The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated April 10th, from His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, enclosing a copy of the following circular issued by the Board of Health, respecting the conditions under which ships are allowed to pass the Suez Canal in quarantine:-

Circulaire à la Navigation.

Par décision du Conseil Supérieur de Santé, les navires non sujets à quarantaine, se rendant de la Méditerranée en Mer Rouge et vice-versa, devront, pour s'éviter les compromissions d'ordre sanitaire à leur passage en transit par le Canal de Suez, n'y faire aucune espèce d'opération— à l'exception, toutefois, de l'embarquement du charbon à Port-Saïd, autorisé en cas de nécessité et devant s'effectuer sous surveillance sanitaireet n'embarquer à leur bord les pilotes, le personnel sanitaire et les électriciens qu'il est d'usage de placer sur ces navires, qu'après que les dits pilotes, personnel sanitaire et électriciens auront été isolés pendant 5 jours et auront subi la désinfection de rigueur à l'un des établissements quarantenaires de Suez ou de Port-Saïd. Annotation sera portée, par qui de droit, sur la patente sanitaire pour attester la stricte observation des dispositions qui précèdent.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

GENERAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Situations in the Civil Service, included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration at any time.

- 1. Competitive Examinations of Candidates for situations in the different public Departments will be held at such times and at such places as may be deemed expedient. Before every such examination Special Regulations will be issued, in which the particular conditions of the competition will be specified.
- 2. These examinations will have reference either to the vacancies existing at the time of the examinations respectively, or to the number which may be estimated to occur within any period not exceeding six months after the commencement of the examinations, as may be laid down in Special Regulations, or in any Notice of such examinations published, with the approval of the Lords of the Treasury, in the London Gazette.
- 3. These examinations are open, under such general restrictions as may be laid down, to all natural-born or naturalized British subjects, being of the requisite age, health, and character. The undermentioned special conditions are at present in force:
 - (i.) The following persons are ineligible, viz.:— Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.

- (ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:—
 - (a) Persons actually serving in the Army.
 - (b) Persons actually serving in the Navy.
 - (c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.
 - (d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than five years' service.
 - (e) Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.
 - (f) Persons who have been trained in Training Colleges at the public expense.
 - (g) Persons who have been trained in the Inland Revenue Branch of the GovernmentLaboratory.

No person actually serving in the Army will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.

No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class (f) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons comprised in class (g) will not be qualified for appointment until the consent of the Board of Inland Revenue, given with the like sanction, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 4. In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—
 - (i.) Persons who have served in the Army or Navy may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served;
 - (ii.) Persons who may be serving or who may have served in the Militia, the Imperial Yeomany, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers, may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they received Army pay;
 - (iii.) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years—
- (A) In any Civil situation to which they were

- admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners,
- (B) In the Royal Irish Constabulary, or
- (C) As Registered Boy Clerks in connection with the Civil Service, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service, with the limitation (1) that persons comprised in Classes (A), (B), (C), whose service commenced on or after the 10th of April, 1900, will not be allowed to deduct from their actual age more than two years when competing for the situation of Assistant of Customs or more than one year when competing for the situation of Assistant of Excise; and (2) that persons comprised in Classes (A), (B), (C), whose service commenced on or after the 19th April, 1901, will not be allowed to deduct more than two years when competing for the situation of Second Class Clerk for Port Service in the Department of His Majesty's Customs.
- 5. If at any examination two or more situations, whether in the same or in different Departments, shall be offered for competition, the successful candidates will be permitted (unless otherwise stated in Special Regulations) to choose in their order as determined by the competitive examination among the situations offered for competition; provided that they be duly qualified according to the special rules prescribed, under Clause IV of the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870, for the particular situations to which they may severally be assigned. If there be a vacant situation for which no one of the successful candidates is duly qualified, the Civil Service Commissioners may offer it to the highest candidate on the list whom they may deem duly qualified, or to the candidate highest at the time on the list, subject to his passing a qualifying examination within such period as they may determine; or they may reserve it to be filled by means of a subsequent open competition, or otherwise, as they may see fit, in accordance with the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any

scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.

- 2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Monmouthshire County Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.
- 3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 29TH APRIL 1907.)

SHEFFIELD (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Restriction on Movement out of City of Sheffield.

1.—(1). Swine shall not be moved out of the

Movement Licence of the Local Authority of that city and on the following conditions (namely):

- (i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (ii.) The swine shall be moved, by railway so far as is practicable, to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article.
- (iii.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted and the name or description of the bacon factory or slaughterhouse to which the swine are to be moved.
- (iv.) The Local Authority of the city of Sheffield shall cause a copy of the Licence to be sent forthwith to the Local Authority of the District into which the swine are to be moved.
- (v.) The swine shall after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (vi.) The Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence and are duly slaughtered there.
- (2.) Swine while being moved under this Article shall not, unless otherwise hereafter expressly provided by Order of the Board, be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by any other Order of the Board or by regulations made by the Local Authority of any District.
- (3.) This Article shall be read with the Sheffield (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906, and be treated as Part II of that Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of May, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Sheffield (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED '29TH APRIL 1907.)

MIDDLESEX (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Restrictions in Scheduled Area.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall in their application to the Infected Area described in the Schedule hereto be modified in manner declared by this Order.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

- 2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in the Infected Area if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.
- (2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.
- (3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.
- (5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- (6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article

unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

- 3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in an Infected Area if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in an Infected Area, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

- 4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in an Infected Area, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.
- (2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in an Infected Area, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

Interpretation.

10. In this Order-

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"Infected Area" means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-

Fever Infected Area:
"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of May, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the MIDDLESEX (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907.
