## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh , and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth aud seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the archdeaconries and rural deaneries in the diocese of Saint Albans.
"Whereas there are within the said diocese of Saint Albans three archdeaconries, to wit, the archdeacoury of Colchester, the archdeaconry of Essex and the archdeaconry of Saint Albans.
"And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar, Bishop of the said cliocese of Saint Albans, has represented to us that it is desirable to make certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed) with respect to the said archdeaconry of Colchester, to the said archdeaconry of Essex and to the said archdeaconry of Saint Albans and to the rural deaneries within those archdeaconries.
"And whereas the existing areas of the said archdeaconries of Colchester, Essex und Saint Albans and of the rural deaneries therein are set
forth in the schedule annexed to an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-third day of the same month.
"And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, may properly be carried intaffect.
"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he hath to this scheme set his hand and his episcopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your. Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order each of the said archdeaconries of Colchester, of Essex aud of Saint Albans shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries the names of which are set down in order under its name aud are numbered consecutively in the schednle to this scheme annexed, and that the name which in such schedule is given to any rural deanery shall be the name thereof and that every parish or cure or church the name of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any rural deanery in the first column of the said schedule shall belong to and be a part of the rural deanery and of the archdeaconry under the name of which it so appears as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean and Archdeacon thereof and shall not any longer belong to or be a part of any other rucal deanery or of any other archdeaconry or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.
"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters uforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act, of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late. Majesty, chapter thirtygeven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:-
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish (sometime district) of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, within the original limits of the parish of Monkwearmouth, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durbam.
"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, is a cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the iuhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of $\subset$ All Saints, Monkwearmouth. which is mentioned and described in the schedule to this scheme should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.
"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.
"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Monkwearmouth have become vested in us under the provisions and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or some or one of them and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a grant of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum to the minister of the said proposed separate district so soon as a minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefure mentioned Act and to his successors.
"And whereas a piece of land situate within the said proposed separate district has been provided by us as the site for a permanent church for such district and such permanent church is now being erected upon the said piece of land in accordance with plans which have been approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners.
"And whereas John Priestman, of Cliffside, Roker, Sunderland, Shipbuilder, has contributed a sum of upwards of six thousand pounds towards the cost of providing the said proposed permanent church and this contribution has been made upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manuer which is hereinafter set forth.
"And whereas the said John Priestman has nominated himself, the said Johu Priestman, Jane Ann Hammond, the wife of Matthias Hammond, of Casterton, Babbacombe, Torquay, in the county of Deron, Gentleman, Mary Willson, the wife of Walter de Lancey Willson, of Kirklinton Park, Carlisle, in the county of Oumberland, Gentleman, Eleanor Maria Priestman, of Eastcliffe, Babbacombe aforesaid, Spinster, and Euphemia Priestman, of Eastcliffe, Babbacombe aforesaid, Spinster, as the persons to whom he desires that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish should be assigned.
"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of one hundred and fifty pounds will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the det of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.
"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Darham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth.'
"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district
so recommended to be constituted, and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, then of the said new parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John Priestman, Jane Ann Hamıond, Mary Willson, Eleanor Maria Priestman, and Euphemia Priestman, their heirs and assigns for ever.
" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or any of them, or any other Act of Parliament.

## "The SCHEDOLE to which the foregoing

 Scheme has reference."The district of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth, being all that part of the new parish (sometime district) of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, which is bounded upon the south by the new parish of Saint Cuthbert, Monkwearmouth, in the said county and diocese, upon the east by the sea, upon the north by the parish of Whitburn, upon the west partly by the new parish of Saint Columba, Southwick. and partly by the new parish of the Venerable Bede, Monkwearmouth, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Venerable Bede, Monkwearmonth, from the said new parish of All Saints, Monkwearmonth, at the junction of the Newcastle and Sunderland line of the NorthEastern Railway with the North Dock Branch Line of the same railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said North Dock Branch Line for a distance of fiftysix chains, or thereabouts, to the centre of the bridge which carries such branch line across Roker Baths-road, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Roker Baths-road for a distance of twenty-three chains and a half, or thereabouts, to its junction with Roker-terrace, and extending thence southward along the middle of Rokerterrace for a distance of nine chains, or thereabouts, to its junction with the road called Harbour-view, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, from the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert, Monkwearmouth."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas the Patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish have respectively signified their consent to such scheme.

And whereas one calendar month has expired since the date of the transmission of such drafts as aforesaid.

And whereas the Incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish has offered certain objections to the sume scheme.

And whereas, notwithstanding these objections, the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council : Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like adrice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, "chapelries, and other places or districts may be "separated from the parishes or mother churches "to which they belong, with great advantage, "and places altogether extra-parochial may in " some instances with advautage be annexed to "parishes or districts to which they are con" tiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for "ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his "own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop "of the Province, or when the Bishop of any "dincese shall represent to the said Archbishop " that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, " or district within the diocese of such Arch"bishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the "case may be, may be advantageously separated " from any parish or mother church, and either be : constituted a separate benefice by itself or be "united to any other parish to which it may be "more conveniently annexed, or to any other "adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or "district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to "form a separate parish or benefice, or that avy "extra-parochial place may with advantage be "annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, "or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesias"tical purposes; and the said Archbishop or "Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the "scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to "the said Archbishop for his consideration) "describing the mode in which it appears to him " that the alteration may best be effected, and how " the changes consequent on such alteration in "respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe"lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesias"tical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect "to patronage and rights to pews, may be made "with justice to all parties interested; and if the "patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices "to be affected by such alteration shall consent "in writing under his or their hands to such "scheme, or to such modification thereof as the "said Archbishop may approve, and the said "Archbishop shall, on full consideration and "inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or " modification thereof, and shall certify the same
" and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to
"His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for "His Majesty in Council to make an Order for
"carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, ": as the case may be, ịnto effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward, Lord Bishop of Lincoln hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, represented in a writing dated the twenty-third day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seven, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall, Loord Archbishop of Cauterbury, as follows:-
"I, the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Lincoln, do hereby represent to your Grace that there is in the county and diocese of Lincoln the rectory and parish church of Barrowby.
"That the population of the parish of Barrowby aforesaid according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one amounts to nine hundred and two persons.
"That there is one church belonging to the said parish of Barrowby affording accommodation for three hundred and eighty-four persons.
"That the net annual value of the said rectory of Barrowby is eight hundred and fourteen pounds twelve shillings and ninepence arisiog from tithe, glebe, dividends and pension, but the same is subject to a yearly payment of sixty-six pounds nine shillings and eightpence to the Governors of the bounty of Queen Anne, and an annual payment of twenty pounds six shillings and fourpence to the Lands Improvement Company.
"That there is a good and sufficient house of residence.for the Incumbent of the said benefice.
"That the said rectory of Barrowby is in the patronage of his Grace the Duke of Devonshire.
"That there is in the said county and diocese the rectory and parish church of Woolsthorpe.
"That the population of the said parish of Woolsthorpe according to the census of one thousand. aine hundred and one amounts to six hundred and thirty-one persons.
"That there is one church belonging to the said parish of Woolsthorpe affording accummodation for four hundred persons.
"That the net annual. value of the said rectory of Woolsthorpe aforesaid is one hundred and sixty-two pounds and five shillings arising from glebe, corn rent charge and dividends.
"That the said rectory of. Woolsthorpe aforesaid is in the patronage of his Grace the Duke of Rutland.
"That a portion of the said parish of Barrowby containing a population of about thirty-two persons, is situate at a distance of four miles from the church of the said parish of Barrowby, but the same is within one mile and threequarters of the parish church of Woolsthorpe.
"That it appears to me that the said portion of the said parish of Barrowby, as shewn upon the plan hereto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow, may under the provisions of the Act, one and two Victoria, chapter one hundred and six, be advantageously separated from the said parish of Barrowby and annexed to the said parish of Woolsthorpe to which it is contiguous.
"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the above-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Bishop of Lincolu have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may
be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents thereto in writing of the said Duke of Devonshire the Patron and the Reverend Stephen Edward Gladstone, the Rector of the said rectory of Barrowby, and of the said Duke of Rntland, the Patron, and the Reverend Robert Henry Bagnall, the Rector of the said rectory of Woolsthorpe, to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with the scheme certify the same and such. consents to Bis Majesty in Council.
" $E$. Lincoln."
And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop aud the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:-

## "SCHEME.

"That the portion of the parish of Barrowby which is shown on the plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured yellow and more particularly described in the schedule bereto be separated from the said parish of Barrowby and annexed to the contiguous rectory and parish of Woolsthorpe for all ecclesiastical purposes and that it shall be and remain under the same ecclsiastical jurisdiction as the said rectory and parish of Woolsthorpe now is.
"That the Incumbent of Woolsthorpe sball hate exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said portion of the parish of Barrowby so to be annexed to the said parish of Woolsthorpe.
"That baptisms churchings marriages and burials in respect of the inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Barrowby shall be performed and shall take place in the church of Woolsthorpe and in the burial ground thereto belonging and. that the fees for the same aud for other ecclesiastical offices and all ecclesiastical dues and offeringe arising from or in respect of the said portion of the said parish of Barrowby so to be annexed to the said parish of Woolsthorpe and usually payable to the Incumbent of a benefice shall belong and be paid to the Incumbent of the said parish and benefice of Woolsthorpe. .
"That the tithe rent charge, glebe lands and all other endowments and emoluments which belong or may hereafter belong to the said benefice of Barrowby shall be charged and be for ever after the issuing of any Order of His Majesty in. Council ratifying this scheme chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Woolsthorpe with a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge of ten pounds the same, annual sum or yearly rent charge of ten pounds to be as from the date of any. Order in Council ratifying this scheme due and payable to the Incumbent of the same benefice of Woolsthorpe and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of. the said benefice of Barrowby or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same.incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year.
"That the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Woolsthorpe shall have the following powers for recovering the said rent charge of ten pounds per annum hereby proposed to be created in favour of the said benefice of which he is Incumbent as aforesaid (that is to say) power if and whenever any part of the said rent charge shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-one days after any of the times appointed
for the payment thereof (although there shall not have been any legal dernand made thereof) to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such eniry or afterwards become due during his being in possession of the same premises together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the nou-payment thereof and for the purpose of collecting receiving and recovering such endowments or any of them to use exercise and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting and recovering and enforcing payment thereof and of the annual sums payable for or towards the raising or making up the same as may be statutably exercised or exercisable by him under the law then in force.
"That the inhabitants of the same portion of the said parish of Barrowby shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the church of the said parish of Barrowby or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in the said parish but shall be liable subject to the provisions of 'The Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act 1868' to repair the said church of Woolsthorpe.
"That the said inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Barrowby shall be entitled to resort to and attend the said church of Woolsthorpe as their parish church and to be accommodated with sittings therein but shall not benceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the church of the said parish of Barrowby or in any church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in the said parish, except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said parish church of Barrowby and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.
"That beyond the aforesaid rent charge of ten pounds nothing herein contained shall affect the endowments of the said rectory of Barrowby or the rights of patronage to either of the said benefices of Barrowby and Woolsthorpe.
"All that part of the parish of Barrowby delineated on the said map or plan hereto appended and thereon coloured yellow and which is bounded on the north partly by the parish of Muston and partly by the parish of Sedgebrook on the south by the parish of. Woolsthorpe on the east by a road leading from Sedgebrook to Muston and Woolsthorpe and on the west by the said parish of Muston.

## " CONSENTS.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

# ORDER OF THE BOÁRD OF AGRICULTURE AND FJSHERIES. 

(Datrd 15th May 1907.)

## SHEEP-DIPPING (NORFOLK) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this bebalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## Application of Order.

1.-(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as " the Dipping Area."
(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly in the Dipping Area and partly outside the Dipping Area, the whole farm or holding shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in the Dipping Area.

## Mode of Dipping Prescribed.

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab by the Sheep-Scab Order of 1905 or otherwise, or purporting to be so approved.

## Prescribed Dipping.

3.-(1.) All sheep in the Dipping Area during any part of a prescribed dipping period (except those exempted bj later provisions of this Article) shall he caused to be dipped within the Dipping Area by the owner or person in charge thereof during that period. The first prescribed dipping period shall commence in the present year on the fifteenth day of May, and in any future year on the first day of January and terminate on the thirty-first day of August, and the second prescribed dipping period shall commence on the first day of September and terminate on the eleventh day of October.
(2.) In the case of sheep moved into the Dipping Area between the twenty-first day of August and the tirst day of September, or between the first day of October and the twelfth day of that month, it shall be sufficient compliance with this Article if the sheep are dipped within ten days after the movement.
(3.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to the following sheep:-
(i.) Sheep moved by railway through the Dipping Area without being untrucked within the Area;
(ii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special circumstances, and which are accordingly exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect;
(iii.) Sheep slaughtered in the Dipping Area or moved out of the Dipping Area, without contravening Article 15 of this Order, before the expiration of the period within which their dipping is required under this Article,

## Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of

 intended Dipping and Returns of Dippings.4.-(1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dirping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under the preceding Article, shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:-
(i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such person as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sbeep in their District.
(ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.
(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.
(2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.
(3.) A return in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

## Clipping before Dipping.

5. During the second prescribed dipping period a sheep shall not be deemed to have been dipped in accordance with the requirements of this Order, unless it has been previously clipper in the current year, but this provision shall not apply to lambs less than nine months old.

## Isolation of Sheep after Dipping.

6. All sheep after having been dipped during the second prescribed dipping period, shall during the remainder of the period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

## Declaration after Dipping Period.

7. The occupier of a farm or holding in the Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that bebalf, on or after the thirty-first day of August, but not later than the fourteenth day of September, and on or after the eleventh day of October, but not later than the twenty-fifth day of October, in each year, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form $C$ set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

## Notice of Appointment of Persons to receive Returns, fic.

8. The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under the preceding Articles, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

## Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Dipping Period.

9. Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form D set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped after the service of the notice in the presence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or havs been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be mlawful to move the sheep in contraveution of the notice.

## Cleansing of Dipping Places.

10. The place on any farm or premises which has been used for the dipping shall, without unnecessary delay, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

## Samples of Dip inay be taken.

11. Every owner or person in charge of sheep being dipped under this Order shall permit and give every facility to an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board, or to a constable, to take samples of dip or material which is being or has been used for the dipping of sheep.

## Power to provide Dipping Places.

12. The Local Authority may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to the approval in writing by the Board of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

## Power for Local Authority to regulate time and place of Dipping in particular cases.

13. The Local Authority may in any case where they think such procedare desirable serve a notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form E set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

## Powers of Entry of Inspectors.

14. An Inspector of the Board, and an Inspector of the Local Authority subject to their direction, may for the purposes of this Order enter any premises and examine any sheep thereon.

Restrictions on Movenent of Sheep out of Dipping Area and Regulation of Exposure of Sheep at Markets.
15.-(1.) After the first day of September until the eleventh day of October (including that day) sheep shall not be exposed tor sale, in any market, fair, or saleyard in the Dipping Area, or be moved out of the Dipping Area-
(a) unless the sheep have been dipped on or since the first day of August then last past,
and are accompanied by a declaration in the Form F set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in that behalf; or
(b) unless the sheep have been dipped between the fifteenth day of June and the first day of August then last past and since such dipping have been kept isolated during the remainder of that period from sheep which have not been so dipped, and are accompanied by a declaration in the Form Fs forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in that behalf; or
(c) unless the sheep have been landed in Great Britain from Ireland, or moved into the Dipping Aren from some part of Great Britain, after the expiration of the prescribed dipping period in force in Ireland, or in that part of Great Britain, as the case may be, and the sheep are accompanied by a declaration, in the Form $G$ set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in that behalf ; or
(d) unless the sheep are accompanied by a declaration made under this Article by a person holding a market, fair, or sale at which the sheep have been previously exposed.
(2.) A person holding a market, fair, or sale may, with the approval of the Local Authority of the District, appoint oue or more persons to receive the declarations required by this Order to accompany sheep entering therein. Such appointment shall be notified by notices affixed in or near the market, fair, or saleyard. In the event of any person or persons being so appointed the declarations shall, upon entry of the sheep into the market, fair, or saleyard, be delivered to such person or one of such persons, and be delivered by him to the person holding the market, fair, or sale, who shall retain the same for six months, but so that at any time the same shall be available for examination by any Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board. The person holding the market, fair, or sale shall, in respect of any sheep exposed thereat, issue to any person claiming to be the owner of any of the sheep or his representative, a declaration in the Form $H$ set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect. The declaration may be signed by the person holding the market, fair, or sale or by his duly authorised agent.

## Production of Declarations and Licences; Names and Addresses.

16.-(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved or exposed for sale where under this Order a declaration or exemption is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the declaration or exemption, if any, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

## Local Authority to enforce Order.

17. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

18.-(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
(2.) If any person fails to give any notice or send any return or declaration required by this Order, or falsely makes any return or declaration, for the purposes of this Order, or offers or utters any such return or declaration knowing the same to be falsely made, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
(3.) If a sheep is exposed for sale in any market, fair, or saleyard, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises where the sheep is exposed, and the person exposing the same, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, and the purchaser thereof, knowing the same to be exposed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his.own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
(4.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

## BUCKINGHAMSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## Modification of Restrictions in Scheduled Area.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 sball in their application to the Infected Area described in the Schedule hereio be modified in manner declared by this Order.

## Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibritions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

2.-(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in the Infected Area if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground saleyard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.
(2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fuirs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence muy be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.
(3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.
(4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.
(5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local duthority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
(6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

## Licences for Movenent out of Licensed Markets, §c.

3.-(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in an Infected Area if accompanied by a Licence authorising such, move-ment-in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect-granted by the Local Anthority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.
(2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
(3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified int the Licence is in an Infected Area, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

## Licences after Completion of Movement.

4.-(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swiut-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in an Infected Area, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.
(2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in an Infected Area, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movemeut be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Statiou by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

## Attendance at Markets, fc.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

## Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition uuder this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectiovable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

## Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.-(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Orler.
8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

## Offences.

9.-(1.) If a pig is moved in contravenLion of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in concravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

## Offences.

If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of au offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

## Power to make Regulations.

1.-(1.) The Local Authority of either of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.
(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

## Confirmation of Regulations.

2.-(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
(2.) Uuless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply-
(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the lucal newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the applicatiou.
(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.
(iii.) The Glerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a cony of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.
(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by it Local Authority under this Order, sigued and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

## Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

## Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):-

Section forty-three (powers of police);
Section forty-four (powiers of inspectors);
and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Information, dated 9th April, 1907, has been received from Captain F. O. Learmonth, His Majesty's surveying vessel Egeria, respecting the undermentioned danger and islands in Dixon entrance, Port Simpson approach :-

1. McCullofgh Rock.-This rock, which appeared to bave a depth of about 6 feet over it, is situated in a position from which Fast Deril rock bears N. $12^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$., distant 7 miles, and Barren Island centre N. $55^{\circ}$ W., and was observed to be breaking in a comparatively smooth sea. There are at a distance of one mile depths of over 50 fathoms north-westward and 16 fathoms northward from it.

Vessels are warned against passing to the eastward of this rock or between it and Zayas Island until this passage has been examined.
