ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 21st February, 1907.)

Whereas by the twenty-first section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts :—

1. And whereas it is expedient, in order that every Sub-District of Leek Registration District may consist of entire Civil Parishes (a) that the small part of Leek Civil Parish and Urban District, now situated in Leek Frith Sub-District of Leek Registration District, should be transferred to Leek Sub-District of the same Registration District, and (b) that the small part of Leek Frith Civil Parish, now situated in Leek Sub-District of Leek Registration District, should be transferred to Leek Frith Sub-District of the same Registration District.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.
