BILLS.

ORDER of the Local Government Board:
District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District:—

LEICESTERSHIRE AUDIT DISTRICT.

To Evelyn Henry Villiers Weigall, District Auditor;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively;—

To the Authorities referred to in Article I. (3) of this Order;—

To the Hospital Committee for the Leicestershire Small-pox Hospital District;—

To the Melton and Belvoir Hospital Committee;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas Evelyn Henry Villiers Weigall has been duly appointed, under the Statutes in that behalf, to be a District Auditor, from the fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven inclusive;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said Evelyn Henry Villiers Weigall (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely:—

(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.

(2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.

(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose Accounts are not subject to audit by any other District Auditor.

(4.) The Hospital Committee for the Leicestershire Small-pox Hospital District.

(5.) The Melton and Belvoir Hospital Committee.

(6.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Leicestershire Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, the Districts of the Hospital Committees named in Paragraphs (4) and (5) of Article I of this Order, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in Paragraph (6) of the said Article.

ARTICLE IV.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of any District Auditor or Assistant Auditor as regards any Audit, or any matters or proceedings already commenced.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order—

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

ARTICLE VI.—This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven, provided that, for the purpose of the giving by the District Auditor of notices of any Audit, it shall operate from the date hereof.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of East Sussex.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may by regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of East Sussex have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made under Section 6 of the Act of 1896 and Section 8 of the Act of 1903, for restricting to five miles per hour the speed at which any motor car may be driven upon the part of a highway hereinafter described, namely:—

A portion of the highway leading from the Lewes to Eastbourne main road at Berwick, to Seaford, commencing at a point where the boundary of the parishes of Berwick and Alfriston crosses the road near Winton Farm, thence southwards through the High-street, Alfriston, past Frog Firle, and Tile Barn, to a point 550 yards or thereabouts south of Tile Barn, a total length of 3,350 yards or thereabouts.

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their office, Whitehall, London, S.W., on or before the third day of April, 1907.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the County Council, addressed to the Clerk to the County Council of East Sussex, County Hall, Lewes.

The Board of Trade have received from the Government Secretary of British New Guinea a copy of the following Proclamation and Regulations respecting quarantine in that Colony:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Francis Rickman Barton, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Territory of Papua.

[L.s.] F. R. BARTON.

I, Francis Rickman Barton, the Administrator aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do, under the powers conferred upon me by "The Quarantine Act of 1886" (Queensland adopted), hereby proclaim that the following places in the Territory are places at which ships may perform quarantine, viz.:—Port Moresby and Samarai.

The point known as Paga Point at Port Moresby. Commencing at a peg at low water

mark at Sanitary Point, Port Moresby; thence bounded on the north-east by a line bearing south-east to low water mark of Walter Bay; and bounded thence on the south-east, south, and west, by low water mark of Walter Bay and Port Moresby bearing generally south-west, north-west, and north, to the point of commencement; and

The whole of the island of Daugo down to low water mark to be places at which passengers may perform quarantine; and

The whole of the island of Gesila (near Samarai) down to low water mark to be a place at which passengers may perform quarantine.

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION IV. OF "THE QUARANTINE AMENDMENT ORDINANCE OF 1906."

Quarantine Regulations in respect of Woodlark Island.

1. Pratique may be granted by the Officer in charge of Customs at Woodlark, but pratique so granted shall be purely local and shall have no effect beyond the island of Woodlark.

2. Oversea vessels proceeding from Woodlark to Samarai, or any other Port in the Territory, shall, for the purposes of the Quarantine Ordinances, be regarded, on arrival at Samarai or such other Port, as arriving beyond the Territory, and the fact that pratique may have been granted at Woodlark shall be immaterial.

3. The Officer in charge of Customs shall, as regards the island of Woodlark, have all the powers of a Health Officer in other parts of the Territory, and save as herein otherwise provided, all restrictions and obligations under the Quarantine Ordinances attaching or imposed upon ships or persons arriving at other Ports of the Territory shall attach to and be imposed upon ships and persons arriving at Woodlark.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Swine into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order; the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

The state of the weather did not permit of the examination of this shoal, but it was estimated to have a depth of from $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 fathoms over it. A detailed survey of this danger will shortly be made.

f. No. 2 Wharf has partly sunk.

g. At Kingston the only landmark in existence is the tower of the Roman Catholic Cathedral.

h. Many of the beacons have been damaged.

j. So far no appreciable alteration in the depths in the approach to, or in, the harbour can be detected. The subsidence which has taken place is not sufficient to affect navigation.

**METROPOLITAN PUBLIC CARRIAGE
ACT, 1869.**

Order made in pursuance of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, 32 and 33 Vict. c. 115, by the Right Honourable Herbert John Gladstone, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

15th March, 1907.

Part I.

Licensing of Hackney and Stage Carriages.

In pursuance of sections 6 and 11 of the above-mentioned Act, I hereby prescribe as follows:—

1. A Hackney Carriage Licence or a Stage Carriage Licence may be granted to any person by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, hereinafter referred to as the Commissioner, subject to the following exceptions:—

(a) A Licence shall not be granted to any person under the age of 21 years, and any Licence so granted shall be void.

(b) The Commissioner may at his discretion refuse a Licence to any person who has been convicted of a felony, misdemeanour, or of cruelty to animals, or who, having previously held a Licence for a Hackney or a Stage Carriage, has had such previous Licence revoked or suspended.

2. A person desirous of obtaining a Hackney Carriage Licence, or a Stage Carriage Licence, shall make application at the office of the Commissioner.

Such application, if for a Hackney Carriage Licence, shall be in the form contained in Schedule A, hereto; or, if for a Stage Carriage Licence, shall be in the form contained in Schedule B, hereto.

3. The price of a Hackney Carriage Licence or a Stage Carriage Licence is £2.

4. If the application is approved by the Commissioner, the applicant shall pay the said sum of £2 to the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District, or to some person whom such Receiver shall appoint, who will issue to the applicant a receipt for the amount paid.

5. The applicant shall then bring the carriage, to which he desires the Licence shall attach, to the Police Station of the district for examination by the Inspector of Public Carriages, or to such other place as the Commissioner may direct, and shall, at the same time, deliver to the said Inspector the said application and receipt. The said Inspector, if he shall find such carriage fit for public use, shall cause a metal plate, bearing the number which is to distinguish such carriage, and hereinafter called the number plate, to be affixed thereto in his presence, together with such approval mark as the Commissioner may from time to time direct, and shall sign a certificate in the form contained in Schedule C hereto.

Such number plate shall be fixed, in the case of a four-wheeled Hackney Carriage, on the back thereof; in the case of a two-wheeled Hackney Carriage, on the spring-block on the back, under the driver's seat. A number plate shall also be fixed to be visible from the inside of every such carriage. In the case of a Stage Carriage the number plate shall be affixed on the back thereof.

6. In the case of a Hackney Carriage, the said Inspector shall at the same time cause to be affixed to the carriage a plate (hereinafter called the fare plate) setting forth the particulars of

fares which may be demanded by the driver from the hirer. Such fare plate shall be affixed in a convenient and conspicuous place to be approved by the Commissioner.

7. A licence (subject to the conditions hereinafter specified) shall thereupon be issued to the applicant.

8. A Hackney Carriage Licence shall be in the form contained in Schedule D hereto; and a Stage Carriage Licence shall be in the form contained in Schedule E hereto.

9. An application for a Licence on behalf of any Co-partnership or Company shall be made by, and such Licence shall be issued to, the Senior Partner, or to the Secretary or Manager of the Company, as the case may be; and the person to whom a Licence shall be so issued shall be responsible for the observance of the conditions under which the Licence is granted, and shall be liable to all penalties for breaches of such conditions as if he were the person solely interested in the Licence.

10. In the case of the death of any Proprietor during the currency of his Licence, the Licence shall be brought to the Office of the Commissioner, and the Commissioner may by endorsement thereon transfer the Licence to the personal representatives of the deceased proprietor, or to his widow or child, if such child is of age. In like manner in the case of the marriage of a female proprietor during the currency of her Licence, her Licence may be transferred to her husband. In the case of a Company, the Licence may be transferred from the Secretary or Manager to his successor.

11. A Licence granted in respect of any Public Carriage under this part of the Order shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(a) The proprietor thereof shall not permit or suffer the carriage to be sub-let; provided that this condition shall not prevent a proprietor who has been registered with, and specially approved by the Commissioner, from lending or letting a licensed vehicle to another proprietor for a period not exceeding twenty-one days, if notice in writing of such lending or letting be sent to the Commissioner one clear day before the loan or letting, giving the name of the proprietor to whom the carriage is proposed to be lent or let.

The Commissioner may in his discretion refuse such special approval, and may also in his discretion withdraw the approval which authorised a proprietor to sub-let.

(b) The Proprietor shall, if during the currency of the Licence he changes his address, within seven days from such change, bring his Licence to the Office of the Commissioner, and the Commissioner shall thereupon endorse the Licence with the new address. The address mentioned in or last endorsed upon the Licence shall, for all purposes connected with the Licence, be deemed to be the address of the Proprietor of the Public Carriage to which such Licence refers.

(c) The Proprietor—

(1) Shall not knowingly permit his Carriage to be used for an illegal purpose.

(2) Shall not deface his Licence by erasure or otherwise.

(3) Shall at all times, when required, produce his Licence and the Licence of the Drivers or Conductors in his employ to the Commissioner, or to such persons as he may appoint.

(4) Shall at all reasonable times allow to all persons appointed by the Commissioner to be inspectors of Public Carriages free access to his premises and stables for the purpose of inspecting the Public Carriage to which the Licence relates, the horses used for drawing the same and their harness.

(5) Shall within three days after a notice shall have been delivered to him personally or left at the address mentioned in or last endorsed upon his Licence, deliver up his Licence to the Inspector of Public Carriages at the Police Station of the District within which the place of his address so mentioned or endorsed is situate, and shall bring the Public Carriage to the same Police Station in order that the plates may be un-fixed and delivered up to the inspector of Public Carriages.

(d) The Proprietor of any Hackney or Stage Carriage shall not conceal or remove any plate affixed to such Carriage in pursuance of this Order, or alter or obliterate any number or mark thereupon, or any mark placed upon such Carriage by the authority of the Commissioner.

The Proprietor shall not permit or suffer any person, except such as are authorised by the Commissioner, to alter or remove any of the plates or marks required by this Order.

(e) The Proprietor shall keep the carriage and all its furniture and appointments, and the harness of the horse or horses drawing the same, in perfect order and repair, and shall not suffer any person, or object, or any printed, written, or other matter to appear on the outside or inside of the Carriage, or upon the harness or horses, by way of advertisement, except such, if any, as shall be approved by the Commissioner.

(f) The Proprietor of a Hackney Carriage propelled by mechanical means shall not employ as a driver of such carriage any person unless he be licensed in accordance with Schedule H of this Order, nor shall he employ such person to drive carriages of a type other than those mentioned in or endorsed upon the Licence.

(g) The Proprietor of a Stage Carriage propelled by mechanical means shall not employ as a driver of such Carriage any person unless he be licensed in accordance with Schedule F of this Order, nor shall he employ such person to drive carriages of a type other than those mentioned in or endorsed upon the Licence.

(h) The Proprietor of a Carriage drawn by animal power shall not employ as a Driver of such Carriage any person who is licensed to drive a Carriage propelled by mechanical means only.

12. Any Licence defaced or on which there is an erasure shall be void.

13. Licences granted under this part of the Order shall be liable to revocation or suspension by the Commissioner in the following events :—

(I) If the Proprietor fails to comply with the conditions on which the Licence is granted as prescribed in section 11 of this Order ;

(II) In any of the events in which a Hackney or Stage Carriage Licence might have been revoked or suspended at the time of the passing of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869 ;

(III) If the Proprietor commits a breach of the said Act or of this Order, or is convicted of felony or a misdemeanor.

Part II.

Licensing of Drivers of Hackney Carriages and of Drivers and Conductors of Stage Carriages.

In pursuance of Section 8 of the above-mentioned Act, I hereby prescribe as follows :—

14. Licences to act as Driver or Conductor of a Stage Carriage, or as a Driver of a Hackney Carriage may be granted by the Commissioner, provided that the applicant be not less than 21 years of age.

15. Licences so granted shall be respectively in the forms contained in the Schedules F, G, and H, to this Order, and shall, if not revoked or suspended, be in force for one year from the date thereof ; and for every such Licence there shall be paid to the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police, or to such person as he shall appoint, the sum of Five Shillings.

16. Every Licence granted to a Driver or Conductor shall be subject to revocation or suspension for any period of time by any Justice of the Peace in any of the events in which a Licence granted to a Driver or Conductor of a Hackney or Stage Carriage in pursuance of any Act of Parliament might, at the passing of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, be revoked or suspended, and also by any Justice of the Peace in the event of any breach of this Order or of any of the provisions of the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869.

17. Any Licence granted under this part of the Order shall also be subject to revocation by the Commissioner should the Driver or Conductor become in the opinion of the Commissioner unable to exercise his calling without risk to the public.

18. A copy of the Licence shall be issued to every Driver and Conductor who shall be licensed after the date of this Order.

Part III.

Regulations as to Hackney and Stage Carriages.

In pursuance of section 9 of the above-mentioned Act, I hereby make the following regulations :—

19. The Proprietor shall cause to be painted at the back of his Hackney Carriage, on the outside, the number of persons which the Hackney Carriage is licensed to carry.

If the Proprietor suffers his Hackney Carriage to ply for hire without such number so painted, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

20. If a Hackney Carriage carry a greater number of persons than the number which it is licensed to carry, the driver, and also the proprietor, if he be cognizant of the fact, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

For the purpose of this Regulation, two children under 10 years of age shall count as one person.

21. The Proprietor shall supply a sufficient number of tickets in the following form, and no other, for the use of any person hiring the Carriage, and the Driver shall, if so required, deliver one such ticket, and no other, to the hirer :—

HACKNEY CARRIAGE, No. _____

Proprietor's Name _____

Address _____

(The particulars required to complete above to be legibly written or printed.)

Magistrates are empowered to hear and determine complaints between hirers and drivers. Applications respecting property left in Hackney Carriages should be made personally or by letter to the Lost Property Office, New Scotland Yard, S.W.

22. The Proprietor of a Public Carriage shall within three days after the expiration of the period for which the Licence shall have been granted, deliver up his Licence to the inspector of Public Carriages at the Police Station of the District within which the place of his address, mentioned in or last endorsed upon the Licence, is situate, and shall bring the Public Carriage to the same Police Station in order that the plates may be unfixed and delivered up to the inspector of Public Carriages.

NOTE.—Nothing in this Clause shall exempt the Proprietor from any penalty to which he might be liable for using, or permitting the use of an unlicensed carriage.

23. Immediately after the termination of any hiring, the Driver of a Hackney Carriage, and immediately after the termination of any journey, the Conductor of a Stage Carriage, or if there be no Conductor, the Driver, shall carefully search the Carriage for any property which may have been accidentally left therein, and shall within 24 hours, deposit such property, if not sooner claimed by the owner, in the state in which he finds it, at any Police Station.

24. Any Passenger who finds property accidentally left in a Stage Carriage shall immediately hand the same to the Conductor, or if there be no Conductor, to the Driver, who shall within the period before stated, if not sooner claimed by the owner, deposit the property, in the state in which it was found, at any Police Station, and truly state the particulars of such finding.

25. During the period between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise no Driver of a Hackney Carriage shall ply for hire unless the Hackney Carriage under his charge be provided with a lamp properly trimmed and lighted. Such lamp shall be fixed outside the Carriage in such a manner as to exhibit a white light to the front. If one lamp only be carried outside, it shall be fixed on the right or off side of the Carriage.

26. The Driver or Conductor of any Stage Carriage, and the driver of any Hackney Carriage shall not conceal or remove any plate affixed to such Carriage in pursuance of this Order, or alter or obliterate any number or mark thereupon, or any mark placed on such Carriage by the authority of the Commissioner.

27. The driver of a Hackney Carriage or a Stage Carriage propelled by mechanical means shall drive carriages of such type only as are specified in the Licence, or in the endorsements made thereon by direction of the Commissioner.

28. A Driver or Conductor shall at all times during his employment and when appearing before a Magistrate have in his possession a copy of the Licence issued to him in pursuance of Part II of this Order, and shall on demand by the Officer in charge for the time being of any Police Station, or by any Police Officer specially authorised by the Commissioner, produce the

same, and allow the writing and photograph thereon to be inspected. If he neglects or fails to produce the copy as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

29. In pursuance of section 10 of the above-mentioned Act, I hereby annex a penalty, not exceeding Forty Shillings, for the breach of any regulation or regulations made by Part III of this Order.

Part IV.

Hackney Carriage Fares, Hiring, &c.

30. The Hiring of a Hackney Carriage not fitted with a Taximeter shall be by Distance or by Time as the Hirer may express at the commencement of the Hiring; but, unless expressed to be by Time shall be taken to be by Distance.

The fare for the Hiring of a Hackney Carriage not fitted with a Taximeter shall be in accordance with the scale set forth in Schedule I to this Order.

31. The fare for the Hiring of a Motor Hackney Carriage fitted with a Taximeter shall be in accordance with the scale set forth in Schedule K to this Order, which is a combination of Time and Distance.

32. The Proprietor of a Horsed Hackney Carriage may with the approval of the Commissioner cause it to be fitted with a Taximeter on undertaking that the charges made for the Hire of the Carriage shall be in accordance with the scale affixed in the Carriage and registered by the Taximeter, which scale shall not in any case exceed the scale set forth in Schedule I to this Order.

33. Whether the Hiring be by Distance or by Time, or by a combination of time and distance, the Driver shall be entitled to charge, in addition to what is due to him for Distance or Time, as the case may be, the following extra payments in the following cases respectively:—

(1) If any Luggage is carried outside the Hackney Carriage, he shall be entitled to an extra payment for every Package carried outside, whatever may be the number of persons carried, in accordance with the scale set out in Schedules I and K respectively.

(2) If at any time during the Hiring more than two persons are carried together, he shall be entitled to an extra payment of 6d. for every person above two so carried. Provided that two children under the age of 10 years shall count as one person.

34. If a Hackney Carriage not fitted with a Taximeter is hired by Distance, and in the course of the hiring is at the request of the hirer made to wait, the Driver shall be entitled to charge (in addition to what is due to him for Distance) an extra payment according to the scale laid down in Schedule I hereto annexed.

The Driver shall not be entitled to receive any Extra payment for waiting, if such waiting has not amounted in the whole to Fifteen minutes.

The Driver shall not be entitled to any Extra payment for waiting any less period than Fifteen minutes (whether such less period be completed in one stoppage or in several stoppages) which is over and above any number of completed periods of Fifteen minutes.

35. The Driver of a Hackney Carriage fitted with a Taximeter shall be entitled to charge for waiting according to the scale indicated by the Fare Plate.

36. A Driver of a Hackney Carriage shall not be compelled to drive for more than six miles; and if hired by time shall not be compelled to drive for more than one hour.

37. (1) If any property found in a Hackney or Stage Carriage, and brought to any Police Station by the Driver, or by the Driver or Conductor thereof respectively, under the provisions of the London Hackney Carriage Act, 1853, 16 & 17 Vict., cap. 33, sec. 11, or of this Order, be not within three months claimed and proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioner to belong to the claimant, the Commissioner shall forthwith sell such property, and out of the proceeds shall award to such Driver or Conductor as follows:—

Provided that the Commissioner may, if he think fit, at the expiration of the said period of three months, deliver the property to the Driver or Conductor, instead of awarding to him a sum of money.

(2) If the property which shall have been so brought to a Police Station be claimed before the expiration of the said period of three months, and the claimant prove to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that he is entitled thereto, the same shall be delivered to him on payment by him of all expenses incurred, and of a remuneration to the Driver or Conductor. The amount of such

remuneration shall be determined by the Commissioner, with reference to the character and value of the property, in accordance with the foregoing section.

Part V.

Taximeters, Distance Recorders, &c.

38. Every Hackney Carriage mechanically propelled which shall be presented for licensing on and after the 1st August, 1907, shall be fitted either with an approved Taximeter to indicate to the Hirer the fare chargeable, or with an approved Distance Recorder to indicate to the Hirer the Distance travelled; and any Hackney Carriage may from the date of this Order, if the proprietor so wishes, be fitted with an approved Taximeter or Distance Recorder.

39. No Distance Recorder or Taximeter shall be affixed to any Hackney Carriage unless the seal or mark approved by the Commissioner be affixed thereto. If a Recorder or Taximeter not having the said seal or mark intact be affixed to any Hackney Carriage the Licence of that Carriage shall be liable to revocation or suspension.

40. Any proprietor, driver, or other person who shall break or in any way tamper with the seal or mark placed on the Recorder or Taximeter, or who shall, with intent to deceive, tamper with the Recorder or Taximeter, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

41. The Driver of every Hackney Carriage fitted with a Taximeter shall, as soon as he is hired and no sooner, set the machine in motion, and upon the termination of the hiring shall stop the machine. If he neglect or fail to do so he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

42. The Driver of every Hackney Carriage fitted with a Distance Recorder shall, as soon as he is hired and no sooner, set the machine at zero. If he neglect or fail to do so he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

43. In pursuance of section 10 of the above mentioned Act I hereby annex a penalty, not exceeding Forty shillings, for the breach of any regulation or regulations made by Part V of this Order.

44. The Orders of the 26th day of December, 1905, and of the 19th day of February, 1906, made by me, are hereby revoked, provided that every Licence already granted in pursuance of the said Orders shall be as valid as if it had been granted in pursuance of, and in accordance with, the provisions of this Order.
