be removed therefrom by or under the direction of the conductor, and shall also be liable on prosecution before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and he shall in addition be liable to pay to the Company the amount of any loss or damage he may have occasioned.
