the harbour of Vera Cruz, in Mexico, free from yellow fever.

The following are declared still infected with yellow fever:—Coatzacoalcas, in Mexico; Panama, in Colombia; Guayaquil, in Ecuador; Payta, Callao, Truxillo, and Lima, in Peru; Porto Cabello, La Guayra, and Caracas, in Venezuela; the Island of Jamaica and St. Louis de Senegal, in Africa.
