

acquire easements only in lands, and to deviate in the construction of the proposed work both vertically and horizontally, to the extent shown on the deposited plans and sections hereinafter referred to, or referred to in the Additional Provision or in the Bill; to constitute the proposed work part of the water undertaking of the Council, and to extend and apply thereto the enactments relating to the water undertaking of the Council and the provisions of the Bill.

4. To authorize the Council to borrow money for the purchase of lands and easements, and the construction of the work hereinbefore described, and to charge the money so borrowed and the interest thereon on the District Fund and District Rate or the revenue of the water undertaking of the Council, or on any of the undertakings, rates, rents, and revenues of the Council.

5. To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would in any manner impede or interfere with the objects of the intended Additional Provision, and to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights and privileges.

6. To alter, amend, extend, or repeal all or some of the provisions of the Broadstairs and St. Peters Water and Improvement Act, 1901, and all other Acts and Provisional Orders relating to the Council or the water undertaking of the Council.

7. Duplicate plans and sections of the proposed work and plans of the land which may be taken compulsorily under the proposed Additional Provision, with a book of reference to such plans, together with copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, will, on or before the 10th day of May instant, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Kent at his office, at the Sessions House, Maidstone, in the said county, and on or before the same day a copy of the said plans, sections, and book of reference, together with copy of this Notice, will be deposited as follows:—As relates to each of the above mentioned parishes, with the Clerk to the Parish Council of each parish at his office, or if he has no office at his residence, and if there be no Clerk with the Chairman of such Council at his residence.
