**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the two archdeaconries of Chester and Macclesfield, in the diocese of Chester, and to some of the rural deaneries within such archdeaconries.

“Whereas by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and published in the *London Gazette* on the twenty-first day of the same month, the rural deaneries, or some of them, in the said archdeaconries of Chester and Macclesfield were rearranged.

“And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Francis John, Bishop of

Chester, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said two archdeaconries of Chester and Macclesfield and with respect to some of the rural deaneries within such archdeaconries are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Francis John, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the *London Gazette* and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, firstly a new rural deanery shall be formed out of the rural deanery of Birkenhead within the said archdeaconry of Chester and shall be named “The Rural Deanery of Wallasey,” and secondly the parish of Lower Peover shall be transferred from the rural deanery of Frodsham in the said archdeaconry of Chester to the rural deanery of Bowdon in the said archdeaconry of Macclesfield, and the said rural deaneries of Birkenhead, Frodsham, and Wallasey in the said archdeaconry of Chester and the said rural deanery of Bowdon in the said archdeaconry of Macclesfield shall respectively comprise and consist of the parishes, cures, and churches the names of which are set down in numbered order under the names of such rural deaneries respectively in the schedule to this scheme annexed, and each of the said parishes or cures or churches shall belong to and be and form part of the rural deanery and archdeaconry under the names of which it is set down as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the rural deanery and of the Archdeacon of the archdeaconry under which it is so set down as

aforesaid and shall not belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery or archdeaconry nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that

nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Woodborough, in the county of Wilts, and in the diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Woodborough is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Reverend Edwin George Wyld, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar or Incumbent of Melksham, in the said county and diocese, and a non-residentiary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Salisbury.

"And whereas the said Edwin George Wyld is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Woodborough now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Salisbury and their successors.

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter are willing to accept the proposed transfer, and in token of such their willingness have executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Salisbury, in token that the proposed transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Woodborough, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Woodborough.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edwin George Wyld (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), and with

the consent of the said John, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Salisbury (in testimony whereof they have caused their common or capitular seal to be affixed to this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Woodborough, now vested in him the said Edwin George Wyld as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Salisbury and their successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Salisbury and by their successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Birmingham (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Sutton Coldfield, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Peter, situate at Maney as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Maney.'

"And with the like consent of the said Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Birmingham (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Peter, situate at Maney as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"All that part of the parish of Sutton Coldfield, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Birmingham, which is bounded upon the south by the new parish of Walmley, upon the south-west and upon the west by the new parish of Saint Michael, Boldmere, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west, upon the north, and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael, Boldmere, from the said parish of Sutton Coldfield, at the centre of the bridge which carries Cup-lane across the stream which flows from Windley Pool into Plants Brook, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of twenty chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Plants Brook, and extending thence generally south-westward along the middle of Plants Brook for a distance of one mile and three-quarters or thereabouts to a point near Newhall Mill upon the boundary which divides

"All that part of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Matthew, Redhill, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Southwark, which is bounded upon part of the south-east by the parish of Nutfield, upon the north-east by the consolidated chapelry of All Saints, South Merstham, upon the north by the parish of Gatton, upon the north-west by an isolated portion of the parish of Reigate, upon part of the south-west by the new parish of Saint Mark, Reigate, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south-west, upon the south and upon the remaining part of the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, Reigate, from the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Redhill, at a point in the middle of Wray-lane opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of Wray Common, and extending thence first eastward, then north-eastward, then south-eastward, then south-westward, and then again south-eastward along the middle of Wray-lane for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Linkfield-lane, and extending first north-eastward, then northward, and then again north-eastward along the middle of Linkfield-lane for a distance of forty-nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with London-road and Frenches-road, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of Frenches-road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway or footpath which leads past Wiggie Farm House and past the back of the Royal Saint Anne's Society's Schools to Copyhold Farm House and Nutfield-road, and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of the said roadway or footpath for a distance of thirty-four chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge, which carries such roadway or footpath across the stream which rises near Warwick Wold Farm House, in the parish of Blechingley, in the said county and diocese, and extending thence generally north-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of thirty-seven chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Redhill, from the said parish of Nutfield."

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Luke, situate at Poolton as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis John, Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Wallasey, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Luke, situate at Poolton as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Luke, Poolton.'

"And with the like consent of the said Francis John, Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears

to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Luke, situate at Poulton as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Luke, Poulton, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Wallasey, in the county of Chester, and in the diocese of Chester, which is bounded upon the north-east partly by the new parish of Saint Mary, Liscard, and partly by the new parish of Saint John, Egremont, otherwise Liscard, upon the east by the new parish of Saint Paul, Seacombe, upon the south by the new parish of Saint Anne, Birkenhead, upon the south-west partly by the new parish of Saint James, Birkenhead, and partly by the parish of Bidston, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of Wallasey Pool where the boundary which divides the said parish of Bidston from the said parish of Wallasey is crossed by the line of the Wirral Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of twenty chains, or thereabouts, to a point where such line of railway crosses the boundary which divides the civil parish of Wallasey from the civil parish of Poulton-cum-Seacombe, and extending thence first north-westward, then north-eastward, then south-eastward, and then again north-eastward along the said civil parish boundary for a distance of twenty-four chains and a half, or thereabouts, to the junction of Mill-lane with Marlowe-road, and extending thence north-westward along the Middle of Marlowe-road for a distance of five chains and a half precisely, and extending thence north-eastward in a line parallel with Mill-lane (thereby including the Model Farm) for a distance of thirteen chains, or thereabouts, to the boundary which divides the said parish of Wallasey from the said new parish of Saint Mary, Liscard."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Philip, Tottenham, situate within the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, and of the consolidated chapelry of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and consolidated chapelry.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, and of the said consolidated chapelry of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Philip, Tottenham, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Reverend Denton Jones, Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Tottenham, in the said county of Middlesex, and as such Vicar or Incumbent the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, and with the consent of the Reverend Arthur William Yeatman, Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, and as such Vicar or Incumbent the patron of the consolidated chapelry of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, and of the said consolidated chapelry of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed,

should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Philip, Tottenham, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip, Tottenham.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip, Tottenham, comprising:—

"(I.) All that portion of the new parish (some-time district chapelry) of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, which is bounded upon the north by the parish of Tottenham, upon the west by the consolidated chapelry of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, upon the south by the new parish of Saint Ann, Hanger-lane, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Ann, Hanger-lane, from the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, at the junction of West Green-road with Lawrence-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Lawrence-road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Philip-lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Philip-lane for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Mount Pleasant-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Mount Pleasant-road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, from the said parish of Tottenham.

"(II.) And also all that contiguous portion of the said consolidated chapelry of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, which is bounded upon the north-east and upon the south-east by the above described portion of the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of West Green-road with Philip-lane where the boundaries of the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, the said new parish of Saint Ann, Hanger-lane, and the said consolidated chapelry of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, all meet, and extending thence in a straight line due north (thereby passing to the west of Downhill House) for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to a point on the northern side of the footpath leading from Green-lanes and Langham-road past Downhill House to Bruce Grove, and extending thence eastward along the northern side of the said footpath for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries which divide the said consolidated chapelry of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, the said parish of Tottenham and the said new parish of Holy Trinity, Tottenham, all meet."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the seventeenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the eleventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and published in the London Gazette on the twentieth day of September in the same year, part of the parish of Blackburn, in the said county of Lancaster, and at that time in the diocese of Chester, but now in the said diocese of Manchester, was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church of Saint Mark, situate in the township of Witton, in the said parish of Blackburn, and the said chapelry district was named 'The Chapelry District of Saint Mark, Witton.'

"And whereas the said chapelry district of Saint Mark, Witton, has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the seventh day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and published in the London Gazette on the eleventh day of the same month, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn.'

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the



boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, shall be altered so that (firstly) all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, which is described in the first schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said district chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn, and (secondly) all that portion of the said district chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn, which is described in the second schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green, shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference:—

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, and to be annexed to the district chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn, in the same county and diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, which is bounded upon the east by the said district chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn, upon the north-west by the district chapelry of Saint Silas, Blackburn, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district chapelry of Saint Silas, Blackburn, from the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, at the junction of Preston New-road with Bromley-street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Bromley-street for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Belle Vue-street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Belle Vue-street for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cheetham-street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Cheetham-street for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Johnston-street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Johnston-street for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Lawrence-street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Lawrence-street for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of

Saint Mark, Witton, from the said district chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, being:—

"All that portion of the said district chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn, which is bounded upon the west by the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, from the said district chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn, crosses the middle of Lawrence-street, and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of Lawrence-street for a distance of seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Wensley-street; and extending thence southward and in a straight line for a distance of five chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the River Blackwater and opposite to the middle of Throstle-street, where the boundaries of the said district chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Blackburn, the new parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, the new parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, both in the said county and diocese, and the said new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, all meet."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of the Emperor of China and the Emperor of Corea.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The China and Corea (Amendment) Order in Council, 1907," and shall be read as one with "The China and Corea Order in Council, 1904," hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order."

2.—(1.) Where one or more commissioned Consular officers are stationed in a Consular

district assigned to another commissioned Consular officer, the Minister may, if he think fit, appoint such commissioned Consular officer or officers to whom no district is assigned to be an additional Judge or additional Judges of the Provincial Court of the district.

(2.) Where an officer is so appointed he shall hear and determine such matters, civil and criminal, being within the jurisdiction of a Provincial Court, as the Consular officer to whom the district is assigned, with the sanction of the Judge of the Supreme Court, directs.

(3.) Where an officer is appointed under this Article he may sit at the same time and place as the Consular officer to whom the district is assigned, or in a different place, and each sitting shall be deemed a sitting of the Provincial Court of the district.

3. The following Article shall be substituted for Article 69 of the Principal Order:—

Any act which, if done in the United Kingdom, or in a British Possession, would be an offence against any of the following Statutes of the Imperial Parliament or Orders in Council, that is to say:—

(a.) "The Merchandize Marks Act, 1887";

(b.) "The Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Acts, 1883 to 1902";

(c.) "The Trade Marks Act, 1905";

(d.) "Any Statute amending or substituted for any of the above mentioned Statutes;

(e.) Any Act, Statute, or Order in Council for the time being relating to copyright, or to inventions, designs, or trade-marks, of which a copy is kept exhibited in the public offices of the Consulates at Shanghai and Seoul, and is there open for inspection by any person at all reasonable times;

shall, if done by a British subject in China or Corea, be punishable as a grave offence against the Principal Order, whether such act is done in relation to any property or right of a British subject, or of a foreigner or native, or otherwise howsoever.

Provided:—

(1.) That no person shall be punished under this Order for an act which would be an offence against any Act, Statute, or Order in Council, the exhibition of which is required by paragraph (e) above, unless such exhibition had commenced not less than one month before the act took place, or unless the person offending is proved to have had express notice of such Act, Statute, or Order in Council.

(2.) That a prosecution by or on behalf of a prosecutor who is not a British subject shall not be entertained, unless either (a) an arrangement is in force between His Majesty's Government and the Government of the State or Power to which the prosecutor belongs, or (b) the Court is satisfied that effectual provision exists, for the punishment in Consular or other Courts in China or Corea of similar acts committed by the subjects of such State or Power in relation to or affecting the interests of British subjects. Where such an arrangement is in force the Minister may issue a notification to that effect, and the Court shall take judicial notice thereof.

4. No action shall be brought for the protection of any copyright, trade-mark, patent, or design by any person who is not a British subject, unless either (a) an arrangement is in force between His Majesty's Government and the

Government of the State or Power to which the plaintiff belongs, or (b) the Court is satisfied that effectual provision exists, for the protection in Consular or other Courts in China or Corea of the rights and interests of British subjects in copyrights, trade-marks, patents, and designs infringed by the subjects of such State or Power.

Where such an arrangement is in force the Minister may issue a notification to that effect, and the Court shall take judicial notice thereof.

5. The following Article shall take effect instead of Article 75 of the Principal Order:—

(1.) Every person subject to the criminal jurisdiction of the Court who prints, publishes, or offers for sale any printed or written newspaper or other publication containing seditious matter shall be guilty of a grave offence against the Principal Order, and may, in addition to, or in lieu of, any other punishment, be ordered to give security for good behaviour, and in default thereof, or on a further conviction for the like offence, he may be ordered to be deported.

(2.) Where any printed or written newspaper or other publication containing seditious matter is printed, published, or offered for sale within the limits of the Order by a Company registered in the United Kingdom or in a British possession, the Court may, after notice to the Company, and on proof of the facts, require the Company to give security to abstain from such printing, publishing, or offering for sale in future. If the Company fail to give security, or if the Company is shown to have again printed, published, or offered for sale such newspaper or other publication containing seditious matter after giving such security, the Court may make an order prohibiting the Company from carrying on business within the limits of the Order, and may make such other orders as to the Court may seem just. The Court may also declare all the property of the Company within the limits of the Order to be forfeited to His Majesty the King, and shall dispose of it, subject to any general or special directions of the Secretary of State, as it thinks fit.

(3.) Matter calculated to excite tumult or disorder, or to excite enmity between His Majesty's subjects and the Government of China or the Government of Corea, or the authorities or subjects of any Power in amity with His Majesty, being within the limits of this Order, or between the Government of China and its subjects or the Government of Corea and its subjects, shall be deemed to be seditious matter within the meaning of this Article.

(4.) Jurisdiction under this Article shall not be exercised except by the Supreme Court.

6. The following Article shall be substituted for Article 84 of the Principal Order:—

Where any person is deported to any place to which he can most conveniently be sent through Hong Kong, and it is necessary to land and transship him at Hong Kong, he shall, on his arrival there, be delivered, with the warrant under which he is deported, into the custody of a Magistrate of Police at Hong Kong, who, on receipt of the person deported and of the warrant, shall detain him, and shall forthwith report the case to the Governor of Hong Kong, who shall, by warrant, cause the person so deported to be detained in custody until a convenient opportunity occurs for sending him to the place to which he has been deported, and shall then send him to that place.

7. Where a case is stated under Article 85 of the Principal Order, the Judge shall have power, save where the case has been stated by himself, to order that it shall be heard and determined in the manner provided by Article 86 by himself alone, instead of by the full Court.

8. The following Article shall be substituted for Article 108 of the Principal Order:—

If any person named executor in a will takes possession of, and administers or otherwise deals with any part of the property of the deceased, and does not obtain probate within one month after the death or after the termination of any proceedings respecting probate or administration, he shall be liable to pay double the amount of any fees chargeable on obtaining probate, and he shall also be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds.

9. Article 112 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the substitution of the sum of one hundred pounds for the sum of fifty pounds therein mentioned.

10. Any person desirous of levying a distress for rent may apply to the Court to appoint a bailiff to levy such distress, and the Court may thereupon, and upon the applicant giving sufficient security to answer for any misconduct on the part of such bailiff, appoint a person to act as bailiff to levy such distress.

11. The following Articles shall be substituted for Article 114 of the Principal Order:—

(1.) Any party to an action in the Supreme Court, other than an Admiralty action, or to an appeal to the Supreme Court, aggrieved by the decision of that Court or by the verdict of a jury, may move the Supreme Court to rehear such action or appeal.

(2.) The motion shall be heard by the full Court unless the Judge of the Supreme Court otherwise orders.

(3.) On such motion the Supreme Court may make any order that may be made by the Court of Appeal in England in the exercise of its ordinary appellate jurisdiction.

(4.) An application for a rehearing shall be made within the prescribed time.

12. The following provision shall be substituted for Article 151 (1) of the Principal Order:—

(1.) Where a foreigner desires to institute or take in the Court an action against a British subject, or a British subject desires to institute or take in the Court an action against a foreigner the Court shall entertain the same, and the action shall be heard and determined either by the Judge sitting alone or, if all parties consent or the Court so directs, with a jury or assessors, but in all other respects according to the ordinary procedure of the Court.

13. The following provision shall be substituted for Article 155 (3) of the Principal Order:—

Any person committing a breach of any such Regulations shall, on conviction, be liable to the punishment, forfeiture, or fine therein prescribed, or if no such punishment or fine is prescribed, he shall be liable, on conviction, to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a period not exceeding three months, or to a fine, or to both. Regulations imposing penalties shall be so framed as to allow in every case of part only of the highest penalty being imposed.

14. The following Article shall take effect instead of Article 157 of the Principal Order:—

King's Regulations and municipal Regulations made or adopted under Articles 155 and

156 of the Principal Order shall not have effect unless and until they are approved by a Secretary of State, save that in case of urgency declared in any such Regulations, the same shall take effect before that approval, and shall continue to have effect unless and until they are disapproved by a Secretary of State, and until notice of that disapproval has been received and published by the Minister.

15. Every Consular officer shall, as far as there is proper opportunity, promote reconciliation and encourage and facilitate the settlement in an amicable way, and without recourse to litigation, of matters in difference between British subjects, or between British subjects and foreigners in China or Corea.

16. "The China, Japan, and Corea (Patents) Order in Council, 1899," "The China and Corea (Supreme Court) Order in Council, 1900," and the following Articles of the Principal Order are hereby repealed, viz.: Articles 27, 69, 75, 84, 108, 114, 151 (1), 155 (3), 157; but this repeal shall not (a) affect the past operation of such Orders or such Articles, or any right, title, obligation, or liability thereunder, or (b) interfere with the institution or prosecution of any legal proceedings thereunder.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. (1.) The powers, authority and jurisdiction conferred upon His Majesty's Minister in Corea by the China and Corea Order in Council, 1904 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), or by any amending Order in Council, or by any other Order in Council in force in Corea, are hereby conferred upon the Consul-General, and from and after the commencement of this Order all functions hitherto exercised by the said Minister under such Orders in Council, or any of them, shall be exercised by the Consul-General.

(2.) All references to the Minister in the Principal Order, or in any King's Regulations, Proclamations, Notices, Rules of Court, or other documents appertaining to Corea issued or made under the Principal Order shall be deemed to be

references to the Consul-General, and shall be construed accordingly.

(3.) The power given to the Minister by Article 156 of the Principal Order to join with the Ministers of other Powers in making Municipal Regulations shall be deemed to be a power to join with the Ministers or other Representatives of the Powers aforesaid in making such Regulations:

2. In the event of the death, incapacity, removal, or absence from Corea of the Consul-General for the time being, all the powers and authority conferred upon him by this or any other Order in Council shall, until His Majesty's further pleasure is signified through the Secretary of State, be vested in the senior Consular Officer in His Majesty's service for the time being in Corea.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Corea Order in Council, 1907."

**NORTHAMPTONSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)  
ORDER OF 1907.**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Power to make Regulations.*

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of either of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order

may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

*Confirmation of Regulations.*

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

*Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.*

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

*Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

6. This Order may be cited as the NORTHAMPTONSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1907.
