The following address was presented to His Majesty on the 23rd instant, on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to the Royal Horticultural Hall for the purpose of opening the South African Products Exhibition:—

To Their Most Gracious Majesties King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra.

May it please Your Majesties, we, the Chairman and Members of the Executive Committee of the South African Products Exhibition, London, 1907, venture with our loyal duty and greeting to welcome Your Majesties in the name of the Administrations of Your Majesty's five Colonies in South Africa.

This Exhibition is the result of the joint efforts of the South African Governments and Your Majesty's subjects, to bring in a practical manner before the people of the United Kingdom a representation of the resources and products of the sub-continent.

It represents a new and gratifying movement in South Africa for the improvement of the products of the soil, and for the increase of their number, not only for home consumption, but for export to Great Britain and other countries.

If such a happy result be achieved it will not only promote the prosperity of South Africa, but increase its purchasing capacity, and tend to augment the value of the Colonies as markets for British manufactures.

It is with this twofold object that Your Majesty's loyal and humble subjects in South Africa have prepared and submit to You the large collection of typical products now arranged in this building.

Rejoicing that the Colonies of South Africa have thus been drawn together in new industrial

developments, we take this opportunity of conveying to Your Majesty, in the name of the Governments and people of South Africa, our and their unalterable loyalty and attachment to Your Throne and Person.

And in rendering also our heartfelt gratitude for Your Majesty's gracious presence here to-day, accompanied by Queen Alexandra, we do but express to Your Majesty the unanimous sentiments of all South Africans.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (BURGH
OF AYR) ORDER, 1907, dated February 22,
1907.

WHEREAS by section 9, as read with section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Secretary for Scotland with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas by section 10, as read with section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that local authorities within the meaning of section 9 of the said Act shall give public notice of any regulation of the Secretary for Scotland made in pursuance of the said Act, prohibiting

or restricting the use of motor cars on any highway, or part of a highway, or limiting the speed of motor cars within any limits or place, and for the purpose of giving effect to any such regulation, shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near the highway, part of a highway, limits or place, to which the regulation refers:

And whereas the Town Council of the Burgh of Ayr, being the Local Authority of the said Burgh, have applied to me to make regulations under section 9 of the said Act, and I am of opinion that it is desirable to give effect to the said application to the extent hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I, the Right Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following regulations under the said section 9:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (Burgh of Ayr) Order, 1907," and the regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the Local Authority shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.
2. A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour within the limits or places specified in the schedule to these regulations.

From one hundred yards north of North Newton Church on Prestwick-road to St. Leonard's Church by way of Prestwick-road, New-road, Main-street, New Bridge, New Bridge-street, High-street, Alloway-street, Beresford-terrace, and Carrick-road.

Craigie-road and Station-road from the lodge on Caigie-road opposite Craigie-avenue to the junction of Station-road with Alloway-street and Beresford-terrace by way of the bridge over the railway at the Passenger Station, and both sides of Burns' Statue-square.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination of Candidates for registration as Temporary Boy Clerks will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Bedford, Bristol, Liverpool, Southampton, Aberdeen, Glasgow, Belfast, and Cork, commencing on the 1st May, 1907, under the Regulations dated the 1st February, 1907, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

The number to be registered will depend partly on the requirements of the service, and partly on the number of Candidates who may show sufficient proficiency; but it is not likely to be less than 210, if so many shall be found competent: that is to say, 200 for service in London, Edinburgh, and provincial towns in England, Scotland, and Wales; and 10 for service in Dublin and provincial towns of Ireland exclusively.
