The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Decree respecting infectious diseases on ships in French ports which was published in the "Journal Officiel de la République Français" of the 17th April :—

Le Président de la République française ;

Décrète :

ART. 1er.—Lorsqu'un navire se présente dans un port de France ou d'Algérie, ayant à bord un cas de "maladie fébrile," il est procédé à la visite médicale et la libre pratique n'est pas accordée avant qu'il ait été reconnu que ladite maladie n'est pas une des maladies transmissibles visées à l'article 4 de la loi du 15 février 1902 ou, s'il s'agit d'une de ces maladies, avant que les mesures nécessaires pour en prévenir la propagation aient été prises.

tion aient été prises. ART. 2. Si l'examen médical permet de constater un cas certain ou suspect d'une des maladies transmissibles ci-clessus visées—hors les cas de maladies pestilentielles qui restent soumises au régime déterminé par les dispositions spéciales du règlement de police sanitaire maritime du 4 janvier 1896—l'autorité sanitaire prend, tant à l'égard des passagers et de l'équipage que du navire même, les mesures commandées par les circonstances en conformité notamment des articles 2, 54 et 69 dudit règlement.

Elle prévient, d'autre part, la municipalité à qui il appartient d'assurer le transport et l'isolement du malade et elle provoque l'application, en dehors du navire, par les services municipaux ou départementaux chargés respectivement de cette mission, en vertu de la loi du 15 février 1902, des diverses mesures de prophylaxie prévues soit par ladite loi, soit par les règlements sanitaires locaux.

ART. 3.—Tout navire se trouvant dans un port de France ou d'Algérie est soumis de la part du service sauitaire maritime, pendant tout son séjour dans le port, à une surveillance ayant pour objet de connaître les premières manifestations à bord des maladies transmissibles et d'en empêcher la propagation.

À cet effet, le capitaine du navire est tenu de déclarer immédiatement à l'autorité sanitaire du port tout cas de "maladie fébrile" survenant à bord pendant cette période. Dès qu'elle a reçu cette déclaration, ou, à défaut de déclaration, dès qu'elle a été informée, de quelque façon que ce soit, de la présence à bord d'un cas de telle maladie, l'autorité sanitaire du port agit sans retard dans les conditions prévues aux articles précédents.

ART. 4.—L'armement est tenu de prêter son concours dans les conditions indiquées par l'autorité sanitaire, à l'exécution des mesures prises en vertu du présent décret.

ART. 5.—Le ministre de l'intérieur et le gouverneur général de l'Algérie sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret qui sera publié au Journal Officiel de la République française.



### Norderney Gat Light-Vessel—Date of Establishment.

With reference to Notices to Mariners Nos. 274 and 450 of 1907:---

The German Government has given further notice, dated 6th April, 1907, that, weather permitting, during the latter part of April, a steam light-vessel, exhibiting a white group flashing light, showing groups of three flashes every fifteen seconds, thus:--flash, a quarter of a second; eclipse, three and a half seconds; flash, a quarter of a second; eclipse, three and a half seconds; flash, a quarter of a second; eclipse, seven and a quarter seconds, will be established off Norderney Gat. The light will be exhibited from a turret-like superstructure, painted yellow, situated between the two masts, which has a special lantern with gallery round it, at an elevation of 52 feet above the sea, and will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 13 miles, the light power being 36,000 candles; the vessel, which will have two pole masts, will be painted red, and marked "Norderney."

### The Tramways Act, 1870.

### BYE-LAWS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the county borough of South Shields, acting by the Council as the promoters of the tramways in the said county borough authorised by the South Shields Corporation Act, 1903, did, in pursuance of the Tramways Act, 1870, on the 3rd day of April, 1907, make the following Bye-laws :-

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say :-

"Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of South Shields, and shall include any lessees or other persons for the time being working or running over the tramway system hereinafter referred to;

"Tramways" means the tramway system now or at any time hereafter worked by the Corporation ;

"Car" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers;

"Conductor" means any servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car;

"Driver" means any servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car;

"Officer" means any member of the police force or any inspector of public carriages or tramway inspector in the employ of the Corporation.

2. No person shall swear or use obscene, indecent, or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

3. No person who is in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed from the car by the conductor.

4. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, nor any person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall on the request of the conductor leave such car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

5. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car. Any dog or other animal taken into or found on any car shall be removed by the

person in charge thereof from the car immediately upon request by the conductor.

6. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, for the amount of any damage so done.

7. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars, or cigarettes inside any car, except in such part thereof as may be specially set apart for the purpose.

8. No person shall spit in or on any car.

9. Every passenger shall, on demand, pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for his or her journey and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his or her journey, and no ticket shall be used a second time for travelling on any car.

No person shall travel or attempt to travel on a car without paying his fare and with intent to avoid payment thereof.

10. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his or her ticket to any officer of the Corporation, duly authorized in that behalf, and shall also when required so to do, either deliver up his or her ticket or pay the fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, clerk, shop assistant, female worker, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, clerks, shop assistants, female workers, or daily labourers.

12. No person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment, or ring any of the signal bells upon any car so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any car, nor signal a car to start.

13. No person shall obstruct or impede any car, or obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

with any car or tramway. 14. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger, and shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

No person shall carry or deposit upon any car any luggage which shall cause hindrance or annoyance to passengers.

15. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

16. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

The Corporation shall not be bound to complete any journey in any specific period of time.

17. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route, unless permitted to do so by the Conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

18. No person, except a driver, conductor, or officer of the Corporation, shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or stand either on the platforms or on the outside of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

19. No person shall travel in or on any car with firearms, or dangerous articles or things, provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve or Auxiliary Forces, or members of a Rifle Club, carrying unloaded firearms.

20. No person shall enter or depart from a car except by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, unless so directed by the conductor or officer.

No person shall board a car before any person desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

21. No person shall enter, board or leave, or attempt to enter, board or leave any car whilst in motion.

22. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any legal offence or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from a car, and if such person shall have paid his or her fare, he shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his or her fare so paid.

23. Every conductor and driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

24. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

25. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1907.

26. From and after the 1st day of July, 1907, the Bye-laws made by the Corporation on the 1st day of June, 1898, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, shall be repealed.

And notice is also given, that a true copy of such Bye-laws has this day been laid before the Board of Trade, and unless such Bye-laws or any of them shall be disallowed by the said Board within two calendar months from the date hereof, the same will come into force on the 1st day of July, 1907.
