DISEASES OF ANIMALS (LANARKSHIRE)
ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Power to make Regulations for Notification of
Illness of Cattle.*

1. The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make regulations—

(1.) For prescribing and regulating the notice to be given to or by any person or authority in the case of illness of any head of cattle, and for supplementing or varying for

those purposes any of the provisions of section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894; and

(2.) For regulating the burial of the carcase of any head of cattle to which any notice of illness relates.

Limitation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Nothing in any regulations made under this Order shall require notice to be given—

(i.) In the case of illness produced by, or consequent on, accident or calving; or

(ii.) Where the illness is certified by a Veterinary Surgeon as not being cattle-plague, pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease or anthrax.

2. Nothing in any regulations made under this Order shall affect the provisions of any Order of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries relating to cattle-plague, pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease or anthrax.

Confirmation of Regulations.

3.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District four weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For four weeks at least before an application, a copy of the regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the regulations, without further or other proof.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the DISEASES OF ANIMALS (LANARKSHIRE) ORDER OF 1907.
