The Court being satisfied that the statutory majority of creditors have accepted a Scheme of Arrangement in the following terms:—(1) To pay in full forthwith on the approval by the Court of this Scheme of Arrangement all preferential debts directed by the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, and the Preferential Payments in Bankruptcy Act, 1888, to be paid in priority to other debts, and also all proper fees, percentages, costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the proceedings under the bankruptcy petition, and of and incidental to this arrangement. (2) To pay into Court, through the trustee (Mr. William Nicholson, of 12, Wood-street, London), in pursuance of an Order, dated the 8th day of November, 1906, made by Mr. Justice Neville in an action intituled "In the High Court of Justice, Chancery Division, 1905, T. No. 657, re John Turner, deceased, Johnson v. Burt," the sum of £2,000, as directed by such Order, in discharge of the debtor's liability to the estate of the said John Turner, deceased, including the liability, if any, to pay the costs of the said action. (3) The payment of the aforesaid preferential debts, fees, percentages, costs, charges, and expenses to be secured to the satisfaction of the Official Receiver prior to the application to the Court for approval of the Scheme of Arrangement. (4) To pay in full to all other unsecured creditors all debts provable under the Receiving Order made against the debtor, and being satisfied that the said terms are reasonable and calculated to benefit the general body of creditors, and that the case is not one in which the Court would be required to refuse an Order of Discharge, and that no facts have been proved which would justify the Court in refusing, qualifying, or suspending an Order of Discharge, the said Scheme was approved. Receiving Order discharged, and Order of Adjudication, both dated the 12th day of June, 1906, annulled. The property of the bankrupt to revert to and revest in him, the said Turner Warner Burt, as and from the date of issue of a certificate to be given by the Official Receiver that the terms of the said Scheme have been complied with
