A PROCLAMATION.

Directing that the Doubloon shall cease to be Legal Tender in the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago.

EDWARD R. & I.

Whereas by virtue of a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, certain parts of the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by section two of the Coinage Act, 1891, were applied with the modifications specified in the Proclamation to the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago:

And whereas it is provided by the said Proclamation that any coins coined in a foreign country which, at the date of the promulgation of the said Proclamation, were by law current and a legal tender in any colony or possession to which the said Proclamation extended should, until by Proclamation otherwise directed, continue to be so current and a legal tender at the same rate and up to the same amount as heretofore:

And whereas under the provisions so applied We may by Proclamation regulate any matters relative to the coinage and the Mint within the present prerogative of the Crown which are not provided for by the Coinage Act, 1870, and may revoke or alter any Proclamation previously made:

And whereas by virtue of a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, it was provided that throughout the whole of Our West India Colonies the doubloon should circulate and be received in payment as being of the full value of sixty-four shillings sterling, current money of the United Kingdom:

And whereas it is expedient that the doubloon should no longer be legal tender in the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago:

Now, therefore, We do hereby in pursuance of the said recited provisions and of all other powers enabling Us in this behalf, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain, that the doubloon shall, as from the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven, cease to be current or legal tender in the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the first day of *June*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the seventh year of Our Reign.

And whereas the Boston Pilot Commissioners being a Pilotage Authority within the meaning of the said Act, duly made certain byelaws which were submitted for the confirmation of Her late Majesty, and were duly confirmed by Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine:

And whereas the Boston Pilot Commissioners have made and submitted for the confirmation of

His Majesty a byelaw as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed, in substitution for number five of the said byelaws:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the proposed new byelaw is proper and reasonable:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and doth by this Order, confirm the said new byelaw, as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed, in substitution for number five of the byelaws confirmed by the said Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, which said byelaw number five is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Order refers:—

Boston.

No. 5. Every candidate for the office of pilot shall have been employed ten years at sea, five of which he must have served in the capacity of able seaman, and be accustomed to the navigation of steam as well as sailing vessels. He shall have attained the age of twenty-five years, and must not exceed forty years. He will be required to pass such examination as the Commissioners may prescribe, and if approved will be granted a licence which will have to be renewed annually on the first Monday in February. On receiving his licence he will for the first twelve months be allowed by the Superintendent to pilot vessels not exceeding fifteen feet draught of water into and out of the port, and if during that period his conduct shall have been in all respects satisfactory he will be permitted to pilot vessels of every description.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Trinity College, Oxford, on the 27th day of May, 1907, amending Statute I of the Statutes of the College, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

At a Meeting of the Governing Body of Trinity College, Oxford, specially called for the purpose, with due notice of the business to be transacted thereat, held on Monday, May 27th, 1907, it was resolved by a majority of two-thirds of those present and voting, to make certain amendments to the Statute of the College concerning the office of President, and to affix the College Seal thereto, in accordance with the provisions of Statute XIII.

ALTERATION OF STATUTE (1907).

Between clause 10 and clause 11 of Statute I, insert the following new clause:—

10A. If a President, who before his election was an Official Fellow of the College, shall voluntarily resign the office of President after serving the College for a total period of twenty-five years in that office and in any one or more of the offices of Tutor, Bursar, or Lecturer, he shall be entitled as of right to a pension, which shall be at the rate of £250 per annum, if he has so served for thirty years; and otherwise at such

rate, not being less than £200 or more than £250 per annum, as the College may determine.

Such pension shall be charged either wholly upon the Corporate Revenues of the College, or to the extent of not less than one-third upon the Corporate Revenues, and as to the residue upon the income of the Pension Fund, as the College may determine; provided that so much of such pension as shall be charged upon the income of the Pension Fund shall be payable in the same manner and in the same priority as if such part had been a pension payable under clause 3 of Statute VI, to an Official Fellow voluntarily retiring from his Fellowship.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Peterhouse or St. Peter's College, Cambridge, on the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven (and sealed on the twentieth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

A STATUTE to amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (40 and 41 Vict. c. 48) in relation to Peterhouse or St. Peter's College in the University of Cambridge duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the fourth day of May one thousand nine hundred and seven and passed at such Meeting by the votes of nine persons present and voting being the whole number of persons so present and voting and submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas the University of Cambridge Commissioners appointed by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (hereinafter called the said Act) did on the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one make certain Statutes (hereinafter called our said Statutes) under the provisions of the same Act for Peterhouse or St. Peter's College (hereinafter called the said College) in the University of Cambridge.

And whereas Her Majesty the late Queen Victoria having taken the said Statutes into consideration was pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to declare and did on the twenty-ninth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, graciously declare Her approval of the same.

And whereas the Governing Body of the said College in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act may make Statutes to amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the said Act.

And whereas under Statute XXI paragraph 1 of the said Statutes it is provided as follows, to wit:—

"If any Fellow shall be instituted on the presentation of the College, to any benefice of the clear annual value (not deducting the

pension, if any, of a former Incumbent) of four hundred pounds (£400) or upwards he shall vacate his Fellowship at the end of a year from such presentation."

And whereas under paragraph 8 of the same Statute XXI it is further provided as follows, to wit:—

"Any Fellow who serves or has served in any privileged College office and who holds or has held one or any of such offices during a period of not less than two years continuously shall be entitled to retain his Fellowship notwithstanding the expiration of six years from the date of his election, unless and until he shall vacate the same otherwise than by lapse of time, for a further period, equal to the whole time of his service, whether continuous or not, and, after twenty years of such service, for the remainder of his life; provided always that not more than four Fellowships shall be thus held for life at any one time."

And whereas doubts have arisen whether in the true meaning of the said Statute a Fellow of the said College who has served for twenty years in a privileged College office and has thereby become entitled to retain his Fellowship for the remainder of his life can be instituted on the presentation of the College to any benefice of the clear annual value (not deducting the pension, if any, of a former Incumbent) of four hundred pounds (£400) or upwards without vacating his Fellowship at the end of a year from such presentation.

We the Master and Fellows of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given unto us by the aforesaid fifty-fourth section of the said Act alter and amend the Statutes of the said College by adding to paragraph 1 of the said Statute XXI the words following, that is to say:—

"Provided always that this shall not be deemed to apply to any Fellow who as hereinafter provided shall have served for twenty years in a privileged College office and shall have become entitled to retain his Fellowship for life."

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST MAY 1907.)

CAMBRIDGESHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of either of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the CAMBRIDGESHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1907.

Swine shall not be moved from the administrative county of Leicester or the county borough of Leicester into the administrative counties of the Parts of Holland, Kesteven, and Lindsey Divisions of Lincolnshire, or Rutland, or the county boroughs of Great Grimsby or Lincoln, except in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

General Provision for Movement with Licence.

2.—(1.) The restriction on movement imposed by this Order shall not apply to swine if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration, countersigned as hereinafter provided, to the effect:

- (i.) That he is the owner of [or the agent authorised in writing for this purpose by the owner of] the swine;
- (ii.) That the swine have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the date of the declaration;
- (iii.) That to the best of his knowledge and belief the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and
- (iv.) That the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and that the movement of the swine is not prohibited by notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(3.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the District where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The licence shall be in force for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the licence is granted, the number of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which, and the place and premises to which, the swine are to be moved.

Detention and Isolation after Arrival at Destination.

3.—(1.) Swine moved with a licence under the preceding Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided. The swine, while detained under this Article, shall be kept separate from all other swine. This provision does not restrict the removal of any carcase of a pig.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under the preceding Article to a market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition specified in the licence, the swine shall only be moved from such premises if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition is situate and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, where the swine after their arrival shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

(3.) A copy of a licence for movement from a market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition, shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence.

Movement for Immediate Slaughter.

4. The restriction on movement imposed by this Order shall not apply to swine moved to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to any lairs, market, or saleyard specially authorised by the Local Authority of the District under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 or any other Swine-Fever Order in force in the District, if the swine are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the bacon factory, slaughterhouse, lairs, market, or saleyard shall be situate, and subject to the following conditions, namely:

- (i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long;
- (ii.) The swine shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article;
- (iii.) Swine moved under this Article to any lairs, market, or saleyard shall only be moved therefrom if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the lairs, market, or saleyard shall be situate and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the

licence, and such movement shall be subject to the conditions of this Article as to marking and movement; and

- (iv.) Swine moved under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

5.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any market, fair, saleyard, exhibition, or lairs, the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any premises other than a market, fair, saleyard, exhibition, or lairs, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

6. Swine, while being moved under this Order, shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all other swine, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

Provision for Movement through a District.

7. For the purposes of this Order, swine shall not be deemed to be moved into any District in any case where they are moved through the District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked within the District.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

8.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary,

on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a pig is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the pig is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“District” means a District of a Local Authority under the Act of 1894:

“Bacon factory” means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on:

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered:

“Person” includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate:

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of June, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the SWINE-FEVER (MOVEMENT FROM LEICESTERSHIRE) ORDER OF 1907.

SOMERSETSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER
OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Movement with Licence direct to Bacon Factory
or Slaughter-house.*

1.—(1.) Nothing in any Order of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries which restricts the movement of swine along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in the administrative county of Somerset or the county borough of Bath shall, after the commencement of this Order, apply to, or be deemed to prohibit, the movement of swine direct to a bacon factory or slaughter-house in that county or borough or elsewhere, if the swine are accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement which may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are at the commencement of the movement on the Declaration prescribed by this Order, and subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(i.) The swine, before the movement is commenced, shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus + each line being not less than nine inches long;

(ii.) The swine shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by railway;

(iii.) The swine shall, while being moved along, over, or across any highway or thoroughfare, be confined in a van or float;

(iv.) The licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom it is granted, the number of swine that may be moved thereunder, and the name and description of the bacon factory or slaughter-house to which the swine are to be moved; and

(v.) The swine shall after their arrival at a bacon factory or slaughter-house be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(2.) The Licence shall be granted only on a Declaration in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect signed by the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, and every person to whom application is made for a Licence shall, so far as is practicable, before granting the same, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the Declaration, and that the proposed movement is necessary or expedient. The Declaration shall be retained by the person granting the Licence and disposed of by him as may be directed by the Local

Authority on whose behalf the Licence was granted.

(3.) Where the swine are moved out of the District of a Local Authority to a bacon factory or slaughter-house in the District of another Local Authority a copy of the Licence authorising the movement shall forthwith be sent by the person granting the same to the Police Station nearest to the bacon factory or slaughter-house.

(4.) A Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them under this Order.

Licences after the Completion of Movement.

2. Where swine are moved with a Licence under this Order to any bacon factory or slaughter-house the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

3.—(1.) Swine, while being moved under this Order, shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all other swine, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the bacon factory or slaughter-house specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere.

(2.) This Order does not authorise movement of swine in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, or of swine the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

*Certain Restrictions on Movement of Swine not to
be Affected.*

4. Movement of swine under this Order is subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine into or within the District of the Local Authority and also to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than swine-fever.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

5.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other Officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

6.—(1.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out,

efface, or obliterate any mark painted on any pig, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

7. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Bacon factory" means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on:

"Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board:

"Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of June, nineteen hundred and seven.

9. This Order may be cited as the SOMERSETSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.
