WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the

surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Convention was concluded on the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, between His Majesty and the President of the United States of America, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Convention is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the United States of America, being desirous of enlarging the list of crimes on account of which extradition may be granted under the Conventions concluded between the United States and Great Britain on the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and the thirteenth December, one thousand nine hundred, with a view to the better administration of justice and the prevention of crime in their respective territories and jurisdictions, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention for this purpose and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, to wit:

His Britannic Majesty, the Most Honourable Henry Charles Keith Petty-Fitzmaurice, Marquess of Lansdowne, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

And the President of the United States, the Honourable Joseph Hodges Choate, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States at the Court of His Britannic Majesty;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, which were found

to be in due and proper form, have agreed to and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The following crimes are added to the list of crimes numbered one to ten in the first Article of the said Convention of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and to the list of crimes numbered eleven to thirteen in Article I of the Supplementary Convention concluded between the United States and Great Britain on the thirteenth December, one thousand nine hundred, that is to say:—

14. Bribery, defined to be the offering, giving, or receiving of bribes made criminal by the laws of both countries.

15. Offences, if made criminal by the laws of both countries, against bankruptcy law.

ARTICLE II.

The present Convention shall be considered as an integral part of the said Extradition Conventions of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and the thirteenth December, one thousand nine hundred, and the first Article of the said Convention of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, shall be read as if the lists of crimes therein contained had originally comprised the additional crimes specified and numbered fourteen and fifteen in the first Article of the present Convention.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged either at Washington or London as soon as possible.

It shall come into force ten days after its publication in conformity with the laws of the High Contracting Parties, and it shall continue and terminate in the same manner as the said Convention of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

In testimony whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention in duplicate, and have thereunto affixed their seals.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said Local Government Act, 1888, and of all other powers enabling Him on that behalf, doth declare it, and it is hereby declared, to be necessary for carrying into effect the Local Government Act, 1888, and the County Electors Act, 1888, and the other Acts in force amending or affecting the said Acts, or the Registration of Electors Acts, that the instructions, precepts, notices, and forms under the said Registration of Electors Acts, as set out in the Registration Order, 1895, should be altered in manner appearing in the Schedule to this Order, and so that the instructions, precepts, notices, and forms as so altered should be the instructions, precepts, notices, and forms under the Registration of Electors Acts.

And it is hereby ordered that the former instructions, precepts, notices and forms shall be altered accordingly, and that the instructions, precepts, notices and forms in the schedules to the Registration Order, 1895, as altered in manner appearing in the schedule to this Order, shall be observed and be valid in law.

This Order may be cited as the Registration Order, 1907.

And whereas it is expedient that the High Commissioner for Northern Nigeria should in future be also Commander-in-Chief in and for Northern Nigeria: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Nigeria Order in Council, 1907.

2. The High Commissioner for Northern Nigeria shall henceforth be and be styled High Commissioner and Commander-in-Chief of Northern Nigeria, and section four of the above-recited Order in Council of the twenty-seventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, shall henceforth be read and construed as if the words "and Commander-in-Chief" were inserted therein after the words "High Commissioner."

3. In the said Order in Council and in any Instructions under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, and in any proclamations, laws, rules, and regulations, having effect within Northern Nigeria, references to the High Commissioner shall henceforth be deemed to be references to the High Commissioner and Commander-in-Chief.

4. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Elgin, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
