**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the seventeenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say :—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called “ the said benefice ”) of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter.

“ Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, is vested in General the Right Honourable Sir

Redvers Henry Buller, V.C., of Downes, Crediton, in the said county of Devon, and in Arthur Tremayne Buller, of Sopwell, St. Albans, in the county of Hertford, Esquire, as Trustees.

“ And whereas the said Redvers Henry Buller and Arthur Tremayne Buller are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Exeter.

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Archibald, now Bishop of Exeter, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them is made necessary, he the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

“ And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control and this circumstance will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter.

“ Now therefore, with the consent of the said Redvers Henry Buller and Arthur Tremayne Buller (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London

Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, now vested in them, the said Redvers Henry Buller and Arthur Tremayne Buller as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, and by his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.

of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Stanton All Saints with Stanton Saint John in the county of Suffolk and in the diocese of Ely.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Stanton All Saints with Stanton Saint John is vested for an estate in fee simple free from incumbrances in Stewart Blakeney, of Belton, near Loughborough, in the county of Leicester, Esquire.

"And whereas the said Stewart Blakeney is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Stanton All Saints with Stanton Saint John now vested in him as aforesaid should as to the two turns of presentation next hereafter occurring be transferred to and vested in Walter Henry Foster, of Number 3, Little College-street, in the city of Westminster, Solicitor, and as to all turns of presentation after such next two be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Ely.

"And whereas the said Walter Henry Foster and the Right Reverend Frederic Henry now Bishop of the said diocese of Ely are and each of them is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness the said Walter Henry Foster has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned and also in token as well of such his willingness as that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Frederic Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Ely has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas it appears to us that the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Stanton All Saints with Stanton Saint John which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists that is to say in the parish of Stanton which consists of the consolidated parishes of Stanton All Saints and Stanton Saint John.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Stewart Blakeney (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) with the consent of the said Walter Henry Foster (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Frederic Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Stanton All Saints with Stanton Saint John now vested in him the said Stewart Blakeney in fee simple as aforesaid shall be transferred from him as to the two turns of presentation next hereafter occurring to the said Walter Henry Foster his heirs executors or administrators and as to all succeeding turns of presentation after such two and all the remainder of the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage (after the determination of the right or interest therein

hereby transferred to the said Walter Henry Foster) to the said Frederic Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Ely and his successors Bishops of the same diocese to be exercised by the said Frederic Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Ely and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the thirty-first day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the parish of Saint Martin-in-the-Fields, in the city of Westminster, now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of an indenture of assignment, dated the eighteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, made between Sir Walter Charles James, Baronet, of the one part, and us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the other part, a certain messuage and premises known as number 11, Whitehall-place, Westminster, became vested in us for all the residue and remainder then to come and unexpired of the term of ninety-nine years granted by an indenture of lease, dated the eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, subject to the payment of the several rents thereby reserved.

"And whereas under and by virtue of an indenture of assignment, dated the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and

sixty-nine, and made between James Fletcher and David Blunt of the first part, Thomas Edward Bidgood of the second part, Marian Blunt, Widow, of the third part, and us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the fourth part, a certain messuage and premises known as number 10, Whitehall-place, Westminster, became vested in us for all the residue of the term of eighty-three years and three-quarters of another year granted by an indenture of lease, dated the eighteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, subject to the payment of the several rents thereby reserved.

"And whereas under and by virtue of an indenture of lease, dated the sixteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, made between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria of the first part, the Honorable Charles Alexander Gore, the Commissioner of Her said late Majesty's Woods, Forests, and Land Revenues in charge of the hereditaments demised on behalf of Her said late Majesty, of the second part, and us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the third part, certain land coloured red on the plan drawn on the margin of the said indenture with the buildings erected thereon, became vested in us for a term of forty-four years from the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, subject to the rents thereby reserved.

"And whereas the said leasehold messuages and premises were until recently occupied by us as our offices, but are no longer required for that purpose and are unsuitable to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said messuages and premises or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such messuages and premises or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act all or any of the said messuages and premises so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof, unto, and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and enquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements, or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that

nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Andrew, Bordesley, the new parish of Saltley, the new parish of Ashted, the new parish of Erdington, the new parish of Saint Clement, Nechells, the new parish of Saint Mary, Aston Brook, the new parish of Saint Anne, Duddeston, and the new parish of Saint Catherine, Nechells, all in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Birmingham.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-eighth day of the same month, a certain part of the parish of Aston-juxta-Birmingham, in the said county of Warwick, and at that time in the diocese of Worcester, but now in the said diocese of Birmingham, was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and the said district was named 'The District of Saint Andrew, Bordesley.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing

date the eleventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight and published in the London Gazette on the seventeenth day of the same month, a certain part of the said parish of Aston-juxta-Birmingham was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and the said district was named 'The District of Saltley.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the eighth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and published in the London Gazette on the ninth day of the same month, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint James, situate at Ashted, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Ashted.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the sixth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and published in the London Gazette on the seventh day of the following month, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Barnabas, situate at Erdington, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Erdington.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the tenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty, and published in the London Gazette on the sixteenth day of the same month, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Clement, situate at Nechells, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Clement, Nechells.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Instrument, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and being under our Common Seal and under the hand and seal of the late Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Worcester, a particular district was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Mary, situate at Aston Brook, and the said particular district was named 'The Particular District of Saint Mary, Aston Brook.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the eleventh day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and published in the London Gazette on the fourteenth day of the same month, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Anne, situate at Duddeston, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Anne, Duddeston.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-second day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and published in the London Gazette upon the twenty-eighth day of the same month, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Catherine, situate at Nechells, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Catherine, Nechells.'

"And whereas the said district of Saint Andrew, Bordesley, the said district of Saltley, the said district chapelry of Ashted, the said district chapelry of Erdington, the said district chapelry of Saint Clement, Nechells, the said particular district of Saint Mary, Aston Brook, the said district chapelry of Saint Anne, Duddeston, and the said district chapelry of Saint Catherine, Nechells, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of

the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bordesley, the said new parish of Saltley, the said new parish of Ashted, the said new parish of Erdington, the said new parish of Saint Clement, Nechells, the said new parish of Saint Mary, Aston Brook, the said new parish of Saint Anne, Duddeston, and the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Nechells, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Birmingham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bordesley, the said new parish of Saltley, the said new parish of Ashted, the said new parish of Erdington, the said new parish of Saint Clement, Nechells, the said new parish of Saint Mary, Aston Brook, the said new parish of Saint Anne, Duddeston, and the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Nechells, shall be altered so that (firstly) all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Clement, Nechells, and of the said new parish of Erdington which are described in the first schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saltley; and (secondly) all those portions of the said new parish of Saltley, the said new parish of Erdington and the said parish of Aston-juxta-Birmingham which are described in the second schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured blue shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Clement, Nechells; and (thirdly) all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Aston Brook, which is described in the third schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Nechells; and (fourthly) all that portion of the said new parish of Saltley which is described in the fourth schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured violet shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Anne, Duddeston; and (fifthly) all those portions of the said new parish of Saltley and of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bordesley, which are described in the fifth schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such new parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part

of the said new parish of Ashted; and (sixthly) all that portion of the said new parish of Saltley which is described in the sixth schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured brown shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bordesley.

“And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

#### “THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saltley in the county of Warwick and in the diocese of Birmingham comprising:—

“All those portions of the new parish of Saint Clement, Nechells, and of the new parish of Erdington, both in the said county and diocese, which lie to the east and south of an imaginary line commencing at the point (distant eleven chains or thereabouts, measured along the middle of the Birmingham and Warwick Junction Canal, from the middle of the Saltley Viaduct) where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saltley from the said new parish of Saint Clement, Nechells, crosses the middle of the said canal, and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of such canal for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to the centre of the aqueduct which carries such canal across the River Tame, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said river for a distance of fifty-five chains or thereabouts to the point where such river is joined by an arm of the River Rea, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Erdington from the said new parish of Saltley.

#### “THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the said new parish of Saint Clement, Nechells, comprising:—

“I. All those portions of the said new parish of Saltley which lie to the north of a line drawn along the middle of the said Saltley Viaduct eastward as far as the middle of the said Birmingham and Warwick Junction Canal and to the west of a line drawn along the middle of the said canal from the centre of the said viaduct northward to the boundary of the said new parish of Erdington.

“II. Also all that portion of the said new parish of Erdington which lies to the west of a line drawn along the middle of the said Birmingham and Warwick Junction Canal northward from the boundary of the new parish of St. Clement, Nechells, to the centre of the Aqueduct over the River Tame and to the south of a line drawn along the middle of the said River Tame from the centre of the said Aqueduct westward to the boundary of the parish of Aston-juxta-Birmingham, in the county and diocese aforesaid.

“III. or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Osprey, Owl (all species),  
Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Robin, Redstart,

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH FEBRUARY 1907.)

SHEEP-DIPPING (ENGLAND) ORDER OF  
1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

*Application of Order.*

1.—(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area."

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without the Dipping Area the provisions of this Order shall not apply to the farm or holding or the sheep thereon, but shall be construed as if the whole farm or holding were outside the Area.

*Prescribed Dipping Period.*

2.—(1.) The prescribed dipping period in the Dipping Area shall in each year commence on the fifteenth day of May and terminate on the thirty-first day of August.

(2.) In the case of sheep moved into the Dipping Area between the twenty-first day of August and the first day of September, the dipping period as regards such sheep shall not terminate until the expiration of ten days after the movement.

*Mode of Dipping Prescribed.*

3. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab by the Sheep-Scab Order of 1905, or otherwise, or purporting to be so approved.

*Exemptions from Dipping Requirements.*

4. The provisions of this Order which require the dipping of sheep shall not apply to the following sheep:—

(i.) Sheep moved by railway through the Dipping Area without being untrucked within the Area :

(ii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special circumstances, and which are accordingly exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

*Annual Prescribed Dipping.*

5.—(1.) All sheep in the Dipping Area during any part of the prescribed dipping period (except those exempted by Article 4 of this Order) shall be caused to be dipped within the Dipping Area by the owner or person in charge thereof during that period; but this provision does not apply to sheep moved out of the Area before the expiration of that period.

(2.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping required by this Article, whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—

(i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such person as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.

(ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.

(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.

(3.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(4.) A return in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

*Dipping after Movement during the Prescribed Dipping Period.*

6.—(1.) Sheep which during the prescribed dipping period are—

(a) moved to any premises in the Dipping Area (other than a market, fair-ground, saleyard or licensed exhibition) from any place outside the Area, either directly or through a market, fair-ground, saleyard or licensed exhibition in the Area, or

(b) moved to any premises in the Area (other than a market, fair-ground, saleyard or licensed exhibition) from any market, fair-ground or saleyard in the Area

shall (unless exempted by Article 4 of this Order) be caused to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge thereof before they are permitted to come in contact with any sheep on the premises which have already been dipped under this Order, and in any case before the expiration of the prescribed dipping period, or if it expires within ten days after the movement then the dipping must be before the expiration of such ten days.

(2.) Sheep which have been moved to premises under circumstances which involve the dipping of the sheep under this Article shall not be moved from such premises until they have been so dipped unless such movement is for the purposes of dipping or slaughter or exposure at an exhibition.

(3.) The occupier of the premises to which the sheep are moved shall within ten days after the arrival of the sheep notify such arrival to the person appointed to receive such notices by the Local Authority of the District. The notice shall be in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

(4.) If at the time when this Notice (Form C) is given any of the sheep have not been slaughtered or dipped under this Article, the provisions of the previous Article as to notice of

intended dipping and return (Form B) shall apply in respect of the dipping of those sheep which is required by this Article.

(5.) Any field, lair, or other like premises which may be specially authorised by the Local Authority of the District as a place for temporary detention of sheep shall be treated for the purposes of this Article as on the same footing as a market.

(6.) This Article shall not apply in the case of movement of sheep from any place which is in an Area affected by the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906.

*Clipping before Dipping.*

7. A sheep shall not be deemed to have been dipped in accordance with the requirements of this Order, unless it has been previously clipped in the current year, but this provision shall not apply to lambs less than nine months old.

*Isolation of Sheep after Dipping.*

8.—(1.) All sheep after having been dipped shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(2.) This Article does not prohibit the exposure of dipped sheep in a market, fair-ground, saleyard or exhibition.

*Annual Declaration after Prescribed Dipping Period.*

9. The occupier of a farm or holding in the Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, within fourteen days after the expiration of the prescribed dipping period, send, in each year, a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form D set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

*Notice of Appointment of Persons to receive Returns, &c.*

10. The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under this Order, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

*Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Prescribed Dipping Period.*

11. Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form E set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped after the service of the notice in the presence of an Inspector of the Local Authority, or have been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be unlawful to move the sheep in contravention of the notice.

*Cleansing of Dipping Places.*

12. The place on any farm or premises which has been used for the dipping shall, without

unnecessary delay, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

*Samples of Dip may be taken.*

13. Every owner or person in charge of sheep being dipped under this Order shall permit and give every facility to an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board, or to a constable, to take samples of dip or material which is being or has been used for the dipping of sheep.

*Power to provide Dipping Places.*

14. The Local Authority may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to the approval in writing by the Board of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

*Power for Local Authority to regulate time and place of Dipping in particular cases.*

15. The Local Authority may in any case where they think such procedure desirable serve a notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form F set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

*Powers of Entry of Inspectors.*

16. An Inspector of the Board, and an Inspector of the Local Authority subject to their direction, may for the purposes of this Order enter any premises and examine any sheep thereon.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

17. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

18.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person fails to give any notice or send any return or declaration required by this Order, or falsely makes any return or declaration for the purposes of this Order, or offers or utters any such return or declaration knowing the same to be falsely made, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.



(4.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Provision as to Local Regulations.*

19. A Local Authority of any District comprised in the Dipping Area shall not have power to make regulations under Article 9 of the Sheep Scab Order of 1905, as to movement of sheep brought into their District during the prescribed dipping period, and all such regulations in force at the commencement of this Order shall cease to apply during such period.

*Interpretation.*

20. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “Licensed exhibition” means an exhibition licensed under the authority of this Order by the Local Authority of the District;
- “Sheep” includes lambs;
- “Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector and any person appointed by a Local Authority to be their Inspector for the purposes of this Order;
- “Owner” includes a joint owner;
- “The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;
- “The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Short Title.*

21. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP-DIPPING (ENGLAND) ORDER OF 1907.

SHEEP-DIPPING (WALES AND MONMOUTH)  
ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

*Application of Order.*

1.—(1) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, and hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area."

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly in the Dipping Area and partly outside the Dipping Area, the whole farm or holding shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in the Dipping Area.

*Mode of Dipping prescribed.*

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab by the Sheep-Scab Order of 1905 or otherwise, or purporting to be so approved.

*General Dipping within Prescribed Period.*

3.—(1.) All sheep (except those exempted by later provisions of this Order) which are in the Dipping Area at any time between the first day of August and the fifteenth day of September, hereinafter referred to as "the prescribed dipping period," in any year during which this Order shall be in operation, shall be caused to be dipped within the Dipping Area between these dates by the owner, or person in charge thereof.

(2.) In the case of sheep moved into the Dipping Area between the fifth day of September and the sixteenth day of that month it shall be sufficient compliance with this Article if the sheep are dipped within ten days after the movement.

(3.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to the following sheep:—

(i.) Sheep moved by railway through the Dipping Area without being untrucked within the Area;

(ii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special circumstances, and which are accordingly exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect;

(iii.) Sheep slaughtered in the Dipping Area or moved out of the Dipping Area, without contravening Article 15 of this Order, before the expiration of the period within which their dipping is required under this Article.

*Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of intended Dipping.*

4.—(1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under the preceding Article, shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—

(i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such persons as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.

(ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.

(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.

(2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(3.) A return in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

*Clipping before Dipping.*

5. A sheep shall not be deemed to have been dipped in accordance with the requirements of this Order, unless it has been previously clipped in the current year, but this provision shall not apply to lambs less than nine months old.

*Isolation of Sheep after Dipping.*

6. All sheep, after having been dipped, shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

*Declaration after Dipping Period.*

7. The occupier of a farm or holding on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, on or after the fifteenth day of September, but not later than the twenty-ninth day of September, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

*Notice of Appointment of Persons to receive Returns, &c.*

8. The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under the preceding Articles, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

*Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Dipping Period.*

9. Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact

with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form D set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped after the service of the notice in the presence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or have been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be unlawful to move the sheep in contravention of the notice.

#### *Cleansing of Dipping Places.*

10. The place on any farm or premises which has been used for the dipping shall, without unnecessary delay, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

#### *Samples of Dip may be taken.*

11. Every owner or person in charge of sheep being dipped under this Order shall permit and give every facility to an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board, or to a constable, to take samples of dip or material which is being or has been used for the dipping of sheep.

#### *Power to provide Dipping Places.*

12. The Local Authority may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to the approval in writing by the Board of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

#### *Powers of Entry of Inspectors.*

14. An Inspector of the Board, and an Inspector of the Local Authority subject to their direction, may for the purposes of this Order enter any premises and examine any sheep thereon.

#### *Restrictions on Markets, &c., and of Movement out of Dipping Area.*

15.—(1.) From the first day of August until the fifteenth day of September in any year during which this Order shall be in operation sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be exposed for sale in any market, fair, or sale yard in the Dipping Area, nor moved out of the Area, unless they have been dipped during the prescribed dipping period or within twenty-eight days before the commencement of such period, and unless they are accompanied by a declaration stating that they have been so dipped, signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in that behalf. The declaration shall be in the Form F set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, except that in the case of sheep

landed in the Dipping Area from Ireland after the thirty-first day of August (the date of the expiration of the prescribed dipping period in Ireland) a declaration in the Form G set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, may be used instead of a declaration (Form F).

(2.) Where the movement is out of the Area the place of destination shall be endorsed upon the declaration, and a copy of the declaration with such endorsement shall, before the movement, be given or sent to an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the sheep are moved. The sheep shall be moved to the place of destination by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay. A copy of a declaration received by an Inspector under this Article shall forthwith be sent by him to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

(3.) Sheep intended for exhibition at agricultural shows may be moved out of the Area without a declaration, if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the sheep are moved, upon production of a veterinary certificate showing freedom from sheep-scab.

#### *Provision for Movement through the Dipping Area.*

16.—(1.) For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Dipping Area in any case where they are moved through the Area by railway from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area without unnecessary delay and without the sheep being untrucked within the Area.

(2.) Sheep landed in the Dipping Area shall not for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be moved out of the Area, if they are consigned from Ireland to a place of destination outside the Area, but sheep so landed shall be moved from the landing-place forthwith by the most direct route to the nearest available railway station from which the sheep can be moved to the place of destination to which they are so consigned, and forthwith moved by railway out of the Area.

#### *Movement of Lambs.*

17.—(1.) Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any lambs in the District for which he is appointed Inspector are intended for immediate slaughter, and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should be dipped before movement for such purpose, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority appointing him, by licence authorise the exposure for sale of the lambs in any market, fair, or saleyard in the Area, or the movement of the lambs to any premises outside the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the lambs may be exposed for sale or moved in accordance with such licence and conditions; Provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority (such premises being outside the Area), unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained.

(2.) Lambs may, without being previously dipped, be exposed for sale at any market, fair, or saleyard in the Area which the Local Authority of the District shall have authorised for this purpose, and from which other sheep are excluded.

(3.) Lambs may, without being previously dipped, be moved out of the Area from a market, fair, or saleyard authorised under this Article, or from any other premises, if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the lambs are to be moved; and such lambs shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and shall be there detained and isolated from other sheep for a period of fifty-six days unless they shall have been dipped during such period in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority. A copy of the licence shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence. The licence shall be in the Form H set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

(4.) This Article does not apply to lambs more than nine months old.

*Production of Declarations and Licences; Names and Addresses.*

18.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved or exposed for sale where under this Order a declaration or exemption is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the declaration or exemption, if any, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

19. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

20.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person fails to give any notice or send any return or declaration required by this Order, or falsely makes any return or declaration for the purposes of this Order, or offers or utters any such return or declaration knowing the same to be falsely made, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a sheep is exposed for sale in any market, fair, or saleyard, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises where the sheep is exposed, and the person exposing the same, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, and the purchaser thereof, knowing the same to be exposed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing,

directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved or exposed for sale, where under this Order a declaration or exemption is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

21. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

SHEEP-DIPPING (SCOTLAND AND NORTH  
OF ENGLAND) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of Order.*

1.—(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area."

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly in the Dipping Area and partly outside the Dipping Area, the whole farm or holding shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in the Dipping Area.

*Mode of Dipping Prescribed.*

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab by the Sheep-Scab Order of 1905 or otherwise, or purporting to be so approved.

*Prescribed Dipping.*

3.—(1.) All sheep in the Dipping Area during any part of a prescribed dipping period (except those exempted by later provisions of this Article) shall be caused to be dipped within the Dipping Area by the owner or person in charge thereof during that period. The first prescribed dipping period shall commence on the first day of January and terminate on the thirty-first day of August, and the second prescribed dipping period shall commence on the first day of September and terminate on the twelfth day of November.

(2.) In the case of sheep moved into the Dipping Area between the twenty-first day of August and the first day of September, or between the second day of November and the thirteenth day of that month, it shall be sufficient compliance with this Article if the sheep are dipped within ten days after the movement.

(3.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to the following sheep:—

(i.) Sheep moved by railway through the Dipping Area without being untrucked within the Area;

(ii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special circumstances, and which are accordingly exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect;

(iii.) Sheep slaughtered in the Dipping Area or moved out of the Dipping Area, without contravening Article 15 of this Order, before the expiration of the period within which their dipping is required under this Article.

*Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of intended Dipping and Returns of Dippings.*

4.—(1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under the preceding Article, shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—

(i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such person as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.

(ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.

(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.

(2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(3.) A return in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

*Clipping before Dipping.*

5. During the second prescribed dipping period a sheep shall not be deemed to have been dipped in accordance with the requirements of this Order, unless it has been previously clipped in the current year, but this provision shall not apply to lambs less than nine months old.

*Isolation of Sheep after Dipping.*

6. All sheep after having been dipped during the second prescribed dipping period, shall during the remainder of the period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

*Declaration after Dipping Period.*

7. The occupier of a farm or holding in the Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, on or after the thirty-first day of August, but not later than the fourteenth day of September, and on or after the twelfth day of November, but not later than the twenty-sixth day of November, in each year, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

*Notice of Appointment of Persons to receive Returns, &c.*

8. The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under the preceding Articles, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

*Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Dipping Period.*

9. Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form D set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped after the service of the notice in the presence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or have been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be unlawful to move the sheep in contravention of the notice.

*Cleansing of Dipping Places.*

10. The place on any farm or premises which has been used for the dipping shall, without unnecessary delay, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

*Samples of Dip may be taken.*

11. Every owner or person in charge of sheep being dipped under this Order shall permit and give every facility to an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board, or to a constable, to take samples of dip or material which is being or has been used for the dipping of sheep.

*Power to provide Dipping Places.*

12. The Local Authority may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to the approval in writing by the Board of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

*Power for Local Authority to regulate time and place of Dipping in particular cases.*

13. The Local Authority may in any case where they think such procedure desirable serve a notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form E set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

*Powers of Entry of Inspectors.*

14. An Inspector of the Board, and an Inspector of the Local Authority subject to their direction, may for the purposes of this Order enter any premises and examine any sheep thereon.

*Restrictions on Movement of Sheep out of Dipping Area and Regulation of Exposure of Sheep at Markets.*

15.—(1.) After the first day of September until the twelfth day of November (including that day) sheep shall not be exposed for sale, in any market, fair, or saleyard in the Dipping Area, or be moved out of the Dipping Area—

(a) unless the sheep have been dipped on or since the first day of August then last past,

and are accompanied by a declaration in the Form F set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in that behalf; or

(b) unless the sheep have been dipped between the fifteenth day of June and the first day of August then last past and since such dipping have been kept isolated during the remainder of that period from sheep which have not been so dipped, and are accompanied by a declaration in the Form F set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in that behalf; or

(c) unless the sheep have been landed in Great Britain from Ireland, or moved into the Dipping Area from some part of Great Britain to which this Order does not apply, after the expiration of the prescribed dipping period in force in Ireland, or in that part of Great Britain, as the case may be, and the sheep are accompanied by a declaration, in the Form G set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in that behalf; or

(d) unless the sheep are accompanied by a declaration made under this Article by a person holding a market, fair, or sale at which the sheep have been previously exposed.

(2.) A person holding a market, fair, or sale may, with the approval of the Local Authority of the District, appoint one or more persons to receive the declarations required by this Order to accompany sheep entering therein. Such appointment shall be notified by notices affixed in or near the market, fair, or saleyard. In the event of any person or persons being so appointed the declarations shall, upon entry of the sheep into the market, fair, or saleyard, be delivered to such person or one of such persons, and be delivered by him to the person holding the market, fair, or sale, who shall retain the same for six months, but so that at any time the same shall be available for examination by any Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board. The person holding the market, fair, or sale shall, in respect of any sheep exposed thereat, issue to any person claiming to be the owner of any of the sheep or his representative, a declaration in the Form H set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect. The declaration may be signed by the person holding the market, fair, or sale or by his duly authorised agent.
