The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated March 28th, from His Majesty's Representative at Sofia, intimating that the Bulgarian Government have ordered the application of the following Quarantine measures :

Ships from infected places to a destination in Bulgaria which carry merchandise from those places, and which during their voyage have discharged a part of their cargo in a port free from infection will be admitted to free pratique after a thorough medical inspection before the expiration of 25 days following the date of their departure from the infected places, provided that they are furnished with a clean bill of health.

The crews of these ships will be under surveillance during the whole of their stay in the Bulgarian ports of the Black Sea.

The despatch also states that the following places have been declared free from plague :-

(a) The Islands to the east of Australia-New Caledonia;

(b) The Australian towns of Adelaide and Sydney;

(c) Port Allégré, in Brazil.

No. 470. — CANADA—RIVER ST. LAW-RENCE, QUEBEC, AND MONTREAL SHIP CHANNEL.

Boat (Ile des Barques) and Stone (Ile à Le Pierre) Islands—Leading Lights Established.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 28th February, 1907, that on the opening of navigation a white fixed catoptric leading light, elevated 41 feet above summer river level and visible from a distance of 10 miles, will be established at a distance of about 3 cables from the eastern end of Boat Island; it will be shown from a white square tower 19 feet high, with red roof, standing on a concrete block, 24 feet high; it has been placed on the chart at a distance of  $6\frac{4}{10}$  cables, S. 29° W. from Stone Island Light.

This light, in line S. 54° W. with the rear light (108 feet) on Monk Island, will lead through Batture Île au Raison dredged channel.

#### GALLIA BAY UPPER LEADING LIGHTS.

Also, that two white fixed catoptric leading lights, known as Gallia Bay Leading Lights, will be established on Stone Island.

The front light will be elevated 41 feet above

the summer river level, and visible from a distance of 2 miles; it will be exhibited from a square white wooden building, 19 feet high, surmounted by a white wooden lantern, with red roof, erected on a concrete block situated at a distance of about 9 cables S. 77° W. from Stone Island Lighthouse.

The rear light will be elevated 73 feet above summer river level, and visible from a distance of 2 miles; it will be shown from a steel cylindrical framework structure, painted white, 52 feet high, surmounted by a red wooden lantern, erected at a distance of  $1\frac{1}{10}$  cables S. 84° W. from the front light.

These two lights, in line S. 84° W. will lead through the dredged channel to the bend of Ship Channel, from the Batture Île au Raison leading line to the Gallia Bay lower leading line.

#### GALLIA BAY LOWER LEADING LIGHTS.

Also, that two white fixed catoptric leading lights, known as Gallia Bay lower leading lights, will be established on Stone Island.

The front light will be elevated 38 feet above summer river level, visible from a distance of 2 miles, and shown from a similar structure to the front light of the Gallia Bay upper leading lights given above, erected at a distance of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  cables S. 89° W., from Stone Island Lighthouse.

The rear light will be elevated 71 feet above summer river level, visible from a distance of 2 miles, and shown from a similar structure to the rear light of the Gallia Bay leading light given above, erected at a distance of one cable N. 45° E. from the front light.

These two lights, in line N. 45° E., lead southwestward through the dredged channel, from the Gallia Bay upper leading line, to St. Anne de Sorel leading line.

# No. 471.—GULF OF MEXICO—SOUTHERN SHORE.

Coatzacoalcos (Puerto Mexico) River—Depth in Entrance. Name Changed.

The United States Government has given notice, dated 16th March, 1907, that information has been received that the depth over the bar at the entrance to Coatzacoalcos River is at the present time 24 feet, and that dredgers are still working. It is proposed eventually to obtain a depth of 30 feet over this bar by dredging.

Note.—Coatzacoalcos is to be known in future as Puerto Mexico, and until the new name has become familiar, it should be referred to as Puerto Mexico (Coatzacoalcos).
