PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy-seven, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-first day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for making provision in part for the competent maintenance of the spiritual person officiating in the church of Saint David, Paddington, in the suburbs of the city of London and in the diocese of London.

“Whereas the Reverend William Richards, Clerk in Holy Orders, being a native of the Principality of Wales, has been licensed by the Bishop of the said diocese to officiate in the said church of Saint David, Paddington, which said church was duly consecrated on the nineteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, for the performance of Divine service according to the rites and ceremonies of the Church of England in the Welsh language, and it appears to us to be expedient that provision should forthwith be made for the more competent maintenance of the said William Richards or other the spiritual person who shall for the time being be licensed by the Bishop of the diocese to officiate in the

Welsh language in the said church of Saint David, Paddington.

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that out of the moneys mentioned in the twelfth section of the said Act there shall be paid by us to the said William Richards or to any one other spiritual person being a native of the Principality of Wales who may be licensed by the Bishop of the diocese for the time being to officiate in the said church of Saint David, Paddington, in the Welsh language the annual sum of fifty pounds by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in every year, the same sum to commence and be payable as from the nineteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, being the day on which the said church of Saint David, Paddington, was consecrated as aforesaid.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

MORECAMBE BAY.*Fleetwood—Extension of North Pier.*

The Harbour Master, Fleetwood, has given notice, dated 21st February, 1907, that the extension of the south end of the North Pier is about to be commenced, and that two red fixed lights, vertical, 4 feet apart, will be placed to mark the southern end of the staging connected with the work. ## No. 291.—MEDITERRANEAN—ALGERIA.

*Cape Corbelin—Light Intended.*

The French Government has given notice, dated 18th February, 1907, that it is intended during 1907 to establish a white group occulting light, showing groups of two eclipses every eight seconds, in a cylindrical tower, 44 feet high, erected on Cape Corbelin: it will show a sector of red fixed light from the bearing of  $S. 71^{\circ} E.$  to the coast to the westward of the cape. The light will be elevated 137 feet above high water, the white light being visible in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles.

Further information, dated 20th February, 1907, has been received through the Board of Trade of the existence of Ubaranas Rocks named Onda Pequena, and Onda Grande in the approach to Bahia de Todos os Santos, situated at distances of 5 cables N.  $89^{\circ} W.$  and 2 cables S.  $25^{\circ} W.$  respectively from the eastern extremity of Itapuanzinho Point. **W**HEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the *London Gazette*, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived, as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of *Waltham*, in the county of *Lincoln*, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, have made a representation stating that they are of opinion that so much of the Order of Her late Majesty in Council of the fourteenth day of *July*, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, as varied by the Order in Council of the seventh day of *October*, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, as relates to burials in the church and churchyard of *Waltham*, in the county of *Lincoln*, should be further varied in the manner hereinafter described:

**WALTHAM, LINCOLN.**—That burials should also be discontinued forthwith and entirely in that portion of *Waltham* churchyard which was added in the year one thousand

eight hundred and ninety-six, except as follows:—

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the churchyard, burial may be allowed, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave:

(c.) In the said portion of the churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twentieth day of *April* next:

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Carmarthen, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Carmarthen) Order, 1907."

#### BIRDS.

*Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Carmarthen to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Bullfinch, Black-headed Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Kite, Linnet (all species), Robin, Shrike (Butcher Bird), Thrush, Blue Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

*Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.*

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Carmarthen:—

Bullfinch, Black-headed Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Goldfinch, Gulls (except Black-backed Gull), Kingfisher, Kite, Linnet (all species), Nightingale, Owl, Robin, Shrike (Butcher Bird), Thrush, Blue Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Woodpecker, Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

#### Eggs.

*Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.*

IV. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Carmarthen:—

Black-headed Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Goldfinch, Gulls (except Black-backed Gull), Kingfisher, Kite, Linnet (all species), Nightingale, Owl, Shrike (Butcher Bird), Blue Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Woodpecker, Golden-crested Wren.

#### Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 12th day of August, 1901, is hereby repealed.

**MONTGOMERYSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)  
ORDER OF 1907.**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Power to make Regulations.*

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of the District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

*Confirmation of Regulations.*

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

*Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.*

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

*Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Short Title.*

6. This Order may be cited as the MONTGOMERYSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1907.
