

in the same direction as before and in a straight line for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road or footpath leading from Merton to West Barnes Farm, and extending thence first south-westward and then westward along the middle of the said road or footpath for a distance of fifty-one chains or thereabouts to a point distant one hundred yards in a direct line east of the middle of the road known as Grand Drive, and extending thence first southward and then southeastward along a line parallel with the middle of the Grand Drive and distant one hundred yards east of it for a distance of forty-six chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Merton from the said parish of Morden."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwark.
